





WAUSHARA RUN FOR HOPE

REACH Waushara puts on the Annual Waushara Run for Hope each year. This year the event will be on Saturday, May 17th, 2025. It is the 4th Annual Waushara Run for Hope which starts at 8am at the new Government Center (380 S Townline Road) in Wautoma. Waushara Run for Hope is a 5k Run/ Walk and new in 2025 a 1 mile Stroll for Hope, raising funds to promote awareness of Mental Health and Suicide Prevention. It is a timed event



with age group awards, participation medals and if you want to bring your dog and sign them up, they get an award as well.



WAUSHARA COUNTY Parks

Take time to enjoy nature at the Waushara County Parks

n a time when people are constantly connected by electronic devices and social media, the Waushara County Parks offer a simpler, quieter, and more relaxing outdoor experience. Take time to visit the Waushara County Parks with family and friends to enjoy nature and escape the pressures of daily life.

Many people believe that spending time outdoors helps make us happier and healthier in a physical and mental sense.

Waushara County has 12 parks, seven miles of Bannerman Trail and the county fairgrounds. Parks vary in size from 383-acre Mt. Morris Hills to the one-acre Curtis Lake. Each provides unique opportunities for outdoor recreation.

George Sorenson Natural Area at Hartford Lake

Named after former Waushara County Board Chairman, the George Sorenson Natural Area, is located on nine-acre Hartford Lake in the Town of Deerfield. The 70-acre park remains largely undeveloped.

Highlights of this rustic park include miles of hiking or snow-shoeing trails and 2,000 feet of undeveloped lake shoreline. The park provides carry-in access for canoes and other non-motorized small craft. Special fishing regulations are set by the state. Motors are not allowed. Park officials ask that fishermen practice catch-and-release so that everyone can enjoy this resource.


Mt. Morris Hills County Park

Mt. Morris Hills is the largest and most popular park in the Waushara County Park System. This park offers spectacular views from a vantage point 300 feet above the surrounding countryside. Fall colors bring many sightseers to the top of the "mountain".

Facilities include a softball diamond, tennis, pickleball and volleyball courts, horseshoe pits, playground equipment, restrooms and a reservable shelter house. This park is very popular for family reunions, company picnics and other celebrations. The north slope of the Mt. Morris Hills Park is leased to the Nordic Mountain Ski Area, which runs one of the area's finest downhill ski facilities.

Willow Creek County Park

Located near the Nordic Mt. Ski Area, Willow Creek County Park provides access to the Willow Creek – a Class "A" trout stream. This park also serves as the trail head for cross-country skiing and hiking trails. Waushara County has a cooperative relationship with the Waushara Area Mountain Bike



Association to provide a beginner level mountain bike trail system to complement the advanced trails at Nordic Mountain. The beginner mountain bike trails are available for snowshoe use in the winter.

The Pine River Library maintains a "Story Walk" in the park which features displayed pages of a children's book posted along the 1-mile hiking trail. The book changes monthly and has proved to be a popular incentive for children to hike the trail.

Otto Brey County Park

Donated to the county by the Brey family in 1977, Otto Brey County Park has seen many improvements over the years.

Located on the Auroraville Millpond, facilities include a large picnic shelter, boat launch, softball diamond, basketball and volleyball courts, horseshoe pits and playground equipment. Much of the development was made possible by the Aurora Snowblazers, a local snowmobile club.

Bannerman Trail

The Bannerman Trail was acquired by Waushara County from the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad in 1971. The trail is 7 miles long and runs from the Village of Redgranite to State Road 73, north of the South County Line, and was purchased for snowmobile use.

During the snowmobile season each year, no other uses are allowed. Summer uses include, hiking, horseback riding and bicycling. No motorized vehicles are allowed outside of the snowmobile season. Summer leases for farming require users to follow signs directing them along County Road Z right-of-way for about 1-mile in the Spring Lake area.

The flat, former railway provides an easy hike or pedal through a scenic section of rural Waushara County. Recent surface improvements on the west end of the trail make bicycling more enjoyable. Wide tire bikes are still needed.

Pony Creek County Park

Located on the west shore of Lake Poygan, shoreline fishing is the main attraction of Pony Creek County Park. This peninsula park provides those without boats a great opportunity to try their luck at fishing. The shelter house at Pony Creek Park offers spectacular views of Waushara's largest lake.

Lake Alpine County Park

Constructed in 1971, Lake Alpine is a 66-acre man-made lake and is home to Lake Alpine County Park. This 17-acre park provides access to the lake as well as over 1,900 feet of shoreline, including the earthen dam structure.

