"The people that do wineries are very good at networking," Karmin told us, during our May 17 visit to The Empty Nest Winery. "We spent a lot of time in peoples' back rooms. We went to The Lil' Ole Winemaker in Wausau and we watched a video and he showed us how to make

Gov. Evers wraps up annual 'Pothole Patrol' tour in Marshfield

MARSHFIELD -- Gov. Tony Evers used a May 13 visit to Marshfield to wrap up his annual statewide "Pothole Patrol" tour to help fix Wisconsin's roads.

"Good to be here and fixin' the darn roads," Evers told Hub City Times, as we spoke on South Cedar Ave. between Fourth and Fifth streets.

Evers also used the stop to discuss his administration's investments to improve local roads and highways across the state.

"In the last go-around with the legislature, we got shared revenue increased and also an extra hundred-million dollars in local road funds," said Evers. "So, we care about this. Everybody does. It's safety issues and it's economic issues for our state."

Last July, Gov. Evers signed a budget that provided significant investments in improving

the state's roads and infrastructure, including \$550 million to fund transportation projects underway or under development, \$100 million for the Local Road Improvement Program, and \$150 million for the newlycreated Agricultural Road Improvement Program.

"Farmers have lots of equipment and they have to be able to be on the roads instead of having to detour thirty miles in order to get from one field to the other, so that will play a huge role, too," Evers told us.

Historic investments in Wisconsin's transportation infrastructure have led to the improvement of over 7,400 miles of roads and nearly 1,780 bridges since 2019, including more than 900 miles of road and more than 200 bridges last year alone.

"And the other thing I'm talking about this year too is that this last year ten people that work on the highways and these roads

were killed," Evers added.
"Whether it's a small
municipality or a township
or a city, or you're out on
the super highway, they
always block off the roads

and have lights and all that. To think that ten people didn't go home, that's just wrong."

joined in Marshfield by representatives from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation and local public works officials, including the city's publicworks director, Tom Turchi.

"We have about fourmillion dollars worth of street work going on this summer, with East 14th Street being one of the bigger total reconstruction projects. That's from Maple Avenue to Vine Avenue,' Turchi told Hub City Times, prior to the governor's arrival. "And then we're working on Lincoln Avenue from 14th Street down to Airport Road to the south, as well as many other mill and overlay projects this year. We are also going to complete the Adler Road trail project from Sycamore Street to Weber Park this year. And we have a new subdivision coming to the city of Marshfield here starting this year. It's Green Acres Subdivision. It's going to open seventy-seven residential lots over the next eight or nine years."

That subdivision is taking shape east of Washington Ave. on a 21st Street extension. New roads within the subdivision will include Ironwood, Cottonwood, Basswood, and Aspen.

MADISON May 21, severe storms throughout Wisconsin led some consumers to seek contractors to complete repair work as soon as possible. The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) recommends property owners be skeptical of door-to-door repair crews who use aggressive, highpressure sales tactics to secure contracts after a storm.

When severe weather strikes, transient contractors follow close behind to solicit consumers in need. These traveling crews are sometimes called "storm chasers" and have been known to provide poor quality work or collect upfront payments and leave without doing any work at

Instead of risking your money and property by hiring strangers from another community state, DATCP or encourages consumers to ask for contractor recommendations from trusted sources such as friends, neighbors, and insurance agents. Do not let a traveling repair crew into your home, never agree to their offers before confirming they are permitted to operate in your area, and get your contracts in writing. Property owners with storm damage are encouraged to:

Make a list and take photographs of damages missing shingles, cracks in walls, etc.

Call municipal officials to find out if a contractor holds the proper permits in their area, including for door-to-door sales.

inspector to check if the of an owner's property repair work requires a permit, and again to verify the work was completed adequately before you provide final payment.

Obtain written contracts that specify exactly what work will be done, what materials will be used, a start and completion date, and warranty details.

Request and obtain lien waivers from any contractors hired for home repairs.

Keep copies of all receipts, contracts, correspondence, warranties, and written materials.

This week's clue: Home to the mayor's most-celebrated meal, this structure serves many purposes. Although most only visit once a year, people can see it anytime. Built by FA Felhofer, using lumber furnished by the R. Connor Co., this historic building is constructed using free-spanning trusses. Where in Marshfield am I?

Your task is to tell us the location of what is pictured. All the shapes shown last week are by the Marshfield airport. And inside the terminal building there is a wonderful display called "Wisconsin's Flying Trees." While there is an actual tree nicknamed the "Flying Tree," the Rowan, this display shows how the logging business in our state helped the Allies win World War II. And like the Rowan's symbiotic relationship to the Alder tree, the plywood from Marshfield's Roddis Plywood & Veneer Company was used for the skin of WWII aircraft, such as the "Mosquito," the fastest airplane used in that war. The wood from Wisconsin supplied half of the wood products required by the Allies.

