Board approves additional funding for turf

Soil testing not included in original allocation

The Aledo ISD Board of Trustees voted to add an additional \$144,835 toward converting the Baseball and Softball Complex to synthetic turf at its Aug. 16 meeting. It is part of an ongoing project the board approved in June which will cost the district more than \$3.163 million and includes updates to the synthetic turf when it is near the end of its useful life cycle, and converting to synthetic turf at certain sports fields. Paragon Sports Constructors is completing the updates.

The inconsistency with the grass on the current fields have caused problems for the teams, Athletic Director Steve Wood said at the June 16 meeting.

"We've had to miss practices often. Home field advantage in playoffs, we've had to travel as far as Bowie, Texas for home games," Wood said.

The increase was needed because soil testing was not done before the board approved the initial amount, according to Chief Financial Officer Earl Husfeld.

"At the time that we had asked, we were uncertain... if the board was going to approve that, so consequently we waited," he said. "We did not do the soil testing or geotechnical testing prior to the board approving that."



Looking back, there could have been a better sequence of events to ensure they had enough funding approved initially, Husfeld said.

"In hindsight, we probably should've approached you guys about a contingency factor if you will... Because there was probably something like this would come up," Husfeld said.

After the soil was tested, results found that if moisture conditioning was not done, the field could potentially have inconsistent swelling, which could cause potential harm to players, according to Director of Construction and Facilities Tyler Boswell.

The board unanimously approved the increase in funding.



Hope and a Fresh Start

Sanctified Hope holds annual Fashion Show


When Kelly stepped off the bus after her release from prison, she had only the clothes on her back and a check for \$50 from the state. She was greeted by Janet Duvall, founder of Sanctified Hope, who welcomed her into the local program that provides counseling, emotional support, and a place to stay while the women adjust to their new life outside of prison.

Duvall, a Weatherford resident, started the program in 2015 to address the needs of women newly released from prison. She was leading a Bible study at the Federal Prison at Carswell called "Making Peace with Your Past" when she felt a calling to start the ministry. One inmate asked Duvall about where she could go after prison.

Unlike some institutional programs, Sanctified Hope provides a residential living environment with family-style meals. Two Weatherford duplexes, one modified to create a six-bedroom house, provide housing. Women who are used to sleeping without a pillow on a thin pad in a prison cell are welcomed home to fully furnished bedrooms decorated by volunteers. The ministry coordinates assistance with other local resources, including Safe Harbor Counseling and Center of Hope.

The Sanctified Hope 2021 Fashion Show celebrated a group of these women at the ministry's home church, Trinity Bible Church in Willow Park, on Aug. 12. Sanctified Hope gave program members the opportunity to model. Volunteers organized by "Beauty Blessings" provided the models' hair and makeup for the event with clothing provided by local retailers. Speakers expressed their gratitude for the program and the people who have provided their support. Teresa, one model and program member, was surprised at the cheers from the audience after sharing her testimony. "I never thought I'd get a standing ovation," she reportedly told a board member after the event.

During the event, a donor offered a John Deere riding lawnmower to the program. Duvall was unaware at the time that the ladies had been praying for a riding mower to help maintain the three-acre property. "It was the answer to a prayer," she said. "This is not the first time that we have seen God answer prayer. He has done this over and over again."



Interim Executive Director Kim Brewer, a 1996 Graduate of Aledo High School, emphasized that the Sanctified Hope program is not mandatory and the women must apply to participate. "These ladies are no different than you and I," Brewer says. "They made choices at some point that led them down a different path." When she became a mentor, Brewer was told by a member, "nobody has told me they loved me." You don't need a degree in social work, Brewer says, "You just have to show you care."

Sanctified Hope has accepted their 48th participant after receiving their first woman in 2017. There is space for as many as 19 ladies in the current facilities. 

Capital Highlights

Abbott sued over mask-mandate ban

A growing number of school districts, counties and cities have defied Gov. Greg Abbott's executive order banning mask mandates, as COVID-19 cases continue to spike due to the delta variant and a low rate of vaccination among Texans.