Lake Alpine is a popular swimming and picnicking spot. Facilities available include a boat launch, shelter house, and playground equipment.


Kusel Lake County Park

Located on the eastern shore of shallow, sandy bottomed Kusel Lake, the 90-acre park offers the most diverse recreational opportunities of all Waushara County Parks. Activities include swimming, hiking, volleyball, tennis, pickleball, basketball and cross-country skiing. Facilities include two shelter houses with restrooms and playground equipment.

Waushara County has worked with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service on a 25-acre prairie restoration in the southwestern part of the park. The prairie provides an interesting contrast, for the skier or hiker, to the heavily wooded remainder of the park.

Other Waushara County Parks

Big Hills Lake, Marl Lake, and Curtis Lake County Parks all provide lake access. Each provides picnic facilities and restrooms. Swimming is a popular activity at Marl Lake, Curtis Lake and Kusel Lake Parks. Any of these lakes might become your "secret" fishing spot.

Waushara County Parks for all seasons

Waushara County Parks are open from 5:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. seven days a week. The parks are open year-round, except Mt. Morris, which is open from April until November. Tables and grills are available for use throughout all the parks.

Shelter reservations can be made by calling the Parks Department at (920) 787-7037 Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., by email at wausharacounty.parks@co.waushara. wi.us, or completing the online request at our website. Requests should be made at least two weeks prior to your event. There is a \$50 fee for shelter reservations.



Visit the seven State Natural Areas in Waushara County

rior to European settlement, Wisconsin contained a mosaic of natural communities, ranging from prairies and oak savannas in the south, to pine forests and boggy wetlands in the north. In all, more than 75 unique types of natural communities made up Wisconsin's landscape of the early 1800s.

Over the decades, since intensive settlement began, the quality and extent of those communities have been extremely reduced by urbanization, agriculture, industry, and by the ecological impact of fire suppression and the spread of exotic plant species. The last remaining vestiges of our native land-scape are called natural areas.

The State Natural Area (SNA) Program has grown to 687 sites encompassing more than 400,000 acres of land and water. SNAs are found in 70 of Wisconsin's 72 counties and range in size from less than one acre to more than 7,700 acres; seven of these sights are located in Waushara County.

The seven sites include Bass Lake Fen, Plainfield Tunnel Channel Lakes, Upper Fox Headwaters, Karner Blue Meadow, Lunch Creek Wetlands, Mecan Springs, and Bohn Lake.

The Bass Lake Fen is State Natural Area No. 178 and is 77 acres. Access is from the intersection of State Highways 22 and 73 in Wautoma, go south on 22 4.4 miles, then east on County Highway YY 0.9 mile to a parking area south of the road. Walk south on the access lane 0.75 mile to the north shore of lake.

Bass Lake features a 20-acre calcareous fen located on the undeveloped shore of Bass Lake. The fen is exceptionally diverse with many small springs, openings, and ponds providing a calcium-rich habitat that supports 125 species of plants.

The five-acre Bass Lake is a clear fertile lake, some 27 feet deep, with a sandy marl bottom and a population of fern pondweed, a species not usually found in south or central Wisconsin. The lake has a good warm water fishery and is an important waterfowl area. Sandhill cranes, which nest nearby, use the area extensively.

The Plainfield Tunnel Channel Lakes is State Natural Area No. 226 and provide specialized habitat for a rare plant known as the Fassett's Locoweed. This federally-threatened member of the bean family with magenta flowers and silvery-green leaves is endemic to Wisconsin — it grows here and nowhere else. Protected are the shorelines of three lakes in a string of 13 lakes and ponds lying in a "tunnel channel" created by a meltwater river flowing beneath the glacial ice. The lake basins were created from buried blocks of ice left behind when the tunnel collapsed.



The Upper Fox Headwaters is State Natural Area No. 265 and is 195 acres, and contains three district units: Zinke Lake, Upper Chaffee Creek Meadow, and Caves Creek. Zinke Lake is a small hard-water, spring lake with a tamarack-dominated shore. Upper Chaffee Creek Meadow contains a wetland complex of fen, wet-mesic, and wet prairie with over 100 native plant species present. Running through the site is Chaffee Creek. Caves Creek contains spring seeps and runs, a 2-acre spring pond, sedge meadow and tamarack swamp, and oak barrens.

Access for the Chaffee Creek Meadow, from the junction of Highways 21 and 39/51 in Coloma, travel south on 51 3.8 miles to rest area 81. Access is available via the Ice Age Trail on the west end of the rest area. Walk northeast into the site. For Caves Creek, from the junction of County Roads A and E in Lawrence, travel north on County Road A 1.7 miles, and then continue north on 4th Avenue 1.7 miles. Visitors should park along the road and walk east into the site.

