You can see the colorful outside of Dr. Burn's Dentistry office. Next door was Nokomis Variety Shop where you could buy lots of different items.




What was here in 1936?



This is Faith Lutheran Church. Eventually the church was changed over to the American Legion Post 99 that it is today.