As KUT.org reported, officials in Dallas and Bexar counties won a first round in court in requiring masks in public schools and most government buildings. School districts in Austin, Houston, Dallas and San Antonio, among others, are requiring students, teachers and staff to wear masks.

Abbott and Attorney General Ken Paxton are appealing the initial district court decisions and have vowed to sue any government official who defies the governor's order.

On Sunday, the Texas Supreme Court temporarily allowed Abbott to enforce his order as the cases proceed.

Hospitalizations, COVID-19 cases continue to rise

Meanwhile, the number of new cases of COVID-19, overwhelmingly among unvaccinated Texans, continues to rise with 98,383 reported in the past week along with 628 deaths, according to the Coronavirus Resource Center at Johns Hopkins University.

Hospitalizations are approaching the peak levels of mid-January, with 11,381 lab-confirmed COVID-19 patients, according to the Texas Department of State Health Services, up 27% from the week before.

As students return to classrooms across the state, the number of children in Texas hospitalized with COVID-19 is at one of its highest levels since the pandemic began. In the 19-county region around Dallas and Fort Worth, there were no staffed pediatric beds available late last week, according to KUT.org.

DSHS reports 13.055 million Texans are full vaccinated, about 44.7% of the total population.

Democratic lawmakers still absent; arrests ordered

The Texas Senate last week passed Senate Bill 1, which would establish new restrictions on voting, despite a 15-hour filibuster by state Sen. Carol Alvarado, D-Houston. Meanwhile, Democratic lawmakers in the House continued to break quorum to stave off a House vote on the measure, despite arrest warrants issued by House Speaker Dade Phelan, R-Beaumont.

The Texas Supreme Court on Thursday temporarily blocked district court orders that would have allowed more than 40 House Democrats to avoid civil arrest warrants. The Democrats were expected to issue a response to the high court's ruling this week, according to the Austin American-Statesman.

Texas Democrats have denied Republicans a quorum since the closing days of the regular legislative session. The

Legislature is now in its second special session, with Democrats decamping to Washington, D.C. to push for a federal voting rights bill. Some lawmakers have since returned to Texas but continue to stay away from the state Capitol.

Seized alligator snapping turtles returned to nature

A multi-agency effort has led to the release of 21 adult and six juvenile snapping turtles back into East Texas after being seized in an illegal traffic attempt. A 2017 investigation by game wardens with Texas Parks and Wildlife Department into the poaching of the turtles led to the arrest of three men, two of whom received prison time in December of that year.

Alligator snapping turtles are among the largest freshwater turtles in the world and can grow to weigh more than 200 pounds with a lifespan of more than 100 years. The turtles are designated as threatened with statewide extinction under Texas law. The turtles were taken to the Natchitoches National Fish Hatchery after the seizure and released recently under a joint effort with TPWD, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Stephen F. Austin State University and others. The turtles are a popular food item in Louisiana, which limits catches to one per day.

Early August rainfall above normal for half of state

Just 1% of the state is suffering drought conditions, primarily in the Big Bend area, a small piece of Northeast Texas near the Oklahoma border and the northwest tip of the Panhandle. That's the latest report from Dr. Mark Wentzel, a hydrologist with the Texas Water Development Board.

Three months ago, 45% of the state's area was in drought, while a third of the state suffered from drought conditions a year ago.

Pedestrian, bicyclist deaths continue to climb

While traffic casualties declined in 2020, Texas saw a steep rise in the number of people killed while walking or biking on the state's roadways. According to the Texas Department of Transportation, 731 people died in pedestrian-related crashes last year, up 9% from 2019. Bicyclists killed in crashes totaled 82, up from 68 deaths the previous year. Overall, the number of pedestrian and bicyclist deaths has been steadily increasing the past five years, according to TxDOT.


"Whether you're behind the wheel, on foot, or riding a bicycle, we're reminding all Texans that they need to be safe and smart, and that starts with paying attention to driving and obeying traffic laws," said Marc Williams, executive director of TxDOT. The agency's "Be Safe. Drive Smart" campaign features safety reminders on television, billboards, gas pumps, buses, and social media. They are components of #EndTheStreakTX, which encourages driver safety. The last death-free day on Texas roadways was Nov. 7, 2000.