The Karner Blue Meadow is State Natural Area No. 327 and is 40 acres. Access from the intersection of Highways 22 and A north of Wild Rose, go east on County A 3.0 miles, then south on 22nd Avenue 0.5 mile to a parking area in the southeast corner of the site. The Karner Blue Meadow features a dry sand prairie that is home to a strong population of the federally endangered Karner Blue butterfly (Lycaeides melissa samuelis). The Karner Blue is one of many plants and animals native to the sandy oak savannas and dry prairie habitat that have declined dramatically over the past several decades.

Historically, the Karner Blue occurred from eastern Minnesota, across the Great Lakes and into New England but has now disappeared from numerous states due to habitat loss, fragmentation, and a lack of natural disturbance, such as wildfire. The Karner Blue is restricted to habitats that contain wild Lupine, a beautiful purplish-blue flowering plant — the larval butterfly's only food plant.

The Lunch Creek Wetlands is State Natural Area No. 333 Waushara and has 567 acres. Access is from the intersection of Highways 73 and 21 in Wautoma, go south and west on 21 2.6 miles, then south on County Y about 2.0 miles to a DNR parking area east of the road. Follow Lunch Creek downstream to the wetlands.

Lunch Creek Wetlands contains one of the most diverse and species rich sedge meadows in Wisconsin situated within a mainly undisturbed watershed, an uncommon occurrence in Wisconsin. This large wetland complex is free of exotic species and dominated by fen and sedge meadow communities containing a total of 115 plant species.

A fen-like meadow emanates from the uplands and upland islands surrounding the lower areas. The area also provides ideal habitat for grassland and wetland birds such as the Northern Harrier, a species of special concern in Wisconsin. Over 5,000 Sandhill Cranes roost here in October and early November.

The Mecan Springs is State Natural Area No. 370 and is 111 acres. Access is from the junction of Highways 39/51 and 21 in Coloma, go east on Hwy. 21, 2.6 miles, then north on GG 2.0 miles, then west on Chicago Road 0.3 mile to an access lane and parking area on the left side of the road.

Situated in the bottom of a moraine depression, Mecan Springs protects the large clear-water springs which are the headwaters to the Mecan River, a Class A Trout Stream. The Mecan River system contains some of the finest trout streams in central Wisconsin. Sandhill cranes, northern bobwhite quail, and two rare birds — the state threatened red-shouldered hawk and federally-threatened bald eagle, use the area.

In the past year frequent sightings of bald eagles and red shouldered hawks has proven that these natural areas continue to be areas of interest to naturalist and hikers alike. The success of these rare birds in these areas shows Waushara County residents how precious the state natural areas continue to be.

Bohn Lake is State Natural Area No. 530, is a 13-acre, 24-foot deep seepage lake and can be accessed from Co. Hwy. C, approximately 6 miles west of Wautoma.

Bohn Lake is part of a geologically significant tunnel channel. The Bohn Lake shoreline fluctuates between 4 to 6 feet deep, depending on the hydrologic cycle and some years contains very little water. In wet years, abundant vegetation grows in distinctive rings around the lake, due to its fluctuating nature. Each of those rings has a different species, including sedges, spike rushes, bulrushes, panic grasses, and silverweed.

Bohn Lake also contains numerous floating aquatics, such as waterlilies. The uplands contain formerly-grazed, but highly-restorable savannah. Plants include shooting star, puccoon, New Jersey tea, ground cherry, Canadian milk-vetch, bush clover, and hoary vervain.

Animal life is diverse and includes turkey, tree swallow, northern oriole, great-crested flycatcher, eastern wood pewee, chipping sparrow, eastern bluebird, red-eyed vireo, and wood thrush. A number of invertebrates can also be found in the area and include white-faced pond-hawk dragonfly, pearl crescent, red admiral, and banded hairstreak butterflies. Bohn Lake was designated as a state natural area in 2008.


The building was constructed in 2003 after Wautoma resident Dale Severns donated money to build the memorial.


























Family fun abounds at Wautoma's **Augustfest on Aug. 9**

After a debate about building a swimming pool, it was decided operating costs were too high and the splash pad would be better suited for the area. The splash pad, as well as Bird Creek Park, continues to be maintained by the City of Wautoma. The splash pad is open 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. from Memorial Day to Labor Day, weather permitting.

he quaint little Village of Wild Rose is the perfect getaway from everyday life.

