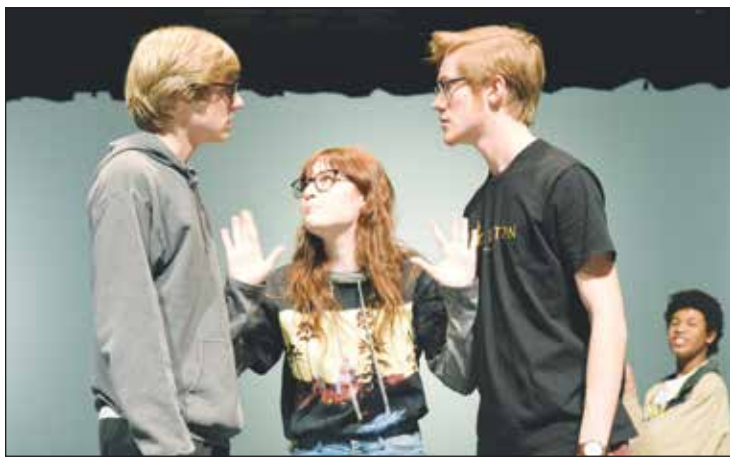

JANUARY 26

FEBRUARY 2

Willow Park mayor Doyle Moss blasted social media rumors during an annexation hearing for land along Bankhead Highway. Moss referred to rumors concerning a proposed senior living facility near Bankhead and Ranch House Road.

The City of Hudson Oaks issued a certificate of obligation for water, sewer, roads, other improvements.

MAY 4

A ruling handed down by the Supreme Court of Texas could potentially lead to a \$1.2 million dollar hit to Aledo ISD after the court rules that natural gas compressors on wells should be taxed differently.

The cities of Aledo and Hudson Oaks approved a partnership for an automated system that will automatically activate outdoor warning sirens in the event of a weather emergency.

Members of the Aledo City Council approved a development plan for The Villas Downtown, a 35-lot subdivision with 35 paired townhomes, two parks, landscaping, and trails. The new neighborhood will be located off Old Annetta Road.

FILED WITH THE PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION OF TEXAS**

On November 30, 2018, Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC ("Oncor"), Sharyland Distribution & Transmission Services, L.L.C. ("SDTS"), Sharyland Utilities, L.P. ("Sharyland"), and Sempra Energy ("Sempra") (collectively, "Joint Applicants") filed a Joint Report and Application for Regulatory Approvals ("Joint Application") with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("PUC" or "Commission"), copies of which are kept at Oncor's office at 1616 Woodall Rodgers Freeway, Suite 6000, Dallas, TX 75202. The Joint Application requests Commission approval of three transactions (the "Proposed Transactions"), as described below, that will result in SDTS becoming an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of Oncor that will own transmission and distribution assets held today by Sharyland and SDTS in central, north, and west Texas, and Sharyland will remain a utility in south Texas, with Sempra owning a 50 percent indirect interest in Sharyland. First, Sharyland will transfer its assets in north Texas, along with associated assets, liabilities, and working capital, to SDTS. In return, Sharyland will receive all of SDTS's assets located in south Texas. In connection with this asset exchange, Sharyland's equity interest in SDTS will be cancelled, and the certificates of convenience and necessity of Sharyland and SDTS will be amended to authorize the "North Texas Utility" (referring to the post-closing assets to be owned by SDTS) and the "South Texas Utility" (referring to the post-closing assets to be owned by Sharyland) to own, operate, and maintain their respective post-exchange assets. Second, Oncor will acquire InfraREIT, Inc. ("InfraREIT") and InfraREIT Partners, LP and, as a result, will own and operate all of SDTS's post-transaction assets. Finally, Sempra will purchase a 50-percent indirect limited partnership interest in a newly formed Delaware limited partnership expected to be named Sharyland Holdings, LP, which will own a 100-percent interest in Sharyland. The Joint Applicants also request Commission approval of certain regulatory terms listed in Exhibit A to the Joint Application, some of which are regulatory conditions to closing.

The Joint Application does not seek Commission approval of a modification to Oncor's rates. Oncor is requesting a Commission finding, however, that Oncor may consolidate the North Texas Utility's wholesale transmission rates with Oncor's rates as part of Oncor's next base-rate case. Oncor also requests Commission approval to establish a regulatory asset to track any make-whole payments or other expenses that may be required to extinguish, transfer, or restructure the debt of InfraREIT and its subsidiaries under the Proposed Transactions, so that Oncor may seek recovery of that regulatory asset in its next base-rate case. The Joint Applicants also seek Commission approval to split the current Sharyland wholesale transmission service tariff into two separate tariffs—one for the North Texas Utility and one for the South Texas Utility—which rates, when taken together, would be equal to Sharyland's rate in effect at the time the Proposed Transactions close.