PUBLISHER'S LETTER

Rate Increases

Dear Reader,

The United States Postal Service recently announced another 10% increase in their rates effective July 14, 2024. Since 2021, there have been five previous rate

increases; this is the sixth. This announcement coincides severe with deterioration in the USPS's performance; simply put, the mail is often late. These rate increases affect individuals sending mail as well as newspapers delivering the news. The rate increases have grown to a crisis. Your voice is needed, to ask Congress to place a moratorium on any rate



increases, effective immediately. Mail is a vital service to all Americans and provides information that cannot be transmitted digitally. The USPS's price increases have been so aggressive that mail volume is declining, which creates a death spiral: Each rate increase reduces the mail volume, making another rate increase necessary, leading to still more volume declines.

Consider the following:

First Class Mail Stamps

24 percent increase since 2022; another 7.8 percent increase scheduled for July 14, 2024.

Periodical Mail (Paid Newspapers)

Periodical postage increase for July 2024 will be about 5-7 percent increase since January 2024.

EDDM (Free Newspapers)

11 percent increase for community newspapers; the rate increase means newspapers are paying about 33 percent more for postage than three years ago.

Many newspapers rely on the mail to deliver local news to big, medium-sized and small communities alike. We depend on the Post Office and need it to succeed, but not at the cost of our ability to continue serving our readers.

For easy reference, following is contact information for your Senate and Congressional representatives, as well as State Senate and Assembly members. Please call them or leave a message on their constituent website. Ask them to put an immediate stop to postal rate increases that affect all of us. This action will help stabilize local news in your and our communities and preserve the stewardship that the print medium has had in helping our communities to stay strong, dynamic and filled with character.

MARSHFIELD Honoring Marshfield's 150th

Marshfield 150 for 150: Dr. Patricia Stuhr

Patricia Stuhr, daughter of the late John and Margaret Bloczynski, is a Marshfield native. She attended St. John's and Sacred Heart Catholic Grade Schools and Columbus High School. After graduating from Columbus, she began her college education with one of the first classes at the "new" University of Wisconsin-Marshfield/ Wood County Campus. Two years later she transferred to the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, where she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in art education.

Patricia taught art for 14 years at the elementary, middle, and high school levels in Oakfield. Additionally, she developed and taught an art program the Waupun and Lake Correctional Institutions for 11 years. While teaching she went back to school and earned her Masters and Doctorate Degrees at the University Wisconsin-Madison. During her studies, she taught courses at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Her doctoral thesis was focused on contemporary Wisconsin Native American visual culture and artists, multicultural art education, and the arts in integrated curriculum.

After completing her doctorate, Dr. Stuhr moved to Ohio State University (OSU) to become a teaching professor and later served as chair of the department of art education. In 1999, she received a Fulbright Award to teach and research at the University of Art and Design in Helsinki, Finland and was appointed as an honorary guest professor at Shandong University of Art and Design, Jinan, China.

National The Art Education Association (NAEA) named Dr. Stuhr an NAEA Distinguished Fellow for her significant contributions to the field in multicultural/crosscultural studies. In 1999,

she received the National Edwin Ziegfeld Award from the United States Society for Education through the Arts for her significant work and contributions in the areas of multicultural and cross-cultural research in art education. In 2008 she received the NAEA Woman's Caucus June King McFee Award for her contributions to art education and issues of social diversity.

In 2011, Dr. Stuhr left

OSU to serve as the Dean and CEO of the University of Wisconsin-Marshfield/ Wood campus. During her tenure she was well known and loved by faculty, students, and members of the Marshfield community. She attended almost all the University's events extracurricular that happened in town, from sports to theater. She often stopped to talk to the students and supported them in any way that she could. Because she was an active member of the Marshfield community, it wasn't uncommon for Patricia to be in the local stores and have one of the town residents call out, "Hev Dean!"

In her role as Dean and CEO, Dr. Stuhr built up the campus in both big and small ways. She secured funding needed



She helped to develop a four-year degree program and partnered with the Ho-Chunk Nation to provide an Educators' Certification Program to train apprentices to teach the language to a variety of age groups. She worked with local artist, Clyde Wynia, and he created a sculpture of a Marauder, the school mascot, for the campus. She had rails put in the aisles in the Helen Connor Laird Theater, making it easier for visitors to access the building. In 2014, Patricia helped plan yearlong events celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the

of 2015.

When asked about her time at the University, Dr. Stuhr shared that she feels that everyone should give back to their communities. Patricia lives that sentiment. She has volunteered for many community organizations since returning to Marshfield. She has been a member of the Medical College of Wisconsin Advisory Board for Central Wisconsin, Central Wisconsin Arts Network, Central Wisconsin Higher Education Consortium, New Visions Gallery Board of Directors, Marshfield Area Cultural Fair and the Marshfield Area Chamber of Commerce & Industry Crystal Apple Selection Committee, and she continues to volunteer for the Marshfield Area Community Foundation, Rotary, and the Chestnut Center for the Arts.

Community gardens offer gift for Marshfield gardeners

MARSHFIELD -- Registrations are now being taken for raised beds at the Marshfield Area Growing Together Community Garden sites. Vegetable gardening is a healthy activity to save money and eat nutritiously at home. There are eighty raised beds at three garden sites in Marshfield; Church of Christ on Felker Avenue, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church on McMillan St. and First Presbyterian Church on Lincoln Avenue. Some beds remain available at both Good Shepherd and the Church of Christ sites.