With some of the best recreation in the area, Wild Rose is located close to over a dozen clear and fresh water lakes for swimming, fishing, and boating. Hunters also enjoy the area for the public hunting land close by the village.

The community has been bringing new additions to Roberts Park. Enjoy a picnic under the new gazebo and enjoy a walk around the pond!

Every year the community gets together to celebrate Wild Rose Days — Party on the Pond. The yearly event features a variety of activities enjoyed by the whole family, including fireworks over the Mill Pond.

In 2024 the Old Fashioned Fest presented by Slugger's Bar made history with the world's largest old fashioned enjoyed by hundreds of visitors. Organizers plan on bringing back the event for the second year, so mark your calendar!

With over 30 miles of groomed trails, take your winter recreation to the next level by exploring the area on your snowmobile. The We Really Kare Fishing Club also hosts a fisheree on Kusel Lake, located just six miles from the Village.

With year-round fun, it's hard to pass on the opportunity to getaway in Wild Rose.







Wild Rose's Roberts Park: Something for everyone

oberts Park of Wild Rose ties in with a focal point of the village, located on the west side of the millpond, with the entrance being on River Street. The park was created after Arnol and Dorothy Roberts donated the wooded land. Volunteers helped create the park after the millpond had been dredged and the area was cleared up. A shelter with restrooms was constructed, with picnic tables and cooking grills spanning the area.

Over the years, the park has seen transformations with organizations adding a fenced in little league ball diamond, a basketball court, sand volleyball, horseshoe pits, some playground equipment, a paved parking area, walking trails, a swimming beach, a boat landing for rowboats only, fishing areas, as well as a handicapped accessible fishing dock. Benches are also available along the west side of the millpond, so visitors can sit, relax, and take in the sights and sounds of the area.

The brush and dead/broken trees were cleared from the west side of the millpond in recent years, making the park more visible from the highway. One can also see giant planters, LED lampposts lighting a trail, and a flagpole honoring all veterans in between the park and the millpond. These items are compliments of donations made by area businesses and individuals who wish to see the area enhanced for all to enjoy. More recently, new playground equipment was installed, as well as construction of a new gazebo in the summer of 2022. A boardwalk trail starts at the top of River Street at Main Street, with many people venturing along it into Roberts Park. As a walker or bicyclist finishes the trip around the millpond, the newly







repaired dam can be viewed as well as the historic mill and the work that has been done by the Central Wisconsin Chapter of Trout Unlimited in the cleaning up of the trout stream at the north end of the pond.

Roberts Park is used for Easter Egg Hunts in the spring when weather permits and, in recent years, it has been the site for the majority of Wild Rose Days activities in July. The park is open to the public and can be reserved for big gatherings by contacting Wild Rose Village Clerk Lindsey Inda at 920-622-4183.



Wild Rose State Fish Hatchery raises over two million fish for anglers in Wisconsin

hinook salmon came full circle back to Wild Rose and Waushara County in 2024. Eggs are collected from Sturgeon Bay in the fall from four-year old Chinook salmon. Millions of eggs brought to Wild Rose Hatchery will be placed on incubators and will hatch in about one month. The eggs and fry are cared for and fed through the winter. Chinook salmon are stocked along the shore and rivers on Lake Michigan from Door County to the Illinois border when ice is out usually around March the following spring. At the Kewaunee Open House in October 2024, football team members from Wild Rose High School helped clean, package and freeze 200 pounds of salmon which were brought back to this community to distribute through the Waushara County Food Pantry.

Anglers have opportunities to catch one of two million Chinook salmon, Coho salmon, brown trout and steelhead (rainbow trout) produced at Wild Rose for Lake Michigan annually. Wild Rose Coolwater hatchery crew also raises and stock fish to provide inland lake and river anglers a chance to hook up





with walleye and spotted musky. Wild Rose Hatchery also raises lake sturgeon as part of the restoration of this species in the Wolf River system and Wisconsin River. With the introduction of Viral Hemorrhagic Septicemia (VHS) in Wisconsin waters, the hatchery staff has been practicing biosecurity to eliminate any potential chance of infecting eggs and fish at the hatchery. The disease is not a threat to people who handle fish or eat them, but VHS can kill fish. Visitors are not allowed in production areas of the new hatchery to avoid the risk of contamination.

The public is invited to participate in two annual events held at the Wild Rose Hatchery Education Center. The Lake Sturgeon Celebration will feature an open house on the First Saturday in May on Saturday, May 3, 2025. The Fall Salmon Migration Event is held the Last Saturday in October on Saturday, October 25, 2025. These special events are free for families and groups to explore the old hatchery and education center with extra activities such as learn to cast, Gyotaku fish printing, fish crafts, fish migration obstacle course, hatchery cache, fly fishing, fly tying, build a spinner (if volunteers are available) and guided behind the scenes hatchery tours.