Environmental lessons from a rare local plant
The Comanche Peak prairie clover, which is only found in a few counties in this area, is so rare that it is at high risk of extinction. That has drawn the attention of Tarleton State University grad student Seth Hamby, who is doing research on how to save and restore the species, formally known as Dalea reverchonii. Hamby will discuss his research project at the Jan. 10 meeting of the Cross Timbers Chapter of the Native Plant Society

of Texas in Weatherford. The plant is only found on certain limestone soils in North Central Texas. It shares that habitat with other species that have evolved to handle hot, dry conditions and Hamby says such plants "may play an important role in re-vegetating areas affected by a changing climate." He was awarded a \$2,000 research grant in 2018 for his project from the Native Plant Society. Hamby grew up in rural South Carolina, where his appreciation of plants first blossomed. He received a bachelor's degree from Tarleton in wildlife, sustainability and ecosystem sciences and is working on a master's degree there. While at Tarleton, he created the Bosque River Nature Center and founded the Prairie Oaks Master Naturalist chapter, where a partnership with Tarleton has allowed students to get college credit for master naturalist training, a first in Texas. He plans to pursue a Ph.D. in botany at Oregon State. The program will be Thursday, Jan. 10, following the chapter's monthly business meeting at 6:30 p.m. The regular location of the chapter's monthly meetings has changed. The meetings will now be held at the restored Mount Pleasant School, 213 Raymond George Way in Weatherford. Visitors are always welcome, and light refreshments will be available.



Ladycats defeat Denton Ryan in first round of girls' basketball playoffs.

APRIL 6

Bearcats defeat Denton Braswell and Fort Worth Arlington Heights to advance to third round of boys' soccer playoffs. Ladycats defeat Denton Ryan in opening round of the girls' soccer playoffs but fall to Fort Worth South Hills in area round. Bearcats win boys' District 6-5A championship by 44 strokes to advance to the regional tournament; AHS junior Evan

Pennington takes top medalist honor.

APRIL 13

The Ladycats came back from 20 strokes out of first place in the first round with a 320 in the second round to win the District 6-5A girls' golf championship by 24 strokes and advance to the regional tournament. Bearcats defeat Denton Ryan in overtime to advance to the boys' regional soccer tournament.

Long-distance runner Graydon Morris and pole vaulters Sienna White, Zach Davis and Ryan Brown qualified for the state track meet at the Region I meet. For the seventh consecutive year, the Aledo Ladycats golf team qualified for the girls' state golf

