Marshfield Clinic Health System announces job cuts

MARSHFIELD -- Marshfield Clinic Health System March 1 announced a reduction in staff that will impact 346 employees among the organization's more than 12,000 employee workforce in Wisconsin. The decision comes against the backdrop of a health care industry challenged by skyrocketing labor costs, higher supply expenses and reduction in reimbursements, according to a press release.

"We are not immune to the immense pressure and unprecedented challenges gripping the health care industry in recent years, which has required us to identify ways to be more efficient and more resourceful," said Dr. Susan Turney, CEO Marshfield Clinic Health System. "Reducing staff is always painful. This is ultimately about preserving the long-term efficiency and sustainability of our organization," Turney added. "We are committed to supporting all affected employees with resources and services to aide them in their transition, including assistance searching for other roles within the Health

The total number of employees affected represents less than three percent of the Health System's employee base. Additionally the Health System eliminated more than 500 positions that have been unfilled and no longer recruited, which has allowed the Health System to lessen the impact on employees, the press release also stated.

Parts of MHS would see first-ever upgrades

MARSHFIELD - As our series on the Marshfield School District's proposed \$99.5 million referendum and facilities improvement plan continues, we take a closer look in this edition at the athletic and operational building system improvements planned for Marshfield High School.

The proposed improvements were identified by the district's Community-Based Facility Planning Committee, a group of school officials and residents who have been working since May

2022 to create a new, longrange facility plan for the district.

The fieldhouse wing of the MHS campus would see significant changes under the proposed plan.

"When you look at our current footprint – the 1968 footprint - we had a singlegender sport, and we didn't have all the offerings that we do now, even in that single-gender sport," said Athletic Director Nathan Delaney, during a recent program Hub City Times produced, in conjunction Marshfield with Broadcasting. of the other sports that are indoors, particularly gymnastics and swimming, it kind of puts stress on a facility that was built 55 years ago."

The proposal includes an expanded swimming deck space along the east side of the pool. "To watch a swim meet right now you have to watch it from the fieldhouse," Delaney points out. "That creates its own set of safety and logistical issues. Not necessarily a great viewing environment for our spectators."

There's also a plan to add a new fitness and weight room facility onto the south of the fieldhouse,

expanded and renovated boys' and girls' locker rooms along the east side and new bleachers, which would replace the original, wooden ones installed 55 years ago.

Terry Frankland, member of the Facility Planning Committee identified which district's needs, said the improvement plan should be looked at as more than just new or better facilities for students, parents and the Marshfield community.

"Being a former businessman in Marshfield, we have to be aware it's a marketing tool," Frankland said. "Families moving to this community, with Highway 10 being fourlane to Stevens Point, and basically four-lane now to Wausau, people say, 'Well, I'm going to work for a facility in Marshfield, but...this high school has more to offer than our high school, and they're more updated.' We need to be aware of that," he adds. "It's a big marketing tool to have state-of-the-art equipment."

Superintendent Dr. Ryan Christianson is quick to point out the proposed improvements in athletic spaces at MHS are not geared toward just sports programs.

Outside in: Clubhaus brings indoor golf to Marshfield

Marshfield golf enthusiasts now have a place they can enjoy their sport – and work on their game - year-round.

The Clubhaus opened recently at 1213 S. Central Ave, complete with four golf simulators, a full bar, refreshments, and a few small dining tables. The owners are Richard Reis, his two brothers Michael Stiemke-Reis and Johnny Tomke, and their friend Cale Bauer.

"We're all golfers," says Richard Reis. "I've been golfing the longest among the group. I've been playing my whole life. I love it. I'm an everyday player," he adds. "Those other guys used to play a lot of softball. When COVID hit it ended softball, and so they had to pick up a new sport. They all bought new clubs and started going to the course on a regular basis," Reis recalls. "And we started driving up to Wausau to play at 4 Seasons in the winter. And we said, 'Marshfield could really use this.' We kind of felt also like Marshfield could use a little bit more activities, more options for folks, something to do that's not going to the

movies or the roller-skating rink," Reis added. "So we drove up to Wausau a few times and played up there and loved it, and we knew that we could bring it here. We knew a lot of other friends and golfers that drove up to Wausau or over to Appleton to play. And so we kind of felt like we could build something that would be good for the young adult population, good for older guys who've been playing golf their whole life, and good for families."