Visitors can explore Wisconsin's ancient Lake Sturgeon in the lake sturgeon exhibit, along with viewing freshwater fish in two 300-gallon aquariums. Test your skills at fish production in the Day at the Hatchery interactive replica of the hatchery lab where you can dissect a model fish, estimate egg survival, examine specimens under a microscope, sort and measure fish, and view eggs on incubation trays. You will be able to identify and compare aquatic invasive species with native species in the



Aliens exhibit, match and identify Wisconsin's fish in the Match Your Catch indoor model fishing pond and investigate the history of the Great Lakes fishery in Waves of Change exhibit, and the story of the hatchery revealing early days of fish production to the present time.

Try the family-friendly hatchery cache activity (no GPS needed) to locate hidden caches around the old hatchery with clues that lead you to the next cache along with a hatchery scavenger hunt in the exhibit area of the education center.

The historic village is a refreshing site for visitors to stroll from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. daily where Wild Rose first began raising brown trout. Pack a picnic lunch and enjoy the scenic historic village, a tradition since the early 1900s. The state property requires visitors to carry out their own trash and recyclables to keep the facilities clean for all visitors. Please plan to take waste with you as the hatchery does not provide waste or recycling containers for picnickers. Pets are not allowed on hatchery property. Fishing is not allowed on the hatchery property.

The building is open to visitors from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Wednesday through Saturday in spring and fall months of April, May, September and October.

Summer visitor hours from Memorial Day through Labor Day are Wednesday through Sunday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Memorial Day through Labor Day.

Be sure to call ahead for weekly schedule to avoid disappointment if staff are not available. Public tours are conducted daily during open hours at 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., or by appointment. Visitors will view behind the scenes fish culture in a ten-minute video of the state-of the-art, bio-secure hatchery for production of trout and salmon, walleye, muskellunge, and lake sturgeon



during guided tours with a sneak peek into the trout and salmon nursery observation room.

Schools and groups can request educational tours lead by hatchery staff for up to 20 people. Call Jesse Landwehr or Sam Stafslien at the hatchery office (920) 622-3527 at least three weeks in advance to schedule your group tour. The Wild Rose Fish Hatchery Education Center is located at N5871 State Hwy. 22, one-half mile north of the Village of Wild Rose on the West side of State Highway 22.

The hatchery, visitor center, and historic raceways are closed to the public and vehicle traffic from November through March.

Wild Rose Historical Society

he purpose of the Wild Rose Historical Society and Museum has been to preserve and pass on the historical heritage of our community. The museum is and has always been completely supported by memorials, donations, and plain hard work. It is not endowed.

The original settlers of the area surrounding our Village were of English descent, immigrating from Rose, New York in the 1850's. Before much time passed, they were joined by the Welsh, Irish, Polish, Norwegian, German, Swedish, and Danish immigrants, looking for a better life in the New World.


The museum complex consists of the Elisha Stewart House built in 1884 next to his cobbler and harness shop. The shop now houses the Weaving Room and display of an old Country Store. There is Pioneer Hall, which opened in 1901 as a bank and later became the post office. Here you can learn about the unsuccessful bank robbery that took place in 1905. In 1983 the members purchased a "one-room school house" which was built in 1894 and moved it from Swamp Road to our backyard. The school has been furnished as it once was. The members built the Carriage House to accommodate the many larger items used for transportation. It also houses the original Village jail cell. Located in the backyard are the Smokehouse, the Barn, and the Blacksmith shop.

Because our guides are all volunteers, it is not possible to be open every day of the week. However, tours are conducted on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Private tours can be arranged by calling Helen Cox at 920-787-5900, messaging on our Facebook page, or sending a note in advance to the Wild Rose Historical Society at PO Box 63, Wild Rose, WI 54984.

There is no admission fee to our museum, but monetary donations are greatly appreciated since we are a not-for- profit organization and rely on donations to help with the costs of running this museum.

As a Society, we are always looking for new members/volunteers, so come and join us for a tour and see how people used to live in Wild Rose. Join our organization and help us to remember the past by keeping it going for the future. We need YOU!



merican Legion Daniel Dopp Post 370 of Wild Rose took possession of a Bell AH-1 Huey Cobra attack helicopter from Arizona that was acquired through a government program. Our mission was to place the helicopter as a Veterans Memorial in the community.

