2022 season not a typical year for Bulldogs

When the football schedule was posted last season, you could tell it could be a rough and tumble season for the Bulldogs. The Bulldogs ended the year with a 4-7 record for their first losing season in over 20 years.

With only four region games, Coach Kearson was looking for six non-region games. With that in mind, the Bulldogs were on tap to face four teams ranked in the top 10 in their different classes. Five of the six teams made it to the playoffs.

First on tap for the Bulldogs was their longest running rival, the Tigers from Metter. Without the benefit of a scrimmage game last season, the Bulldogs were a little rusty the first half with Metter leading 21-7 at the half. The Bulldogs outscored and out rushed the Tigers in the second half but lost to Metter 28-14.

The Bulldogs traveled to Lincoln Co. the next Friday to face the seventh ranked Red Devils at the storied Buddy Buford field. PJ Farnum rushed for 185 yards with Bryce Kearson adding 110 through the air as the Bulldogs ended Lincoln's two game winning streak 41-27.

On September 9, ECI traveled to the Shamrock Bowl to take on Dublin. The Bulldogs went toe to toe with the Irish in the first half with the score 14-14 at the break. Dublin put 27 points on the Bulldog defense in the second half to give ECI their second loss of the season, 41-21.

ECI and Swainsboro renewed the county battle last season when the Tigers visited Rountree Stadium. The Bulldogs gave up over 300 yards rushing and another 41 points for the second game in a row as the eventual state runner-up Tigers trounced the Bulldogs 41-12.

The Bulldogs spent the next Friday night in Wrightsville to take on fifth ranked Johnson Co. With the Trojans leading 21-7 at the half, the Bulldogs offense got in gear in the second half to tie the game at 21-21. The defense shut down JOCO in the second half limiting them to just 40 yards of offense. With the score tied at the end of regulation, Johnson Co. scored a TD in overtime. The Bulldogs failed to match in OT to lose to the Trojans 27-21.

The Bulldogs hosted Jefferson Co. on Thursday, September 29, due to upcoming severe weather on the horizon for Friday. ECI overcame three turnovers to defeat the Warriors 34-27.


After six games, the Bulldogs finally played a region game when they hosted Portal the next Friday night. The defense limited Portal to 102 total yards defeating the Panthers 42-14.

The Bulldogs took the long ride to Darien on October 21, to take on another top 10 team, McIntosh Co. The Buccaneers took a 14-13 lead into the locker room. The Bucs limited ECI to one TD in the second half and took the game and the region championship, defeating the Bulldogs 28-21. It was a game of different halves against Jenkins Co. on October 27. The Bulldogs rushed for 240 yards in the first half, to lead the Eagles 21-14 at the half. ECI failed to find the endzone in the second half losing to the Eagles 31-24.

With a 1-2 region record, the Bulldogs were playing for the third seed in the state playoffs when they faced Montgomery Co. in the last regular season game. The Bulldogs led the Eagles 28-0 at the half with the defense limiting Montgomery to just 15 total yards. The Bulldogs rushed for 277 yards and took the game 34-14.

The Bulldogs faced Telfair Co. in the first round of the playoffs. It was the first playoff game the Trojans had hosted since 1993. The Trojans made the most of it knocking the Bulldogs out of the playoffs 62-37. If you like a defensive game this was not the one to watch. The two defenses gave up almost 850 yards, 419 by the Bulldogs, 428 by the Trojans.

The Bulldogs will have to find a way to stop opposing teams in 2023. The defense gave up an average of 31 points per game last season.



Hard act to follow

Consensus is, if any size school loses eight seniors on a softball team, it would be rare to just pick up where you left off. That is certainly the case for a class A team. Consensus can't predict when confidence, togetherness and tradition is involved in a successful program.

The ECI softball team will begin the 2023 season having to replace eight seniors who were 28-6 and won the region and state championship in 2022.

Gone are region player of the year, region defensive player of the year, six first team all-region players and four all-state players.

