The first Pine Tree Festival in 1946 came about, not so much as a promotion for the pine industry—that was so well established that, as the county's principal producer, it hardly needed promoting—but rather to discourage the burning of the woods.

In the aftermath of the second world war the whole nation was in transition from war time to peace time and the products of the southern yellow pine were in great demand. Swainsboro Lumber Company had its own "yard" in Philadelphia. Mathis Lumber Company in Twin City was the largest industry in the community. Several turpentine stills operated within the county. Savannah's principal seagoing exports were T&R Factors, with T&R standing for turpentine and rosin.

Burning of the woods was

a common practice in the early spring. It was thought that grass would grow faster after burning. The law allowed cattle to roam wherever they like. In the early years of the Pine Tree Festivals visitors often had to drive through clouds of smoke, to the great embarrassment of festival promoters. Millions of seedling pine trees were yearly destroyed by fires.

The festival was clearly a strong influence in Georgia's enactment of the controversial "no-fence" law, requiring cattle raisers to fence their cattle in rather than let them roam at large.

No one individual could claim credit for the original idea of a festival. Many community leaders were involved. The Kiwanis Club, as Swainsboro's only civic organization at the time, naturally assumed the sponsorship. Kirk Sutlive of Savannah, public relations manager for Union Bag (now Union Camp), saw the value of a festival and was a great help in its formation.

The 47 past festivals have been varied in character, but one constant feature has been the Saturday morning parade. Only once in history has the parade been rained out, and that was in 1949, it actually started before being stopped by the downpour.

The Pine Tree Festival golf tournament has become an annual tradition. Garden Clubs stage flower shows at festival time and beauty pageants in various categories fill the week before the parade. Sometimes the pageants have been the site of political speechmaking. It was at the 1948 festival when Herman Talmadge and Melvin Thompson, both claiming with some justifications to be the governor of Georgia, ended their months-long feud and spoke from the same platform.

Past festivals have featured air shows with parachute jumps, water ski competitions, arts and crafts exhibits, forestry field days, lumberjack contests, community pageants, country music, famous personalities, automobile races, marathon runs, carnivals and numerous other attractions. While other industries have selected the county and moved to it or grown within in, the pine tree, clearly the county's greatest natural resource, continues to provide a mighty portion of Emanuel County's economy.


The annual Pine Tree Festival has become the traditional stage in southeast Georgia for the festive salute to the pine tree and to the economy it supports.



Jimmy Morgan first Green Jacket recipient

Taking a cue from our northern Georgia cousins, in 2008, the Pine Tree Festival committee began awarding a green jacket to deserving citizens. What better way to kick off this prestigious award than by naming Jimmy Morgan the first recipient?

Morgan's contributions

to the Pine Tree Festival are beyond reckoning, especially as he was one of the founding members and instrumental in getting the festival on its feet. He served as the Pine Tree Festival Chairman in 1948 and was the parade Grand Marshal in 1990. In addition to being honored with the green jacket in 2008, the Festival itself was also dedicated in his honor. icated in hi

The festival, which began in 1946, was an effort to call attention to the enormous waste from burning, and to pay tribute to the forestry industry, Morgan writes in his Pine Tree Festival history, published annually In The Forest-Blade's Pine Tree Festival special section. Forestry in those days was divided into three segments: saw timber, naval stores (turpentine and resin) and pulpwood. Devotees of each of these three segments loudly debated the merits of one of the three, and the evils of

the other two. Sawmillers were convinced that "turpentining" would stunt the growth of trees. Naval store people on the other hand gloated over the fact that southeast Georgia enjoyed a world monopoly on turpentine products, and argued that it should be exploited. Pulpwooders saw the prospects of dominating the paper market, so long the domain of Canada and the northwest.

Morgan, himself a pine tree farmer, has been in business since moving to Swainsboro in 1938, just as chainsaws were beginning to replace crosscut saws. His heritage in the pine tree industry stretches back to his grandfather-in-law, James A. "Tobe" Coleman, Sr., a pioneer in the local industry.

He continues to be a driving force and an inspiration in the heritage of the Pine Tree Festival, and certainly sets the bar high for all recipients of the Pine Tree Festival's green jacket.

The Knotty Pine 5K will take place again this year as part of the 74 1/2 Annual Pine Tree Festival. The run returned to the date, location, and starting time from previous years and the Pine Tree Festival after cancellation last year because of Covid. This year's 5K race will take place in Swainsboro. downtown The 5K race begins at 8 a.m. on Saturday, May 8, at the corner of Green Street and Pine Street, with registration beginning at 7 a.m. The awards ceremony will take place at 9:15 a.m. Entry fee for early registration for the 5K is \$25. Runners who submit registrations before April 24 will be guaranteed a 2021 Knotty Pine T-shirt. Registration fee after April 24 and on the day of the race will be \$30.

and 75th 2022 - the 200th

The year 2022 has special significance for the city of Swainsboro, the Swainsboro Kiwanis Club, and the Pine Tree Festival.

On November 18, 1814 Governor Peter Early approved an act designating a site for public buildings in Emanuel County. The County Commissioners agreed upon a County seat at the site that is now the Swainsboro Downtown Square. On December 6, 1822 the Georgia General Assembly established Swainsboro as the seat of Emanuel County. That will make December 6, 2022 the 200th anniversary of the city of Swainsboro.

Swainsboro was named in recognition of Stephen Swains, who represented Montgomery and Emanuel Counties in the state senate for 33 years. He was the state senator who introduced the bill for the creation of the county in 1812. The town's name was changed to "Paris" at its incorporation on February 18, 1854, but three years later reverted to its current name, Swainsboro. Swainsboro has been called the "Crossroads of the South" for its location at the intersection of U.S. Highways I and 80.

With the assistance of some Kiwanians from the Kiwanis Club of Dublin, a group of Swainsboro civic leaders met on May 31, 1922 to organize the Kiwanis Club of Swainsboro. Kiwanis International officially approved the Charter for the Kiwanis Club of Swainsboro on August 31, 1922. Fifty Swainsboro

citizens gathered with itations, so the Emanuel their Dublin Kiwanis Club sponsors to celebrate the new club's Charter night on October 12, 1922. Thus, October 12, 2022 is the 100th Anniversary of the Charter of the Kiwanis Club of Swainsboro.

The first Pine Tree Festival was held in May of 1946 to call attention to the problem of forest fires that were destroying thousands of acres of timber. I.L. Price was the Chairman of the first festival.

In 2020 the Covid-19 pandemic caused a postponement of the Pine Tree Festival, the longest running community festival in Georgia, along with many other festivals around the country. In 2021 the Pine Tree Festival is coming back with some limCounty Festival Foundation decided to designate it as the 74.5 Pine Tree Festival. Hopefully, in 2022 we can celebrate the 75th Pine Tree Festival with a full range of activities.

Enjoy the 74.5 Pine Tree Festival this year on May 7-8, 2021! Be sure to come back on May 6-7, 2022 for the 75th Pine Tree Festival!