The Post 370 then appealed to the Wild Rose community to help raise the \$25,000 needed to complete the veteran's memorial site. By 2018, volunteers, the Wild Rose community, many businesses and contractors made the memorial site a reality. The memorial sits on land leased from the Wild Rose Lions Club.

The focal point of the Memorial is a restored vintage Bell AH-1 Huey Cobra Attack helicopter used during the Vietnam War and includes a U.S. flag, flags of our armed forces, and a Pow flag. There is a disabled friendly walk of honor where veterans, families, businesses and the community have purchased bricks to honor veterans and support the memorial site. There is a brass bell made from expended brass shells and casings used during the Vietnam war and people visiting the site are encouraged to ring the bell to honor those who died and served. The site also includes a free-standing library which houses a registration book and forms to purchase bricks or donate money to support the memorial.

All visitors are welcome to come and spend time to remember loved ones who died or served our great country. Please feel free to register when you visit.

Post 370 was named in honor of Daniel G. Dopp, of Wild Rose, Wisconsin. He was a US army veteran, killed in action during WWI on June 9, 1918. According to the US Army Burial Administration, Daniel was buried near where he died in the Belleau Woods in France. On January 10, 1928 the Daniel Dopp Post 370 in Wild Rose was officially chartered to honor our fallen hero.

American Legion Post 370 of Wild Rose meets the first Thursday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the Legion Hall, 545 Front

Street. If you are a veteran living in the Wild Rose area and beyond, and are not a member of any legion post, please come and meet with your fellow brothers and sisters who have served. A social hour follows our regular meeting.





The Redgranite Quarry: A popular attraction for residents and visitors



hose near and far always look forward to visiting the Redgranite Quarry. The popular summertime attraction for local residents as well as the visitors of Waushara County is open for hiking, fishing, and swimming.


Quarry visitors are allowed to swim at their own risk as there are no lifeguards on duty. Diving clubs can often be found at the quarry as it is one of the best clear water diving spots in the Upper Midwest. Fishing remains a popular pastime as well, since various species of fish have been stocked in the quarry throughout the years.

Discovery of red granite at the quarry site in the 1880's sparked a mining boom that brought skilled stonecutters from Europe to settle in the area. Granite paving blocks from the quarry were used in streets as far as Chicago.

The Redgranite Quarry was closed in the 1920s after concrete and asphalt became popular for paving, and it is now one of the deepest bodies of water in Wisconsin.

In 1995, the quarry was designated a village park and is located on the north side of State Highway 21 behind the post office.

In the summer of 2008, the land around the quarry underwent an extensive cleanup to make the location even more attractive for visitors.



The newly formed Quarry Committee has been meeting monthly and has been adding improvements to the park. In 2024 the quarry committee also hosted their second annual Fall Harvest Festival and looks forward to bringing it back in 2025. All proceeds from their events will go to quarry trail improvements.

The Redgranite Quarry will continue to attract visitors near and far as the centerpiece of the little village.

The Redgranite Quarry Park is open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. seven days a week.

he Village of Redgranite along with dedicated community members has made efforts to liven up the community, starting with their local parks. oloma's slogan is: "It a great day to be in Coloma." There are several areas of interest in Coloma. One can come for entertainment, historical significance, or exercise. The village is located just off I-39 and Highway 21.

The Coloma Hotel, which has been around for over 100 years, is still in operation as a country inn. The old barbershop has become a coffee shop, the butcher shop is now a liquor store, the old bank safe features women's fashion, and the old lumber yard is a brew pub. There are numerous restaurants to satisfy your hunger. An old gas station holds a hair salon. In 2019, the old mercantile building was renovated, and it now holds a shopping boutique and ice cream shop, a yoga studio, a massage parlor, and a chocolate factory. The laundromat is newly remodeled.

In the Coloma Park is the Spaulding Store Museum, which was moved by the Coloma Historical Society (CAHS) from Coloma Corners in 2008 because Coloma Corners was where Coloma was originally located (at the time of the stagecoach). This building is open on the weekends and during special events in the summer like the Chicken Chew, the CAHS Flea & Craft Markets and Concerts in the Park. The building was once both a general store and post office. In front of the museum is a sidewalk commemorating people who have built Coloma. This year the museum will be taking on its latest project: renovating the old caboose.

Outside of Coloma is an alpaca farm, two wedding venues, a popular dinner music show, and a fall extravaganza. Each offers a unique experience for entertainment.

The Village of Coloma, formerly Coloma Station, was founded in 1858. The Village of Coloma was named after the town in California where gold was discovered. Coloma's lollipop shaped water tower, constructed in the late 1930's, was the first of its kind ever built. From this adventure, Coloma attained a bit of fame in the World Book Encyclopedia.

