

One person was shot late Sunday afternoon, May 26, in an exchange of gunfire at a City Park in Swainsboro. The incident occurred at a weekend event at the "Gerald Phillips Park" in the DeAlva Park neighborhood. Officers of the Swainsboro Police Department at the scene reported multiple gun shots in the crowd of more than 2,000 people attending. Authorities confirmed that two persons have been arrested in connection with the shooting - Danbonte Green of East Dublin is charged with aggravated assault, possession of fireman during commission of a crime, theft by receiving stolen firearm; Quentavious Mercer of East Dublin is charged with aggravated assault, possession of firearm during commission of a crime.

The person injured by gunfire has been identified as Arman Myers of a Jacksonville, Fla address. She was transported to emergency medical facilities in Augusta and is reportedly in stable condition.

# Local races end with June 18 runoff

If you're keeping up with the 2024 political season, you would be accurate in saying, the first half is over, the halftime show is about to start, and the second half is shaping up to be a wild west rodeo. Locally, the results of the May 21, 2024, general election primaries revealed few surprises. For the District 12 Congressional race, Rick Allen won the Republican slot and Elizabeth Johnson captured the Democrat nomination. For State Senate, District 23, Senator Max Burns will face Democrat Shayna Boston in the November general election. For District 158, Representative Butch Parrish will carry the Republican banner against Democrat Madeline Ryan Smith. The remainder of the local County races were without opposition or had already been decided. These included the offices of Sheriff, Tax Commissioner, Coroner, Solicitor General, District Attorney, Clerk of Court, Probate Court Judge, and State Court Judge. There was only one local, contested, non-partisan race in this round of elections. In that race for Emanuel County Board of Education, District 7, the victory went to Del Brown with 335 votes over Cathi Frederiksen with 71 votes. The race for County Commission District 3 will be decided with a runoff election on June 18. Newcomers Chandra Hooks and John "Johnny" Moore will square off in a final competition for that post. In other State races of local interest, Andrew Pinson defeated John Barrow for a Supreme Court Judgeship and Jeff Davis was the winner in the race for a seat on the Georgia Court of Appeals over Tabitha Ponder.

That brings the 2024 political game up to date with the traditional third quarter" race to the finish line" scheduled for the end of June and early September.






# Oak Chapel renovation


by Tot Free About the time Covid reared its ugly head early in 2021 and churches were suspending in-house services for a while, another problem arose at Oak Chapel Baptist Church. While inspecting some low spots in the corner of the sanctuary, church members discovered that termites had been feasting on the 1873 building. The damage was extensive...much worse than even imagined. The congregation was faced with two options: demolish the building and rebuild or begin repairs. The sentimental and historic value of the church weighed heavily in the decision to repair, and ultimately became the unanimous vote. A committee was formed to begin background work on the project. Structural engineers they consulted assured that it was possible to make the necessary repairs. Bids were obtained, and the task of repairs went to Lynn Construction Contracting, Inc. in Claxton. Preparations were made, and work finally began on August 1, 2023. As the demo began, more and more damage was found, until the church was merely a shell on the outside, with the inside stripped down to the foundation. As impossible as it seems, the walls and very pillars supporting the foundation of the church were removed, and everything was rebuilt from the ground up to the ceiling. It seemed the more work that was done, the more work that needed to be done in another area. Foam insulation was added, new wiring was installed, a new HVAC was added, new lights, new carpet, new sheetrock, and new paint. Then attention was turned to the Sunday School building joining the sanctuary. A handicapped bathroom was added, along with new paint and new lights and new fixtures.

We still have the 1873 building, but it's safe and modernized now. Hopefully it will last another 150 years. A big THANK YOU goes out to everyone who worked on the committee, to those in the church and the community who helped financially, and to those who contributed in any way to help the little white church on the hill get a complete overhaul and face lift. Sadly, Pastor Ray Jenkins, who served the church for the last 20 years, passed away before the work was completed. The congregation, under the leadership of Pastor Tommy Henry, has been meeting in the church social hall all this time, but everyone is anxious to get back in the sanctuary. We hope to have an open house to show her off when all the work is complete. We can hardly wait!

Consistent and frequent visitation is one of the most important components of the family's case plan for reunification. In order for successful visits to occur, the children and parents







Pine Tree festival. The festival grew larger and more exciting each year. My highlight was the 1950 Festival. My friend Bunny Bailey and her future husband, Grady Johnson, were on the float as king and queen. Union-Camp had taken an interest and provided trophies and rewards for participants. I entered an essay contest and won the prize of a five-dollar check from Union-Camp, trip to Savannah on a bus and tour of the paper mill. To me, this was a great as a Pulitzer Prize. The guided tour of Savannah gave me a forever love of the history. This was topped off by dinner in dining room of the DeSota Hotel and a swim in the pool.