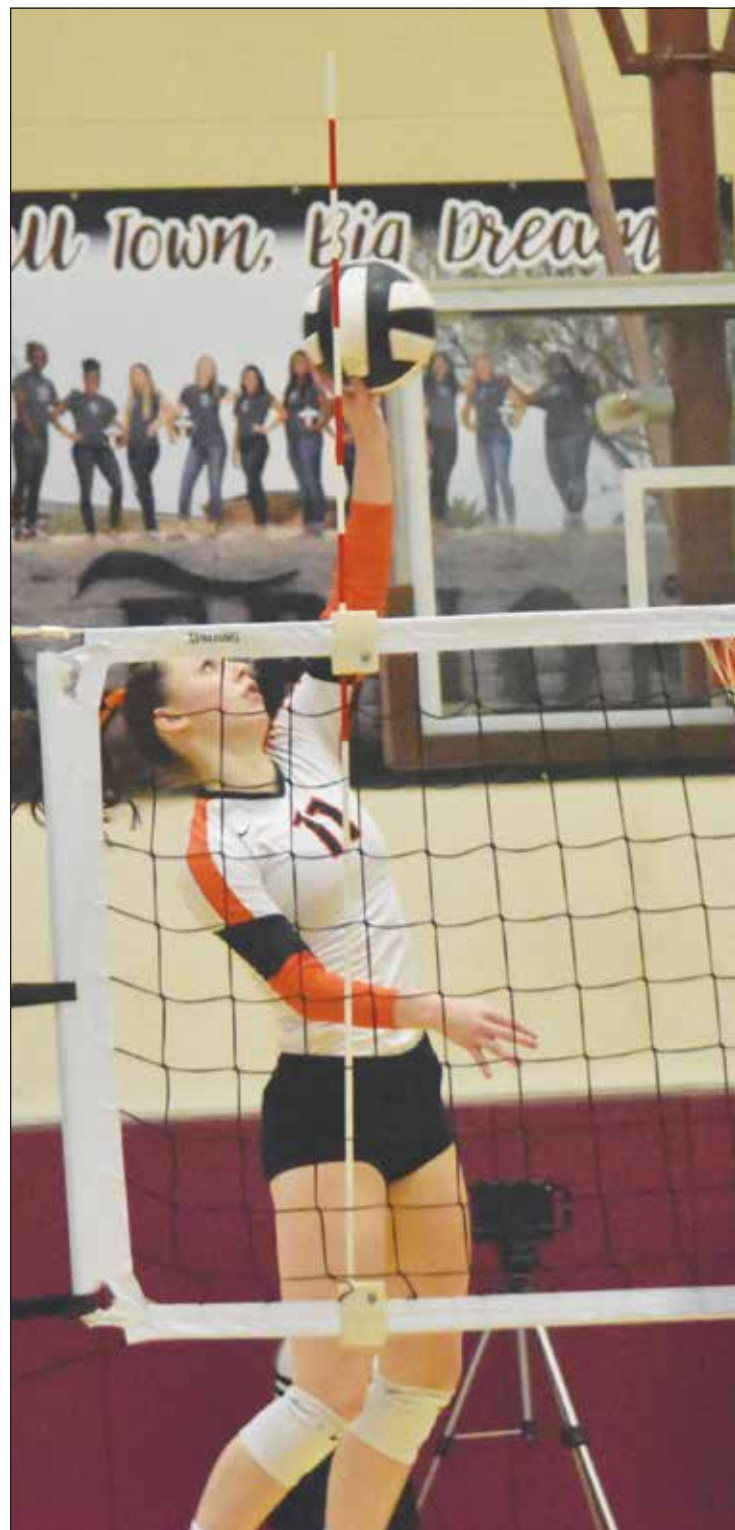

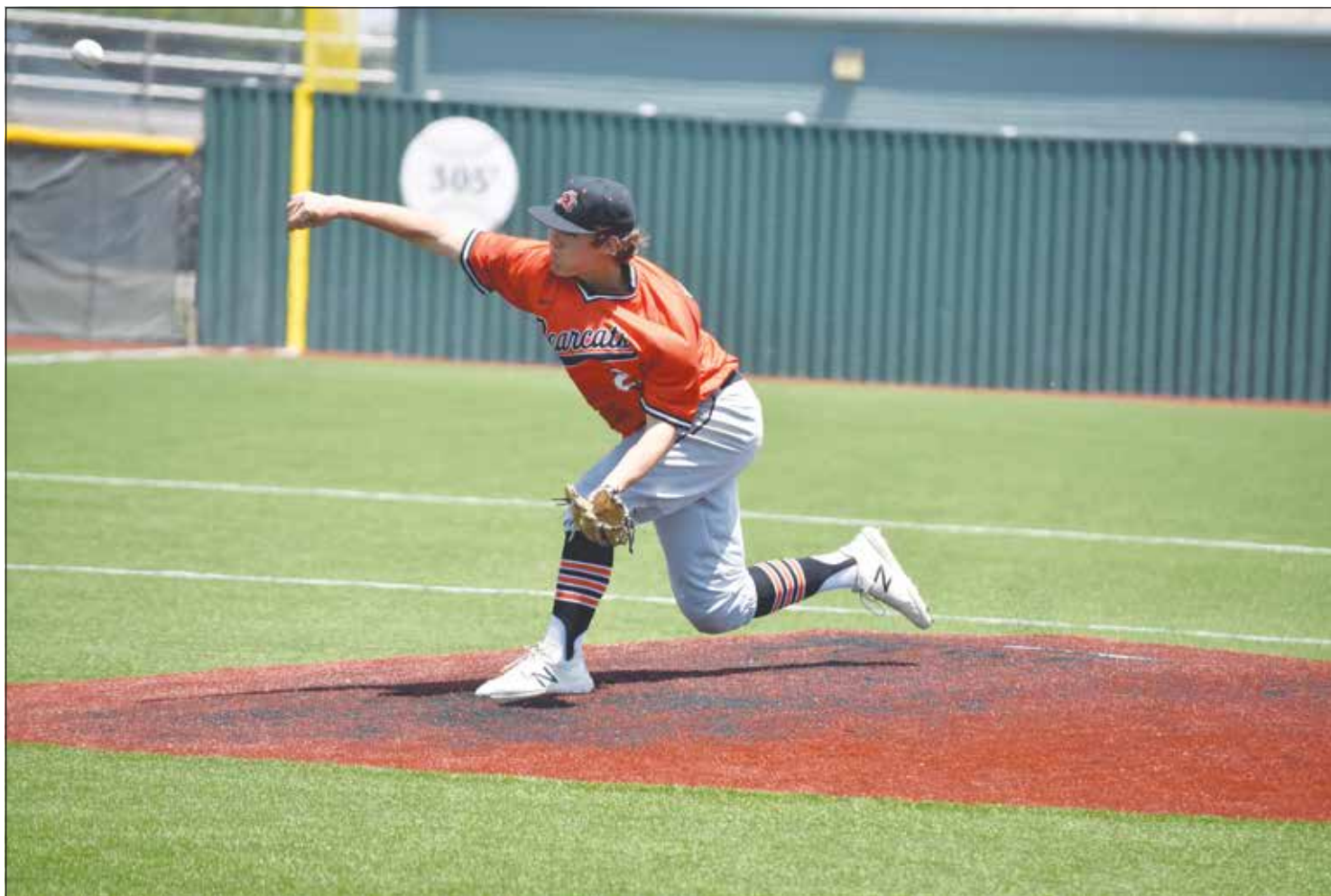
