City Council wraps up '24

The December meeting of the Swainsboro City Council and Mayor convened at City Hall on Monday evening, December 2, 2024. Following an invocation and pledge of allegiance, the to change the long-standcity officials once again heard from Mrs. Jacqueline Brantley, a property owner on Green Street, requesting an update on any action regarding a derelict property adjacent to her house. Mayor Bennett advised her to request any update on the continuing problem from City Administrator Middlebrooks. Following this discussion, council considered and approved the minutes of the previous meeting. Under old business, council revisited the issue of term limits for council members which was brought up in an earlier council meeting. City Attorney Levis took the floor to discuss

a rough draft prepared by his office to address the issue. In a detailed explanation, Levis listed the steps and various options that must be taken if council members chose ing terms of city governance dealing with the number of terms that any councilmember or mayor can serve and the resolution of vacancies. Council voted to approve moving forward with the process. A complete presentation of the framework for the changes to be considered by council will be given at a later date. At this point a change to the meeting's agenda allowed for council's consideration and approval of a street closure on Lewis Street near the City Cemetery in connection with the Wreaths Across America program on December 14. (From front page) also allowed for approval of specific acknowledgement of the service of Police Chief Randy Ellison on the occasion of his upcoming retirement. Moving to new business, council voted 5-0 to replace a pump at lift station 11 at a cost of \$17,810 and

replace bar screen parts at the treatment plant at a cost of \$25,077. Council also approved an additional month's lease on a Caterpillar front-end loader being used in the hurricane clean-up efforts. Next, council approved an expenditure to cover the cost of physical

exams for firefighters. Following this, council considered and approved for advertisement, the application of two game room license applications. The information provided on applicant's name and business license address are as follows: Krishi, DBA D &

I Food Mart, 334 West Main Street, Swainsboro and Eric Worthen, DBA Hair Tight Games, 229 South Main Street, Swainsboro. The final issue under new business was the consideration of an application for a Workforce Housing Grant. Council heard information

concerning a grant for program assistance in the development of new residential housing described as middle-income home construction funded in a public/private joint venture. Council approved a motion to move ahead with the pre-application steps

in participating in the program. At this point, council voted to move into Executive Session. According to City Administrator Herman Middlebrooks, Clearwater Solutions was awarded a 5-year contract, following discussion in Executive Session.



Editorials Columns _____ Inflation hits North Pole!


Are you ready? I mean really ready? Because as Trooper Terry used to say, "Hey Kids, you better come running" cause its time! Yep, only 20 more shopping days to the big day. Time to get it together and charge ahead into Christmas, and the operative word here is CHARGE! Let's review for a moment: we have Venmo, MasterCard, American Express, Visa, PayPal, Bitcoin, and I am sure Elon will soon invent his own currency, and then there's the "what's in your wallet" lady. So, with all of these encouragements to buy more and more, the business of borrowing money to finance Christmas-giving has

gotten bigger than Santa Claus himself. This year's estimate of the amount the average American will spend on "good tidings to all" comes in at a chart-topping, all-time record of \$1,012 per person. If you do the math, figuring there are a minimum of 3 Christmas shoppers per household, that comes to \$387,572,000,000 spent on Christmas. But that's not even close to the actual figure for last year which was a few billion over a trillion dollars. Mrs. Alpha Flanders was the manager and taught her young employees the art of salesmanship. She told us that we should be considerate of customers even if they were just looking. One of the early morning assignments for Annette and I was to fill the candy case. There were bins of different candies and a bin of mixed nuts. As we filled, there

was much temptation to test a piece. The mixed nuts were most tempting especially the large Brazil nuts. We felt it our responsibility to taste all of the nuts. I doubt that anyone who bought nuts on Saturday ever received a Brazil nut in their bag. A new attraction bought more shoppers into the store when an aquarium of goldfish was placed in front of the store. They could purchase fish, a bowl, and fish food. The fish were caught in a little net and placed in a Shirley Proctor Twiss

cardboard box filled with water from the tank, and new owner went home with new pets. We had a short break for supper, so of course we had a Lucille Lewis hamburger and bottle of coke. The highlight of the workday was when store was closed at nine o'clock, and we received our pay. All



salespeople gathered in the lighted back of store. Mrs. Flanders gave out pay envelopes to full time staff. Then she counted out three one-dollar bills to Annette and I. We felt rich for a week. I was a homely looking kid. Stringy, dishwater blond hair, fair skin with freckles, a crooked front tooth and pleasingly plump, as Bigmother used to say. The shy boy was something else though. I was smitten! This shy boy in his overalls with long johns peeping out of the bottom of his trousers and a half smile turned up one side of his face was about the best-looking boy I had ever seen! Al and Martha Jane, Jimmy and Shirley, Buck and Bunny were among our friends who gathered together to play bridge and/or cook fish together. All of us "growing up" with our children. Fannin County Sheriff's Department ham-handed in dealings with local mother

It seems as though my mother was a criminal and I am just now finding out about it. All this time, I thought she was a conscientious parent who fixed my school lunch, washed and ironed my clothes, made sure I went to church and was active in the PTA. Little did I know.

I haven't been to College Park in a number of years, but I am guessing that from our house to the drug store was at least a mile and I probably added another mile or so touring the town. Where was my mother? At work, operating a switchboard (look it up) at an insurance company. I didn't see the need to bother her for approval of my ice

cream excursions. Fortunately, that was a long time ago and was in College Park. Were it today and in Fannin County, Momma would be in a heap of trouble. Just ask Brittany Patterson. Her son, Soren, 10, unbeknownst to her, was walking toward the little town of Mineral Bluff, less than a mile from their house when he was spotted by a passerby who followed him, interrogated him and decided to call the police.

I have a great respect for law enforcement and rush to their defense whenever I hear yammers of police brutality and defunding the police. However, in this case, there is no way I will give the Fannin Sheriff's County Department a pass on their ham-handed dealing of the situation. Instead of what should have been a simple, "Please tell Soren to let you know