Momma went to work after I started school. She was a beautician and took pride in making women look pretty. Now, getting a perm in your hair in those days meant getting a PERMANENT wave. It was an electrical process with all sorts of wires

and clamps and heat and stinky stuff and waiting for the exact amount of time or else you'd wind up with a scorched head of hair or worse, no hair. Hair was rolled up with bobby pins and combed out with finger waves. Nails were mani-

cured and polished with precision and eyebrows were tweezed and sometimes, Momma would even give a facial to some of the ladies. All the time they were chatting and laughing and some of the ladies were even smoking. I remember going to

the beauty shop where Momma worked many days after school trying to do my homework, but it was useless because there was just too much see and hear. Watching and listening in a beauty shop in a small town is like being in the CIA! You could really get the scoop there on everybody and everything.

Momma was a jack of all trades. Sort of. She wasn't much of a cook, but she could cook up a pot of grits and that was always the start of a meal. The rest of the meal just sort of fell into place. She nearly had a heart attack once because she had to make a chocolate cake for the MYF ice cream social at church, and vowed she'd never do it again as long as she lived.

But Momma could sew, and she'd sit down in the floor with a bunch of newspapers or brown paper sacks and a pencil and draw out a pattern for a dress for me to wear. I remember her skill at making my costume for the school "Operetta" out of crepe paper. I was the best-looking fairy in the whole show! It had a full gathered skirt, ruffled sleeves and I wore a large ruffled hat. Boy that was something! Then, for my very first piano recital in the 3rd grade, Momma made my taffeta aqua evening gown, which was absolutely the prettiest evening gown in the world. She topped it off with a corsage of pink sweetheart roses from the fence that grew out back, and I did a splendid job on my first musical solo piece. Momma was proud.

The next year when she

got out the dress to try it on to see if it would work for my recital, it was a wee bit tight. She told me to hold my breath and I sucked up and took a big breath and she yanked up the zipped. Yikes! She zipped up three inches of my skin in my side. Needless to say, there was a whole lot of screaming going on for a few minutes while she unzipped the dress, begging me to forgive her. I was a bit miffed. She did let out the seams before I tried on that dress again, but I did wear it again for

that recital. I did a short stint in the Girl Scouts in the 3rd grade. I decided going to camp would be a great way to spend a week in the summer. Besides, I had never been away from home without my Momma and Daddy, so it was sort or a rite of passage. It meant that I would have to join Girls Scouts I figured I might as well give it a try. Camp Juliette Low was in Savannah, and I spent a week of misery weaving bracelets and swimming in waters infested with crocodiles and dodging spiders and snakes. I was sitting at the gate of the camp on my suitcase waiting for Momma and Daddy on Saturday morning the last day of camp.


Since Momma worked, she had little time for washing and ironing which was all done by hand. Down the road

several blocks, in what was known then as the "Ouarters" lived a black lady who washed and ironed clothes for us. She had a bunch of little children. I loved to go with Momma to get the clean clothes so I could see the newest baby. Sometimes I could hold it. I loved

holding her babies. I remember how the clothes smelled of steam, bleach and starch. The woman would always be ironing on the front porch when we came. She had an RC Cola bottle with a sprinkler cap which she used to sprinkle the clothes. There would be a whole bunch of them rolled up already sprinkled and ready to iron. She washed and ironed for lots of people. Her baby would be beside her in a crib and the other little ones around the porch playing in the dirt, chasing each other and laughing. They'd always gather around when we'd come to get our clothes. The house had no screens on the windows and looked just like all the others on the street. They called them shotgun houses. One room after another – usually just two rooms. Momma paid her for the clean clothes and left the dirty ones. She was happy and Momma was happy. That was a normal way of life in those days. The Swainsboro Fire Department is a dual certification department serving the City of Swainsboro and Emanuel County. Led by Chief Mike Strobridge, there are twelve full time firefighters backed up by a cadre of part time and volunteer firefighters and support personnel. Operating out of three stations with three engines, one ladder truck, one squad, two hazardous materials trailers and a Mobile Command Unit, they respond to calls within the confines of the city and within a 5-mile radius of the county. In addition to the city equipment, the following county equipment are housed at fire headquarters: one engine, one rescue, and

The things you learn on this job. Someone called PromoGuy who, as it turns out, isn't a guy at all, but a company that has something to do with sports betting says Georgians feel down for an average of 39 minutes after their favorite sports team suffers a disappointing result. It turns out that we are well above - or below - the national average. According to the guys at PromoGuy, Americans in general feel down for 2.5 hours after a bad sports outcome -- or 2 hours and 38 minutes, if you want to be


Having shared this information with you, I hope PromoGuy will consider a survey on why we need to know this stuff. I'm betting they won't.
