Bulldogs' 2023 season

The Bulldogs started out the 2023 season with their annual scrimmage game against Vidalia. The two teams went toe to toe ending with a 14-14 tie at Buck Cravey Field. The Bulldog coaches had a lot to look at before the regular season, fielding their youngest team made up of mostly freshmen and sophomores, a few juniors and only 4 seniors.

ECI began the regular season in Metter against their longest rivalry. Mistakes and three turnovers in their own territory cost the Bulldogs against the Tigers. ECI held Metter to 43 yards of offense for three quarters but found themselves down 17-0. The Bulldogs fought back but lost the game 17-10.


The Bulldogs hosted Lincoln Co. the next Friday night at Rountree Stadium. The Red Devils were looking to atone for the 42-21 shellacking the Bulldogs gave them in Lincolnton in 2022. The Bulldogs were shut out for the first time in several years, losing to Lincoln 28-0.

On September 8, the Bulldogs saw the seventh ranked Dublin Irish visit. The Bulldogs upset the heavily favored Irish 10-7. The difference in the game was a 37-yard field goal by Oisin Matthews early in the third quarter. Facing

their second top ten ranked team in as many weeks, the Bulldogs took the short drive to Swainsboro with a match-up against the second ranked Tigers. With the score 13-10 at the end of the third quarter, the Tigers wore down the younger and smaller Bulldog defense in the fourth, to defeat the Bulldogs 27-12. Johnson Co. came calling on September 22, to face the Bulldogs. Both defenses played well with the Bulldogs holding a 9-0 lead at the half. Both teams found the endzone in the second half, with ECI taking the low scoring game, 15-7. Playing their sixth non-region game of the season, the Bulldogs traveled to Jefferson Co. the last weekend in September. ECI spoiled the Warriors' homecoming with a 42-8 win.

The Bulldogs played their first region game of (Continued on page 15)

the season when they traveled to Portal to take on the improved Panthers. ECI couldn't corral the Panthers' elusive quarterback who did everything except sing the national anthem, with a passing TD, rushing TD, scoop and score TD and a punt return for touchdown. The Bulldogs were shut out for the second time last season, as Portal defeated the Bulldogs for the first time since 2011, 40-0. McIntosh Co.

took the long ride to Twin City on October 20. The defense made amends for their performance against the Panthers the week before, holding the Buccaneers to just 55 yards of offense during the game. ECI won their first region game 35-7. The Bulldogs crossed the river to face their neighbors in Millen on October 27. Another group of mistakes had the Bulldogs down 6-0, after ECI ran 23 plays to the Eagles'

just 3 plays. The Eagles pulled away in the game taking the game 28-7. The Bulldogs played their last regular season game at Rountree stadium the next Friday night against Montgomery Co. ECI led 35-0 at halftime and let the younger players take over the rest of the game, winning 42-6. With Portal defeating Jenkins Co. for the region championship, the Bulldogs entered the state playoffs as the num-

ber three seed. The Bulldogs traveled to Lanier Co. in the first round. The Bulldogs took a 28-7 lead against Lanier and looked to have the game in hand. But Lanier turn the game around in the second half scoring 28 points of their own, forcing the game into overtime tied at 35-35. The Bulldogs scored in three plays in overtime, but EP try was no good and only led by six with Lanier having their chance

to tie and go ahead. ECI shut the door against Lanier holding them out of the endzone to take the game 41-35 in overtime. The Bulldogs took the 4-hour drive to Blakely Co. to face Early Co. in the second round of the playoffs. Like the game against Lanier, the Bulldogs jumped out to a halftime lead 21-13. For the second week, the ECI couldn't hold the lead in the second half, losing to the Bobcats 43-34.

Young and experienced Bulldogs

by RON WEATHERFORD Young and experienced may seem a contradiction in terms, but it best describes the 2024 ECI Bulldogs. At times during last season, the Bulldogs had as many as 4-5 freshmen on the offensive side of the ball. You rarely find any freshman starting on the offensive line, they are just not ready to face larger and more experienced senior defensive linemen. But the 2023 team had no choice to put those 3-4 freshman into the fire.

Head football coach, Chris Kearson, had this to say about the upcoming season. "The 2024 ECI Bulldogs will not

look much different on paper than the previous year. The most youthful position on the team was more than likely the offensive line. There were times we had 3-4 freshmen asked to carry the load up front for the Dawgs. Up to 10 freshmen started for the Bulldogs in 2023. While last year's team grew up on the fly, they have hit the ground running in 2024. A great off season in the weight room has helped tremendously in preparation non-region and region foes."

With just five region teams the last couple of seasons, coach Kearson had to scramble to find six non-region games. This season the Bulldogs expand their region to nine teams with another realignment in regions for the next two years, until the GHSA decides to play with the enrollment numbers again. Five teams dropped down to class A division 2 to join the Bulldogs' region this season. Bryan Co., Metter, Claxton, Savannah High School, and Screven Co. join the Bulldogs in region 3 this season. Screven had the numbers to stay in Division one in class A but petitioned the GHSA to drop down to play against the smaller schools. Along with the new additions, the region still

has Jenkins Co., Portal, and McIntosh Co. The Bulldogs lose last season's region opponent, Montgomery Co. who move back over to region four. "With these old and new matchups, the 2024 season has some great region showdowns this season," comment coach Kearson.