Marshfield Area Growing Together Community Gardens are celebrating their 16th year providing residents with raised beds in which to grow their own vegetables and save money. These fenced-in sites are in sunny locations, have water sources and rich compost with pathway mulch provided for all gardeners. Many gardeners return year after year.

"Participating in our Marshfield Community Gardens is a great way to supplement my diet with organically grown, fresh produce. It gives me, not only a sense of accomplishment and community, but also lots of joy," said Kathy Brunette, a returning gardener at the First Presbyterian site.

The community gardens benefit the Marshfield area in many ways, including improving access to organic fresh food, serving as sites for restoring and building health, and as places to learn gardening skills and build relationships. Britany White, a young mom gardening at Church of Christ last year recalled, "The thing I love about gardening is watching my harvest grow step by step into its full potential. I also enjoy taking my child with me and letting her help water the plants because toddlers always want to help and it teaches her how to care for plants she can benefit from. A generational gift so to speak."

Instruction in Square Foot Gardening and vertical gardening techniques is provided, as well as tips on proper watering during drought conditions and how to create rich compost of your own. In addition, Master Gardeners are available to assist gardeners with questions and concerns during the gardening season.

Returning Community Gardeners are asked to make a \$20 donation for each four foot by eight foot compost-filled bed reserved. This year, the community garden program is offering beds to new gardeners at the Church of Christ site for \$10 each. Donations cover about half of the operating expenses with grants and contributions as additional funding sources. The Garden Committee is grateful to the three local churches for their continued hosting of the garden sites and to Marshfield Area
















wine and we started to make wine. We did it with another couple for a couple years and then COVID hit and we bought them out," Bolder added. "We opened this past December. Probably the December prior to that we decided, 'Yeah, we're going to do this. We're going to put a building up and we're going to look at retiring."

The couple learned and practiced how to make wine and toured other wineries for five years before officially opening The Empty Nest on Dec. 1, 2023.

'She had a book and we would just, as a husband and wife, we'd open it up and say, 'Okay, let's go to these three wineries this Saturday,' so we would do that," Rocky Bolder recalled. "And by seeing a fair amount of wineries, from the monster down at Wollersheim to someone's garage and everything in between, she just got the idea that, 'Hey, we could do this.' I dug my heels in a little at first until I wrapped my head around, 'Okay, is it a retirement gig? Okay.' And after seeing a lot of these different places and seeing them successful, it was basically an 'If you build it, they will come' type of a thing, because the other thing we noticed by seeing these places was ages," Rocky added. "Soup to nuts. Young people to older people and everything in between."

Once Rocky and Karmin decided to move ahead with their plans, they quickly realized they needed to put up a new building. After the core facility was built, the family finished off the interior themselves, sourcing all of the wood from the woods on their 80-acre property. The wood on the front of the bar was left over from when the couple built their nearby home 24 years ago. They still have some

landscaping to do, and would someday like to add an overlook along the pond adjacent to the winery, which currently features some outdoor seating.

Besides 18 varieties of sweet wines, The Empty Nest also has six dry wines. They also serve pizza, pizza fries, pretzels and cheese and sausage trays.

As for entertainment, free Bingo is offered every Thursday night from 6 to 8 p.m. Sundays feature various craft and paint parties. Live music is featured throughout the summer. The facility which can hold up to 80 people - is also available for corporate events, bridal showers, Christmas parties and more.

"Tell us what you want and we'll see what we can do for you," says Karmin.

The business also has a website and Facebook page. Current hours are Thursdays from 4 to 8 p.m., Fridays from 2 to 8 p.m., Saturdays from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Sundays from 11 to 5.

And so far, so good, says the couple.

"We always set a goal and we've met that goal every weekend," Karmin told us.

Meanwhile, the Merrill natives still work their fulltime jobs. Rocky is a 29-year veteran of the Portage County Sheriff's Department, where he is currently the Superintendent of the Juvenile Detention Center. Karmin is currently a cardiology nurse at the Marshfield Medical Center, where she's worked for 30 years. Retirement, they say, should come within the next year to two.

Three of the couple's four children -Kaleb, Hannah and Rachel - work at the winery periodically. Ben, the oldest, lives in Randolph about two hours away. Hannah, a Phy. Ed. teacher in Marshfield, is living at home while she saves for a house of her own. Kaleb and Rachel are nearby.

But even when they are not in the winery helping out with a special event or during a busy weekend, you can always find them watching over Mom and Dad. On the wine label, they're the four birds perched above the couple under a heart amongst the branches of two trees, high school sweethearts who have once again found each other - not in a noisy high school gymnasium, but in that not-quite-empty nest on Smokey Hill Road in Milladore, as their game plan for retirement begins to play itself out.





Hastreiter Industries Corp, and most recently achieved their AS9100D certification.







FFA Career Development Events occur at the local, state and national levels to develop college- and career-readiness skills and serve as an outgrowth of instruction for FFA members in grades 7–12. The events help participating FFA members to develop critical-thinking and effective decision-making skills, foster teamwork and promote communication while recognizing the value of ethical competition and individual achievement.
