
participate in the virtual graduation, and they have been asked to come back in the fall to take part in the fall commencement ceremony.

We raced toward the house with the exuberant dogs close behind. The yearly ritual was always the same: off came the shoes and socks, then the school clothes were exchanged for summer shorts and tee shirts.

The fullness of nature lay just outside our front door. There were tall trees to climb and vines as thick as Tarzan's wrist to swing on. There were deep woods and forests to explore, where birds, rabbits, squirrels, and wildlife were plentiful. Sweet plums and bullaces grew in secret places were only my sisters and I were aware of.

Mama and Daddy never

My small sisters built playhouses with bottles, bricks, and anything that would serve as furniture or furnishings for their make-believe houses. They often argued over who had the most beautiful make-believe home. It was all about fantasy and play-acting with their eyes, hearts, and minds pointing toward reality and the future.

We walked barefoot over freshly plowed fields. We noticed the soil was cooler near the tree-lined forest than in the middle of a cotton field where the sun reigned supreme.

In the woods behind our house, we caught red-fin pike fish by hand when the creek dried up. We also took our stubby fishing poles to the maple hole to see if the fish were biting. Sometimes we lost our patience and jumped into the water, still wearing our clothes.

Nobody carried a watch because someone was nearby who always knew the time by studying the position of the sun overhead. You never heard of a person who had a timely appointment to keep because they'd say, "I'll be there when I get there."

Summertime was slow and easy, reflecting our speech, southern traditions, and laidback lifestyle. There were always different sizes of watermelons on front porches during the summer. Women sat in rockers and porch swings, shelling peas and butterbeans for canning or freezing.

Chickens ruffled their feathers in dry pockets of dust in the front yard, and the dogs stayed under the cool mulberry trees, seeking a respite from the intense Georgia heat.

There would be good times ahead. The neighbors would come for a peanut boiling on Saturday night while listening to the Grand Ole Opry from Nashville, and all the children would argue who would be the first one to sit on Daddy's ice cream churn on Sunday afternoon. Mama would decide the flavor of the ice cream—vanilla, peach, strawberry, or chocolate.

As night fell, the children chased fireflies in the front yard. Rain fell on the tin roof after midnight while God watched over