Reis says the simulators are set up for regular rounds of golf, driving and practice ranges, mini golf and putt-putt games for the



Marshfield residents wanting more information about the city's upcoming public safety referendum can get it at two upcoming forums.

On April 4, voters in the city of Marshfield will consider increased property tax funding to support hiring and retaining nine full-time firefighters/paramedics, one full-time police officer, one full-time Police Department records specialist, and one full-time administrative assistant to be split between the Police and Fire departments.

Residents will be asked whether they support an increase in the city's tax levy by a total of 7.124 percent, which would result in an overall tax levy of \$16,992,899, and – on an ongoing basis – would include the increase of \$1,130,000 for each fiscal year going forward.

According to city officials, current public safety funding and staffing

levels are insufficient to meet the community's current and projected future needs. In 2022, the Marshfield Fire and Rescue Department could not fill three open firefighter/ paramedic positions due to budget constraints, despite it being the busiest year on record. Over the past decade, Marshfield Fire and Rescue's staffing levels have remained stagnant - even though calls for service have increased by 55 percent. In 2022, crews responded to a record 4,074 calls for service. Current staffing levels have made it difficult for the department to respond to calls for service, as 25 percent of according to a city press release.

"We are at a critical juncture to determine the level of fire and EMS services we want in our community," said City of Marshfield Fire Chief Pete Fletty.

At the Police Department, recent budget cuts have prevented them from finding replacements for recently-vacated positions,

resulting in a strain on the department to maintain the same level of service, a press release states. With fewer officers available, the department has a decreased capacity to carry out nonemergency department duties, such as proactive patrolling and participation in community engagement events.

These challenges are not unique to Marshfield, but reflect a broader trend across the state, as police and fire/EMS departments struggle to meet the growing needs of communities.

"While our departments have risen to meet the needs of our community by working smarter, creating efficiencies, collaborating with stakeholders, and prioritizing what types of service we can provide, it has become increasingly difficult to provide services as expected," said City Administrator Steve Barg.

If the referendum is approved, the city's annual property tax would

MARSHFIELD - North Wood County Toys for Tots Coordinator Margie Schmidt says her chapter collected over 3,600 toys from 38 locations in Marshfield and three collection points in Clark County, as part of the 2022 campaign.

"We served 902 children. which was up from last year," Schmidt told us Feb. 2. She expected that number to go up once final figures came in. The Toys for Tots website is now reporting 921 children were supported through the 2022 campaign. The organization serves children from birth to age

"Besides the toys that we collected, we also received donations from different fundraisers and different organizations in town, and we were able to shop with their money and buy toys with that money as well," said Schmidt.

The local toy collection effort ran from Nov. 1 through Dec. 6 of last year. The annual toy distribution event was held Dec. 8-13 in the youth building at Marshfield Fairgrounds Park.

"The parents come there

out toys for their child," said Schmidt. "How many toys they get is always based on how many toys we receive, and we kind of base it on that every year," she added. "So, this year they were able to get three toys per child, plus we do a family game and we do... they get a craft item. As long as we have enough craft items, we give them each a craft item. And they get stocking stuffers as well for each child."

Schmidt says when parents or guardians get to the toy distribution site they have to fill out application before an they are allowed to go through the room. They accompanied volunteers as they "shop" for their kids. There is no prerequisite to qualify for the program.

"We take their word for it

Margie says. "We do not make them prove income. Some of them are referred to us by different programs in town or different schools in town, so some of them do get referred to us. We don't turn anybody away basically. If they feel they need help we give them

Schmidt said she had less than 200 toys left at the end of the campaign. "We serviced north Wood County and parts of Clark County.'

Last year was Margie's tenth year serving as the local Toys for Tots coordinator.

"The reward of doing it," Schmidt said, when asked what keeps her going.

much more expansive than it was years ago. And, with a growing emphasis on fitness-based, lifelong physical activity, learning and development, we're doing some very innovative things already with our P.E. curriculum, and we could do even more with a fitness center like we're proposing to build," Christianson adds. "We have a lot of kids who are not in any of our athletic programs that are very heavily focused on physical fitness and improving the body and mind collectively."

