

Without further ado, here is the year in review.

#### **JANUARY 10**

Parker County Sheriff Larry Fowler issued instruction on how to handle an active shooting after a tragedy at a Fort Worth church leaves many in the community shaken;

Parker County commissioners called a town hall meeting on transportation to discuss roads and growth.

#### JANUARY 17

The city of Aledo approved a Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone, which allows for local businesses to get a tax benefit and encourages economic development;

The city of Willow Park demolished their former police and fire station building, which also formerly housed the city council meetings, community center, and the East Parker County Historical and Genealogical Society;

The Jenkins Road community in Annetta North moved forward with their plans to gate Jenkins Road and privatize their neighborhood.

#### JANUARY 24

The Aledo ISD Board of Trustees approved the sale of the 2019 bonds, which will fund a second middle school, a sixth elementary school, and improvement and changes to several other campuses.

Shelby Kimball was honored by the Annetta City Council for being named the 2020 president of the Greater Fort Worth Association of Realtors. Kimball, who served on the Zoning Board of Adjustments, Crime Control and Planning District, and Planning and Zoning Commission, resigned from the P&Z commission to focus on his responsibilities in his new position.

Aledo High School hosted its first-ever robotics competition, which helped expand such contests to the western side of the DFW metroplex.

#### JANUARY 31

The Aledo City Council approved a 741-unit assisted living facility on Bailey Ranch Road.

The Willow Park City Council reviewed plans for Cross Timbers Park, which will replace the playground that was removed to make way for the new public safety building.

The Willow Park Police and Fire Departments hosted members of the community for the ribbon cutting on the city's new Public Safety Building, which was built using bond funds approved by voters in 2016.

#### FEBRUARY 7

"Dancing With The Stars," hosted by Randy Galloway, raised funds for Aledo Class of 2021 Project Celebration. The event brought more than 400 supporters out to watch local celebrities dance the night away.

#### MARCH 6

Incumbent Parker County Sheriff Larry Fowler handily won the Republican primary against three challengers.

The Aledo City Council delayed a vote on whether to rezone a property along Old Annetta Road from residential to commercial.

Members of the Fort Worth Model A Club visited Stuart Elementary School to give students a lesson in automotive history.

Friends and supporters of the East Parker County Library were treated to an exposition on local history at the "Leap into History" event at Faith Presbyterian Church in Aledo.

#### MARCH 13

The Willow Park City Council denied a Special Use Permit Request to install a helipad in the northern part of the city. The East Parker County Chamber of Commerce held its annual

Via Zoom meeting, the Willow Park City Council discussed the environmental impact of a water line project connecting Fort Worth's water supply to Willow Park and Hudson Oaks. City engineer Derek Turner told the council that no significant environmental impacts were expected. The council also approved a plat for a 117,000 sf senior living complex.

Via YouTube meeting, the Aledo ISD Board of Trustees received an update on distance learning and waived employee evaluations in light of the shut down.





At exactly 8:20 p.m. and 2020 military time on April 17, the lights at Bearcat Stadium were turned on for 20 minutes to honor the **Aledo High School Class of** 2020. That afternoon, Gov. **Greg Abbott announced** school closings for the entire the state for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year.

#### **APRIL 24**

The Texas Education Association officially shut down schools through the end of the school year, and the University Interscholastic League shuts down sports through the end of the school year as well. Aledo ISD trustees and administrators begin working through the logistics of the unexpected change and look to measures to try for in-person learning in the fall.

The mayors of Parker County sent Texas Governor Greg Abbott a letter asking him to return local control to cites amid pandemic shutdowns. "Our citizens have obeyed the governor's orders and have done what was necessary to prevent the rapid spread of this virus in our community," the letter read. "Our citizens and business owners are eager to begin the process of restarting our lives and livelihoods and trust us, their local elected officials, to navigate the proper course."



#### **MAY 1**

Governor Greg Abbott announced his "Reopen Texas" plan, but not all details are immediately clear. Local COVID-19 task force leaders began interpreting the orders to allow businesses in the county to reopen under certain conditions, such as reduced occupancy and enhanced personal safety measures.

In a special meeting via Zoom, the Willow Park City Council approved the site plan for The Ben Hogan Learning Center at Squaw Creek Golf Course. The facility will only be the second of its kind in



The Willow Park City Council approved site plans for a new building at Trinity Christian Academy, the THRIVE Learning Center, and a plat for The Village at Willow Park Phase 2. Nathan Crummel stepped into the city council seat vacated by Gary McKaughan after Crummel ran unopposed for the seat.

Local dignitaries, including US Representative Kay Granger, turned out to Squaw Creek Golf Course in Willow Park for the groudbreaking of the new Ben Hogan Learning Center.

Tri-County Electric prepared for its long-awaited move into their new headquarters on Bailey Ranch Road in Aledo.

#### <u>MAY 21</u>






#### JANUARY 24

The Bearcat basketball team fell to Abilene Wylie, 49-41, slipping the bottom half of district standings.