Coloma is a village full of history, but history isn't Coloma's only attraction. There are a wide range of nearby recreational opportunities that make Coloma a pleasant place to visit year round. The Coloma School Forest has become a draw for many families looking for a place to hike, picnic and learn about nature. Amateurs and professionals hike the Ice Age Trail on a regular basis. The Coloma Pathfinders sponsors both snowmobile trails and silent sport trails for winter fun. Almost all roads are open to ATV/UTV's for spring, summer, and fall fun.

There is a Veteran's Monument at the entrance to the Coloma Park that was dedicated by the Local American Legion Post 343. The Howitzer was placed in honor of all veterans with a dedication plaque and an American Flag as well. The village park





has a playground, ball diamond, picnic tables, basketball hoops, tennis courts and ample off street parking. The property comprises a diverse ecosystem including pine plantations, deciduous forests, open meadows, lowlands, a 40 acre marsh, four small lakes, and a restored prairie area. The trails, which meander throughout the school forest, make for a rich community resource.

Besides serving as a base for Environmental Education for the School District, many opportunities abound for hiking, picnicking, hunting, biking, skiing, bird watching, and other non-consumptive uses. Public camping is not allowed.

Marked activity trails of various lengths and difficulty have been established for users seeking places to hike, bike, ski, or ride horseback. For those wishing to access the school forest property from the south, a ski trail parking area is available during the winter months off of Beechnut Avenue. When adequate snow cover exists, volunteers ensure that the trail system is groomed for cross country skiing. At 1.4 miles, Timber view trail is the shortest trail, and it does not have hills. Whispering Pine trail is a bit more challenging and rewards users with a beautiful view of the gently sloping shores of Bullhead Lake. Its entire length is 2.7 miles, while the 3.7 mile Lake





Shore Trail offers more challenging slopes and a gorgeous view of Reeder Lake. The 3.8 mile Plantation Trail offers some additional distance as it extends to the far south end of the property.

Near the center of the property is a shelter building, which provides a home-base site for district school forest activities, and it offers forest users a great place to stop and relax. The pavilion-style shelter offers some protection from wind and rain. If visiting the shelter house, take a moment to look at the painted animal silhouettes and the solar power system located on the roof and in the rafters of the shelter. The solar power system provides a limited source of electricity for lighting portions of the shelter house during School District activities taking place in this location. Located nearby the shelter house are pit toilet bathroom facilities.

For those interested in obtaining a lovely view of Bullhead Lake, an amphitheater is nestled along the North shore. Aldo Leopold benches, complete with unique environmental quotations, offer welcome areas to rest throughout the forest area. They are scattered along the trails and throughout Liza's Prairie. One may also enjoy following the self-guided tree trail guide, which offers the opportunity to visit and observe 19 tree species throughout the forest. A structure commonly known as the observation tower combines a shelter house and a 400 square foot observation deck. This observation tower is situated toward the southwest corner of the property. Besides being a popular hiking and skiing destination, this unique structure enhances one's experience at the forest as it offers forest visitors spectacular views of the forest canopy and night sky.

Hunting is allowed, except when the forest is in use by a school or community group. A sign is posted at the north entrance gate indicating if such a group is using the school forest. All federal, state, and local hunting regulations must be followed. Trapping is allowed only with a written permit. Maps and guides are available in the parking area located at W12409 County Road O. Many are available online as well.

While at the school forest, people need to be conscious of their location and aware of property lines so not to trespass on neighboring properties. The school forest is a "walk-in-area" only. No motorized vehicles are allowed.



World reknown Daylily Hybridizer's lifetime of work on display at local National Daylily Display Garden

raziano Gardens, an independent retail garden center, features the life-long daylily hybridizing work of Wild Rose native son, Darrel Apps. Apps is a career horticulturist who holds three degrees from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He has named and introduced over 480 registered daylily cultivars and received the coveted Betrand Farr hybridizing award from the American Hemerocallis Society (AHS).

When Darrel Apps retired, Graziano Gardens became involved with displaying Apps's recent registrations. Apps has focused his hybridizing efforts on daylilies with rebloom and dormant foliage particularly suited for the colder parts of the country.

The borders at Graziano Gardens contain a wide variety of daylilies in many forms including doubles, minis, spiders, and patterns. The popular rebloomers have a genetic trait which extends the period of bloom from a couple weeks to months. Many of these rebloomers are part of the Once Again series hybridized by Darrel Apps after extensive study of this reblooming trait in the daylily, Hemerocallis fulva var. aurantiaca. The borders also contain a wide selection of award-winning daylilies from other nationally recognized hybridizers and daylilies from App's hybridizing work in New Jersery.