The portion of the base plan covering Marshfield High School also calls for replacement of the fieldhouse flooring, scoreboards and lighting.

Plans also call for major upgrades to the operational parts of the building within the walls and floors of the facility.

"We have approximately 27,000 square feet of mechanical room space at Marshfield High School, much of which is in the lower-level basement area of the building," Christianson says. "That is a significant component of the work that is planned for the high school with this facility referendum, is to replace heating, ventilation, airconditioning systems that are coming up on 55 years of age," he adds. "A cooling tower for the airconditioning system alone that is under constant repair, and really is past its life expectancy and needs to be replaced.'

"It's actually a miracle this

is still running," says current School Board Vice-President Dan Neve, who spent nearly four decades working in the construction and building trades industries. "We have to realize that the high school, or all of our schools, are not a home. They're a commercial space, industrial space, that runs on big systems,' Neve adds. "And these systems have been there for 55-plus years. And it's actually amazing to me that we still have been able to keep them running. If we don't address the inner workings, we're going to have problems."

Regardless of whether the referendum passes, Neve says many of the operational aspects of MHS will need replacing sooner than later, and those are parts you simply cannot get shipped overnight, next week or even next month.

"MCCs (mechanical control centers) have a nine-month to a year waiting list right now," Neve says. "So, if we had a failure with one of these the school could be shut down for a year's time waiting for equipment. We've been lucky that we haven't had a failure."

Christianson says it would be at least that long before any work would start at the high school, should the referendum be successful.

"Given the size of the work that needs to be done at the high school, we're talking about a minimum construction 15-month schedule period," Christianson says. "We'd also like the public to understand that, if this referendum is passed in before we're breaking ground and starting the construction work itself because we need to go through the fine-detailed design of the work, a construction schedule needs to be put in place, we need to go to bid and order the type of equipment and material that Dan is referring to," Christianson points out. "So, that's another component to planning. This is going to take a while."

Christianson says other planned improvements at the high school fall under the category of energy efficiency, by replacing ceiling fixtures and aging windows and upgrading lighting to energy-efficient LEDs.

District officials will hold a community informational meeting the proposed improvements on Monday, March 20 at 6 p.m. in the Marshfield High School library, with an optional building tour to follow. The district also has information related to the referendum on its website at www.marshfieldschools. org/referendum.



Local business warns against latest scam

MARSHFIELD -- A local company is warning you to be on the lookout for "Toner Pirates."

This scam has targeted organizations that have used copiers and printers for years, but Bauernfeind Business Technologies (BBT) has recently learned the scammers are now targeting those using postage meters, as well.

There are several variations of this scheme. Sometimes, the crooks will call an unsuspecting office person claiming to be the victim's print services provider - and they might even know the name of the legitimate provider and the type of copier/printer or postage machine they're using. They try to get permission to send toner or ink to the customer. Those supplies will be sent with payment expected upon delivery. Sometimes, they won't even call; they'll just brazenly send out the toner or ink and demand payment. Their invoices look legitimate and sometimes offer special pricing for quick, electronic payment.

If you are a customer of BBT or other reputable office technology providers, do not fall for this scheme. If your devices are under an all-inclusive service contract, you should not have to pay for supplies. Bauernfeind will never call demanding you purchase ink or toner. If you receive an invoice from an unknown company for toner or ink, assume it is a scam and do not pay. If you receive a cash-on-delivery (COD) shipment of supplies, simply refuse the shipment.

Here are some good tips to help identify a scam:

The company name is not familiar. The offer seems too good to be true.

The caller cannot identify your machine's make, model or BBT-issued tag number.

The company refuses to provide contact information. The caller seems pushy, warning that you have to act fast for the best deal.

The caller seems evasive when asked simple questions. The caller refuses to provide references or an official



Marshfield 150 for 150: Thom Gerretsen

NOMINATED BY PAT STERNITZKY AND MIKE WARREN

Thom Gerretsen is to Marshfield what Walter Cronkite was for the country - a longtime trusted voice that the public turned to when they wanted to hear about the news of the day and how it impacted them and their families personally.

