

Marshfield native to help lead Twin Cities theatre

AND MARSHFIELD MINNEAPOLIS, MN - Jill (Mauritz) Anderson is coming home. Well, sort of.

The Marshfield native recently named as the new Managing Director of the Children's Theatre Company (CTC) Minneapolis, MN. in Anderson will assume the post on July 22, and succeeds Kimberly Motes, who departed in October 2023 to become Executive Director of Chicago Shakespeare Theatre.

"I am thrilled to join the staff, board, and artists of Children's Theatre Company, and to partner with Rick Dildine in leading this remarkable organization," said Anderson via a press release. "I've long held CTC in the utmost regard, and am humbled by the opportunity to return to a

theatre where I first worked more than 20 years ago – to build upon CTC's strong foundation with such a dedicated and talented team."

After touring for one year with a Lutheran youth ministry and music team, the 1996 Marshfield High School graduate returned home to start college at the two-year state center here, where the Spanish major began to cut her theatre

"Just kind of kept wandering back over to the theatre building, where I had spent time as a young person, and really just refound that home there and it didn't take long before I wasn't a Spanish major anymore," Anderson told Hub City Times earlier this month.

After two years of college in Marshfield, Anderson transferred

community I love - and a University of Minnesota, where she quickly learned the pecking order was long and crowded.

"I found, as a transfer student in a department as... theatre departments can be pretty tight-knit, and folks were welcoming, but they had sort of put a gameplan in place for all of their stage management students the year before for who would have which shows and opportunities. I found that a little bit challenging instead seeking work out in the community. Before long, I was scheduling my classes around my outside work in professional theaters."

"Before long, I was offered my equity card as a stage manager for a theater called Mixed Blood Theatre Company, and I left school without a degree with a semester to go," she said. "I eventually did finish getting a degree through the University of Connecticut while I was working out there."

Since 2016, Anderson has served as Managing Director of Syracuse Stage, where she has been responsible for an \$8 million operating budget and has had oversight of fundraising. marketing.

and operational matters within the organization. Under Anderson's leadership, Svracuse Stage has achieved operating surpluses consecutive in seven years, maintained full employment throughout the COVID pandemic, and has seen two of its world premiere productions open on Broadway.

The company has also launched major expansions community engagement and educational programming and was recognized with the Onondaga Historical Association's Medal and Interfaith Works' Racial Justice Award.

"Jill is one of the most distinguished executives in the American theatre," says incoming Artistic Director Rick Dildine, "and I am delighted that she will be joining me this summer to embark on a new adventure

Children's Theatre Company. I look forward to working closely with Jill as we collaborate with the amazing board and staff to build a vibrant future for CTC."

Prior to joining Syracuse Stage, Anderson spent a decade as general manager at the Eugene O'Neill Theater Center in Waterford, CT. During her tenure, the O'Neill completed a \$7 million capital campaign and campus expansion, doubled its operating budget, and was honored with the National Medal of Arts and a Regional Theatre Tony Award. Under the O'Neill's aegis, Anderson also developed the Baltic Playwrights Conference, an annual international new play development retreat held in Hiiumaa, Estonia.

Previously, Anderson spent five years in the production office Washington, D.C.'s Arena working Stage, after as a stage manager in Minnesota, New Mexico, and Massachusetts. In addition, Anderson is an instructor in the theater management program of the Syracuse University Department of Drama, building on her work with high school and college students elsewhere. including at the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival.

"In Marshfield, careers like the one I have gone on to have never seemed ridiculously out of the question," Anderson told us during our recent conversation. "And why is that? It's because of that

Friends of Powers Bluff honoring Earth Day

In honor of Earth Day the Friends of Powers Bluff are announcing some major changes to Powers Bluff County Park near Arpin. Nature trails will be improved, with signage and trail improvements, particularly to reroute wet areas toward the bottom of the hill, and trail areas that are subject to erosion.

The 1.5-mile nature trail is in the 70-acre Designated State Natural Area, and the south 80-acre section of the park is listed on the State and National Register of Historic Places as a Native American Cultural Sensitivity area with preserved Native American dance rings and burial grounds.

The historic signage of Powers Bluff (Skunk Hill) is being redone and improved to reflect the longtime presence of previous generations before European contact. Rob Harper, UW-Stevens Point Professor of History and International Studies, is coordinating the signs' content with Historic Officers from Prairie Band Potawatomi, Forest Band Potawatomi and Ho-Chunk Nations. Care is being taken to ensure that the new signs will be both historically accurate and culturally sensitive, and they will include historic photographs.

On the newly added area of the park, six miles of mountain bike (single track) trails and three miles of multi-use trails have been added. The new property consists of 223 adjacent acres to the north of the original park. The mountain bike trails are designed for a variety of skill levels of riders. Signs have been ordered to designate skill levels and trail intersections. Volunteers from the Friends organization will install the signs this

A trail-head shelter is being added on the new property. County workers are also completing a new road and parking lot to access the new shelter. Access to the new road will be off County Road N, one-half mile west of

Prairie and pollinator areas will be established in the new portion of the park, initially on the sides of the new multi-purpose trails. Volunteers with the Friends of Powers Bluff are also working to eradicate invasive



Families encouraged to participate in drug take back event

WOOD COUNTY -- On Saturday, April 27, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and Wisconsin Department of Justice are sponsoring a prescription drug take back event throughout Wisconsin. Take back events provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of medications. Remember to never flush or drain unused/ expired prescription medications. These substances can contaminate our water supply if not disposed of properly. Parents/guardians, grandparents, and other adults who spend time with youth are especially encouraged to participate in an effort to prevent prescription drugs from being taken and misused.