Although it's not always proper to single out a single player to watch in team sports, the Bulldog have a player that has garnered some interest in the college ranks after his freshman season. Sophomore running back/defensive back Chase Johnson has been offered by two SEC teams as a tenth grader. Tennessee was the first to show interest and offer a football scholarship. A few days later Auburn matched the Vols offer to the versatile athlete. With three more years left to play, that interest will spread throughout the recruiting circles.

The Bulldogs begin the season in Rochelle, GA on August 16, to play Wilcox Co. Both the Bulldog's state championships went through Wilcox. ECI defeated the Patriots in 2007 in Cordele to win the championship. They beat Wilcox again in Rochelle in the semis, before defeating Dooly to capture their sec-(Continued on page19)

ond-class A crown. The second game of the season has 2023 state runner-up Swainsboro Tigers visiting Rountree Stadium in the home opener on August 23, for their last non-region game. The Tigers lost some key offensive and defensive players, but always field size and speed. The Bulldogs play their second home game of the season and begin region play on September 6, when McIntosh Co. visits Twin City. The Buccaneers were in disarray last season losing players to suspension and injuries before their game against ECI. They will be looking to make amends to their 35-7 loss last season to the Bulldogs. The Bulldogs will cross the river on September 13, to play their


neighborhood bash against Jenkins Co. The Bulldogs will be looking to end the twogame losing streak against the Eagles.

Bryan Co. jumps back on the Bulldog's schedule and region this season. ECI will host the Redskins on September 20. Bryan was 12-2 last season, winning their region 3 in Class A division one with a 4-0 region record.

The Bulldogs will travel to Metter the last weekend in September to face their longest active rivalry. The Bulldogs will be looking to stop the run the Tigers have had them the few seasons. The Bulldogs will host Savannah High School on October 4. The Bluejackets have been hemorrhaging numbers the last few seasons. They moved from AAA in 2021 to

the smallest division in class A division 2 this season. The Bulldogs will travel to 2023 region champions, Portal, the next Friday night and will be looking to make amends for the shellacking the Panthers gave ECI last season. The Bulldogs will play their third Tiger team on October 25 when Claxton visits Rountree for the first time in several years. The Bulldogs visit Sylvania on November first and will try to keep the screeching chicken from making too much noise on the PA system when they face the Gamecocks in the last regular season game. The Bulldogs played their annual scrimmage game on Friday August 9, against Vidalia. Results against the Indians are elsewhere in the sports pages of The Forest Blade.

Great expectations is the title of a Charles Dickens novel. But it is also the words that best describes the outlook for the 2024 Lady Dawg softball season. After a state championship and graduating eight seniors in 2022, region 3 teams were licking their chops to get the Bulldogs off the region pedestal, with only two seniors and a freshman pulling most of the duty in the circle.

The 2023 team shocked the region and state, winning the region championship, returning to the Elite 8 of the state playoffs. "Expect-

ing big things out of this team," commented head coach Frank Wimberly. "We graduated two seniors from the 2023 squad who finished fifth in the state." The Lady Dawgs return the entire infield, which includes five first team all-region players and three first team all-state players.

Returning on the infield are region offensive player of the year and first team all-state shortstop, Jayna Kearson. First team all-region and second team allstate pitcher Mary Katherine Durden returns to the circle. Her battery mate, Dot Rus-

sell, returns behind the plate as first team all-region and second team all-state honors. Rounding out the infield are first team all-region players Lola Walden, and Kayanna Thompson and second team Kinley Grimes. The Dawgs also return second team all-region outfielders Abbey Marsh and Jenna Roberson. Coach Wimberly had the following to say about his returning players. "We return all-state shortstop Jayna Kearson who batted .474 last season with 29 RBI and three home runs. All-state pitcher Mary Katherine Durden will again be our workhorse on

the rubber. MK, a freshman, was the youngest pitcher in Columbus and was the only returning pitcher from Columbus. All-region utility player Kayanna Thompson, pitches, plays infield and outfield, and can do it all! All-region Lola Walden will help hold down the middle of the infield and anchor the middle of the lineup. Seniors Maddie Funderburke, Abbey Marsh and Kinley Grimes have solidified their roles on the field and in the locker room." Wimberly finished up his comments talking about his upcoming freshman players. "We also have a very talented, large group of freshmen moving up that will contribute early to the 2024 squad."

The Lady Dawg have been on the field keeping sharp for the upcoming season with summer ball and hosting the Lady Dawgs Skill camp in June. The season began for the team on August 1, when they hosted Toombs Co. and traveled to Jesup to take on Wayne County on August 3.