After a long non-region schedule, it was finally time for region play and the Tigers welcomed Jefferson County to "The Den" very rudely, by stomping them 48-0. Next up was a business trip to East Laurens and the Tigers handled business very easily as they held another shutout, winning the game 48-0 for the second week in a row. To this point, the Tigers hadn't been challenged at all, but their next two games would determine the region title and would be tough ones. First was Bleckley County at home, and it became the toughest game of the regular season for the Tigers. Bleckley jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead and that score stayed the same until the second quarter when the Tigers shot back in front going up 20-7 at half. The Tigers added eight in the third quarter and felt like they had the game in the bag comfortably, but Bleckley had a late surge scoring twice, and it wasn't enough as the Tigers escaped with a 28-21 win. The last game of the regular season was a trip to big-time rival Dublin for the region title. The Tigers bullied Dublin from start to finish to get the win 28-7 and capped off one of the greatest regular seasons in school history. Now, it was on to the real season, the playoffs. In round one, Bacon County made their way to Swainsboro, only to get manhandled and ran out of the building and the playoffs by a score of 47-0. the Gamecocks, beating them 57-13. The Tigers won the coin flip to host Rabun County for the Elite Eight. Rabun County has been a dominant force in the GHSA for the past few seasons, so this was setting up to be Swainsboro's toughest test yet. After the first quarter, the Tigers found themselves down 10-7, but it didn't take long for the Tigers to turn it on as they took the lead 14-10 at half and kept it until they ran away with it in the fourth quarter for the 35-10 win, meaning they advanced to the Final Four. Now, it was time to take on an Irwin County team who had won back-to-back state titles coming into the season. Everyone expected this to be one of the best games of the year, and that it was. This was a battle from start to the finish. Coming out, it looked like Swainsboro would handle them easily after two touchdowns from Demello Jones, but Irwin slowed down the Tigers enough. Swainsboro found themselves down 21-19 with minimal time left in the game. They drove it down the field with less than a minute left in the game and had a major decision...go for the end zone or kick a field goal, and Coach Roberts elected to kick the field goal. Landen Scott came on for the field goal and hit it right down the middle to send the Tigers to the State Championship game; a play that will go down as one of the greatest plays in school history. In the state title, the Tigers faced off with Prince Avenue Christian and it was a physical fight to the end and the Tigers fought as long as they could, but eventually fell too far behind and were beaten 52-34 to end the season. What a great season it was from the Tigers.



2023 Lady Tigers softball team looks to build on last year's success

The players and coaches of the 2023 edition of the Swainsboro Lady Tigers softball team are excited about the upcoming season as they look to build on last season's success. Last year's team finished with a 17-12 record; a runner-up finish in region two of Class A division 1, and the team's first playoff win in eight years. The team will return 10 players from last year's team and coaches Alicia Hendrix, Daniel Overstreet, and Lori Smith all return to the dugout for the upcoming season.

Last year, the Lady Tigers graduated five seniors who led them to the 2022 Super Regional playoff round. Among those seniors who will have to be replaced are two of last year's leading hitters, Brianna Parks and Caley Wilkerson, who both hit over .400 on the season. Overall, matching last year's offense will be tough to accomplish as the 2022 team outscored their opponents by a score of 221-153 and ended the year with a team batting average of .339. This year, the team will also miss Brianna Parks' production in the pitching circle. Her 12-5 record and 2.89 ERA will be tough to replace.

The 2023 edition of the Lady Tigers softball team will feature four seniors. Jocie Hendrix (SS/2B), Savannah Hooks (P/1B), Hannah Howard (CF), and Callie Powell (P/3B) all come into the season with multiple years of starting experience and are expected to lead this year's squad. Callie Powell also looks to build on her strong performance from last year in the circle and lead this year's

pitching staff. Other pitchers who will likely see action include fellow senior Savannah Hooks, sophomore Kayla Crabb, and freshman Ariel Tapley.

The Tigers spent much of the summer in the weight room and on the field conditioning, practicing, and playing scrimmage games preparing for the upcoming season. The team also attended the FCA Softball Camp at Georgia Southern University. Now they look forward to the season opener at Burke County.

The early part of this year's schedule will be quite a challenge. After the season opener at 4A Burke County, the Lady Tigers will travel to Patriots Park in Grovetown for two games in the Harlem Fall Classic. They will then return to Swainsboro for their home opener on Tuesday August 8, against 5A opponent Statesboro High School. Then on Saturday, August 12, the Lady Tigers will play two games in the Rumble on the Ridge Tournament in Suwanee against two 7A powerhouse softball programs - Lambert High School and Mountain View High School.

The coaches and players hope that the tough early season schedule will get them ready for region play which begins in mid-August. This year's region opponents will again be very tough and will feature three games each against Bleckley County High School, East Laurens High School, Dublin High School, and Jefferson County High School.