Local law enforcement, in collaboration with IMPACT Wood County and Marshfield Area Coalition for Youth (MACY), is participating in events on Saturday, April 27, at the following Wood County locations:

- Marshfield City Hall (10 a.m.-2 p.m.)
- Pittsville Police Department (9 a.m.-noon)

Bring: Capsules, creams, inhalers, non-aerosol sprays, ointments, pills, patches, vials, liquids (in original containers), pet medications, vape pens or other e-cigarette devices with batteries removed.

Do not bring: Aerosol cans, anything containing blood or a bodily fluid, household hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas), illegal drugs, iodine containing medications, mercury thermometers, personal care products (shampoo, soaps, lotions, sunscreens, etc.), sharps* (i.e. syringes, lancets, needles are accepted only at the Marshfield event), or vape devices containing built-in batteries that cannot be removed.

Those who cannot attend a take back event can drop off unwanted medications at a Wood County law enforcement agency or at pharmacies with a disposal kiosk: CVS in Wisconsin Rapids, Marshfield Clinic Pharmacy (main clinic and Central Avenue), and Walgreens in Wisconsin Rapids. Remember to store any medications you are taking in a secure location.

WOOD COUNTY - A Pittsville High School junior was killed when her car slammed into a tree. The crash occurred around 2:30 p.m. on April 13 on Highway 80 near the intersection of Highway 54 in the Township of Dexter.

According to the Wood County Sheriff's Department, Deputies arrived on scene and found the vehicle engulfed in flames. Deputies attempted fire suppression on the vehicle. A short time later units from the Pittsville Fire Department arrived on scene and successfully extinguished the fire.



Michaelis returns as MHS girls' basketball coach

Marshfield High School is bringing back a familiar face as the school's next Tigers girls' basketball coach. Heidi Michaelis is returning after a six-year absence.

Michaelis will return to where her coaching career began. During her first seventeen seasons in Marshfield from 2001-2018, Michaelis became the winningest girls' basketball coach in program history, amassing 305 wins. 20-win seasons, Wisconsin Valley eight Conference championships, 11 sectional appearances, and four WIAA Div. 1 State Tournament appearances.

players' commitment to the program, each other, and being a true student-athlete for her previous success as

"T believe the relationships I can build with student athletes is the biggest predictor of success. Showing student athletes you care about them as individuals allows

trust to be built, and from there, I always believed that great things could happen," said Michaelis via a press release. "Winning comes with hard work and hard work is easy if students trust you. Winning and losing with class is so important and being able to carry yourself in a manner that represents this school district, community, and families is imperative.

As she steps back into the gym, Michaelis expresses her enthusiasm for the opportunity to inspire and mentor young athletes, instilling in them the values of sportsmanship, perseverance. and teamwork to be successful on and off the court.

Michaelis replaces Taylor Varsho, who played for Heidi from 2008 to 2012. Varsho left the Tiger program as its all-time leading scorer with 1,364 points. Under Michaelis, Varsho averaged a teamhigh 18.1 points per game and 3.9 rebounds and 2.2 assists per contest as a senior, was named all-state her sophomore, junior and senior seasons, was named Wisconsin Valley Conference Player of the Year in 2010-11 and 2011-12. was voted team MVP her iunior and senior seasons. and was voted team captain in 2010-11 and 2011-12.

Varsho became Tigers' head coach in 2018, and compiled a record of 82-58 in six seasons, winning 20 games in 2023-24.





arts legacy in our community, and for me in particular it was Greg Rindfleisch and Jack Bittrich, but [also] Kathy Biederwolf, Denny Kramer, and the point they always made - and I think especially Rindfleisch - of staying in contact with those who've gone before us, having them come back and do things. There were always people from Marshfield who were doing it, so it hasn't seemed far-fetched."

"After an extensive international search process, I couldn't be more thrilled to welcome Jill Anderson to CTC as Managing Director," says Board Chair Silvia Perez. "I really go back to Marshfield and that handful of really dedicated arts educators and arts leaders in that town," Anderson told Hub City Times. "Where I would have thought that, especially early on, my resume might not have put me in some of those rooms, my exposure to really sort of doing it all with the folks I mentioned earlier made me a good candidate. It certainly taught me skills can be acquired. Who do you want to be in the room with? So, to have a generic set of tools which I've honed over the years has given me these opportunities."

Children's Theatre Company (CTC) is the nation's largest theatre for young people and serves a multigenerational audience. "I didn't necessarily know it would happen now. A great professional opportunity, a company I've admired for so long and a community I've loved and in the back of my mind sort of always imagined returning to, plus the proximity to family, it's a pretty enticing combination."

Whether it was going to be Minneapolis or someplace else. Anderson told us she's known she was theatre-bound since a moment one evening in the sound-and-light booth at the back of the Helen Connor Laird Fine & Performing Arts Theatre at what was then UW-Marshfield/Wood County.

"To me, a key moment was whining in the light booth to Greg (Rindfleisch) while running an orchestra concert," she recalled. "And really knowing how much

I loved being in that side of the campus, I certainly knew I did not want to be a performer. And Greg so clearly just said, 'Well, of course, you're a stage manager.' I didn't feel like I knew what a stage manager really was, so I checked out a couple of library books, and it's like, 'Oh, I can be making lists and charts and wear the headset and be part of everything, but I'm not on stage? This might be optimal.' And once he sort of named that, it turned out to be so right," said Anderson.

Jill Mauritz the MHS student also recalls an experience in her junior English class, taught by the now-retired Bill Zuiker.

"And we had to do a research paper, and even before I knew this really happened, my research topic was non-performance careers in theatre, and my big go-to source was Dean Gray, who had been talked up by Bittrich, by Rindfleisch as one of these Marshfield people making a go of it," Jill remembered. "And I sat with Dean at Perkins with my tape recorder. Having access to folks like that really just showed