For more than 21 years, central Wisconsin radio listeners would tune in to 1450 AM to get the latest news and information from the WDLB newsroom, in which Thom served as a reporter, then news director, from 1978 through 1999. He was also the producer of Marshfield's only local radio talk show, Insight, where he would interview guests and take calls from area residents about issues and topics they cared about.

Under Thom's direction, WDLB (along with its sister stations WLJY and WOSQ) was always the go-to source for everything from local election coverage to an interview with the student who just won the school district spelling bee. Thom and his reporters covered every city council meeting and other events in the area to make sure the audience was kept informed about all the happenings in local government, as well as area civic organizations and the local school board. State and national lawmakers couldn't pass through Marshfield without being noticed either. And if you were a criminal, Thom made sure his audience knew what mischief you had been up to as well. His professional mission was to provide more local news to the community than any other station in the surrounding markets.

A native of Fox Lake, IL, Thom attended college at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, where he got involved in the campus radio station covering news events. He worked in local radio in Janesville and Portage before coming to Marshfield to join the Goetz Broadcasting Corporation and has remained part of the community ever since.



In addition to his local news department obligations, Thom was very active in the company's statewide radio networks. This included providing news copy and sound bites that were shared with scores of other Wisconsin radio stations to be used in their own newscasts. He also had a passion for sports and would cover Wisconsin Badgers, Milwaukee Bucks, Milwaukee Brewers and Green Bay Packers games for the network. This part of his job provided him with the rare honor of personally covering the Packers' Super Bowl appearances in 1997 and 1998.

This hall-of-fame broadcaster has interviewed many of the nation's top dignitaries while covering events around the state, including Ronald Reagan, George H. W. Bush, Al Gore, Hillary Clinton and Henry Kissinger, along with every governor and U.S. Senator from Wisconsin since the 1970s. While covering sports, he has interviewed Michael Jordan, Brett Favre, Reggie White, Leroy Butler,

Paul Molitor and Robin Yount, just to name a few of the biggies. And he had the opportunity to cover appearances from celebrities ranging from Paul Harvey to Alex Trebek.

After his long career working in radio, Thom tried his hand at print journalism. In May 1999, he accepted a position as regional reporter for the Marshfield News-Herald. His experience and contacts elevated him quickly to become managing editor of the daily publication in just over a year. This lasted until 2002, when he was recruited by his former broadcast colleagues to take on the role of chief editor of Wheeler News Service, which is the state's largest and most popular news wire service used by many radio stations across Wisconsin for statewide news and sports content.

Although Gerretsen retired from journalism in November 2017, someone with his passion and energy couldn't totally stay away from the public spotlight. He's made appearances on local radio and in newspaper columns over the years to bring perspective when local community leaders pass away or when a major issue of the past re-emerges in the headlines. He's also become active on social media and uses the platform to share his expertise and experiences within the community.

Thom continues to be involved with the community as a member of Kiwanis Club of Marshfield, Central Leadership Chamber Chorale, Marshfield Alumni, and Faith Lutheran Church. He is also a regular contributing writer for Hub City Times. And occasionally, you'll hear Thom's voice come out of retirement to provide color commentary on radio broadcasts of local high school football games.

In 2021, Gerretsen was inducted into the Wisconsin Broadcasters Association's Hall of Fame for his many years of service to the profession of news and sports journalism, all while doing his part to put Marshfield on the map.

The Health System is also engaging its community partners in regions with affected staff, including working with local groups and identifying employers with potential employment opportunities.

'It's like family': Bonspiel continues legacy of curling

MARSHFIELD -- The party was over and time to think about what went well, what didn't and to

reminisce. Like a family reunion, it was getting your game on, creating memories, having fun and thinking about whether to do it all over again next year. But in this case, this "family" event is

the Lobstein Bonspiel. For 19 years, Marshfield Curling Club has hosted mixed curling tournament which has brought hundreds of people to Marshfield over the years.

"Comments from returning teams have included that 'it feels like coming home to family," said Planning Committee member Pam Schmidt of Marshfield.

"There are a lot of memories here through this spiel," said Pam's spouse Steve Schmidt. The Schmidts have chaired the planning committee all 19 years, joined by their daughter, Andrea Schmidt Nelson, each of those years.

"We have Uneekor simulators that run all the processing that reads the ball flight, shoots through the computer, up through the projector and right on the screen," Reis says. "So, the feedback is almost instantaneous. You hit it. You look at the screen and you see your ball move."

"It's great," said Chris Miller, Marshfield, after a March 5 round of golf. "First time I've ever shot on a simulator, and it holds pretty true to my game thus far," he added. "You have to play it like a real course, use the correct clubs for the distance that you're at, hit it true, and so far so good. I'm enjoying it. There's 14 inches of snow outside yet and we're here in downtown Marshfield golfing. It's a lot of fun. And you don't lose any balls," Miller added with a smile.

Miller was joined by Mike Gillette and Mark Johnson, both of Marshfield.

"I think it's really good because if you haven't swung a club all winter, you can get in here and get back into it," Gillette added. "You have to make good shots," Gillette said of the simulated game. "You pay the price if you make a bad shot, just like on a course." Gillette added the simulator is pretty close to the real thing. "The distance I don't think is. Plus you can't really read the slope. But, it's as close as you can get to real golf."

"I really love it," Johnson added. "It's a place to go before the courses open up," he said. "And as far as my game goes, it's really pretty accurate. You need to play a few rounds to get used to the simulator,

but, I mean, my slice is there when I hit a slice. When I hit it fat or hit it thin, it shows up that way. I'm hooked," said Johnson.

We found the trio playing the Bighorn Canyons Golf Course on a leisurely Sunday afternoon.

"They're high quality, and they're accurate enough to give high-quality launch and trajectory data, spin data, club face data, for the low handicappers, the guys who are really serious about golf who really are paying attention to that," Reis said of the simulators. "Then it goes all the way down to mini golf and putt-putt," he added.

"We've thought about it," Reis said, when asked about potential expansion in the future. "We have access to most of the building," he said. "The front we lease out to Rural Mutual (Insurance Company),

so they'll be in there, but there's a fair amount of space right on the other side of the wall here where we could absolutely push it down and throw one to two more bays in there. I've already thought about it a lot. I thought about it before we even opened."

The Clubhaus is a side hustle for the four co-owners. Of the four, Tomke will spend most of his time there. The others have full-time jobs elsewhere.

"We can staff the whole thing without having to hire," Reis said.

The Clubhaus is currently open 9-9 Sundays through Thursdays, and 9 a.m.-10 p.m. Fridays and Saturdays. They have also launched a spring tune-up league, complete with 24 two-person teams. Reis says more league options will be forthcoming.

time and the person who was coordinating Marshfield's Toys for Tots campaign was stepping down, so my sister referred me as a possible candidate to take over."

Schmidt has a solid group of 18-20 volunteers helping her out every year.

"I definitely can't do it myself. I have a gentleman and my husband who go and pick all the toys up on toy pick-up day. They take a trailer. They pick up all the toys for us, which is a huge help."

Schmidt also says her volunteers help count the toys each year, which is a huge undertaking.

"For the Toys for Tots program any toys we take in we have to count," Schmidt says. "I have to then report that number to the national foundation. There's a lot of paperwork involved in this after the year is done. We have to report to the Toys for Tots Foundation how many toys we collected, how many books we collected, how many stocking stuffers we collect, so we have to sort everything in those categories. We have to report it to them that way, then we have to report how many kids we helped, how many volunteers we had. I have to keep track of all of that. We have our paperwork that has to be done by Jan. 15."

Nationally, there were 833 Toys for Tots campaigns in 2022, with over 41,000

volunteers across country, which collected 14 million toys and books and assisted over nine million children, both more than the previous year.

"The stories that we get and the thanks that we get, the tears that we get...I mean, every year we have somebody that comes in and makes us cry because of why they're there or just their gratefulness," Schmidt says. "It always brings tears to our eyes. Some people come in and share their story while they're walking through the toy room and some people don't. It doesn't matter either way to us. If they want to share why they need it, they share why they

need it.'

"When you're walking through with that parent as a volunteer, and they spot that toy that their kid has been asking for for the last month, you can see it in their face. You can always see it. That right there is the reason I still do this."

Schmidt is always looking for monetary donations, Auburndale too. The FFA's Pumpkin Glow and Sunflower patch donate funds each year. Margie also tries to host a roller-skating fundraiser each summer at Melody Gardens Skateland.