This year, Darrel Apps has continued his work with five new daylily registrations that are sure to be popular! Long awaited is the debut of 'Apps Eye Candy'. 'Apps Eye Candy' is a collectors' daylily, with a wide, nearly black eye zone which feathers with raspberry into the white petals. Apps adds four other registrations to his list including an addition to the locally popular reblooming Once Again series with 'Once Again Magic Carpet'. His other new registrations are 'Canaries in Flight', 'Cherry Belle', and 'My Little Pretty Pink'.

As a American Hemerocallis Society (AHS) National Daylily Display Garden, Graziano Gardens has nearly 700 different registered daylilies and seedlings planted expansively in the landscaped borders, accented with statuary, perennials, shrubs, and garden treasure.

Individual daylily registrations from Darrel Apps have won awards from the AHS such as the Junior Citation ('Little Red Hen' in 1978 and 'Queen Anne's Lace' in 1990); Florida



Sunshine Award ('Made to Order' in 2001 and 'Baby Bear' in 2023); Annie T. Giles ('Sugar Cookie' in 1989); and Award of Merit ('Sugar Cookie' in 1989). An additional 34 daylilies have won Honorable Mention, several of which are displayed in the Graziano Gardens borders ('Happy Returns' in 1992, 'Woodside Ruby' in 1993, 'Royal Occasion' in 1994, 'Herman Apps' in 1996, 'Jungle Beauty' in 1996, 'Woodside Romance' in 2000, Rosy Returns' in 2002, 'Bridgeton Celebrity' in 2004, 'Meringue Mirage' in 2004, 'Bridgeton Finesse' in 2005, 'Apricot Sparkles' in 2007, and 'The Jury's Out' in 2008).

It is easy to become a daylily fan strolling the borders of Graziano Gardens in Pine River. Graziano Garden is a destination garden center, nestled near artesian springs in the Pine River watershed. Graziano Gardens is near the Springwater Volunteer Covered Bridge which was erected in 1997 across the Pine River. Experience the calls of sandhill cranes, the screeches of eagles and hawks, and processions of turkeys on your drive to Graziano Gardens on some of Wisconsin's Rustic Roads.

The garden center features wide, accessible, grassy paths through the daylily borders. Graziano Gardens provides restroom facilities. Friendly dogs and mannerly children are welcome!





Il of Marquette County is a Bird City. There are over 250 species of birds that have been identified in Marquette County. Now you can download a Marquette County Bird Checklist off the John Muir Nature and History Trail mobile app or pick one up at many local



businesses. Muirland Bird Club, open to all, maintains multiple Bluebird trails and several Purple Martin houses. They participate in the Christmas Bird Count, Crane Count, Bird-a-Thon, Swift Night Out, and Great Backyard Bird Count.

Start your birding experience in Marquette County at the Muir addition to the Fox River National Wildlife Refuge on County Road F just north of John Muir Park. There, you can read the words of John Muir on a historical kiosk as he describes the birds he saw as a boy in Marquette County. He named 31 birds he saw in the 1850s and all but two can still be seen in Marquette County.

Check out the John Muir Nature and History Route mobile app, also available on your computer to find birding sites and lists of species that can be seen in various locations in Marquette County. The route features locations around the county that are either directly attached to the life of the young John Muir or that tell the story of Marquette County during the time Muir lived here.

John Muir is known as the Father of the National Parks. He developed a deep connection to nature right here in Central Wisconsin in Marquette County. Three times he tried to buy the land where he grew up in order to preserve its natural beauty. Now, you can walk on the land he loved and see more of his boyhood neighborhood and the landscapes and nature that sparked his love of wilderness by using the John Muir Nature and History Route mobile app.

When 11 year-old John Muir moved to Marquette County in

1849, he arrived immersed in Scottish heritage, the Disciples of Christ religion of his father, and the exuberance and wildness of a young boy ready for adventure, but he was also changed by his new home, the people, the landscape, the experiences of life on a farm.

Learn what life was like for settlers in the earliest days of Wisconsin statehood, the years Muir was experiencing his new home, view the landscapes as they would have looked in Muir's time, and sense the life he and his family lived. New information is added each year.

Watch for the John Muir Saunter Signs that designate a place to learn about John Muir and his life here in Marquette County as a boy. Go to the website or a QR code on the signs to learn about each site. Plus, it's family friendly. You can print out maps, worksheets, and guides before you head out on the route. Visit one site or more on each visit and steep yourself in nature and history.





Montello celebrates 175th anniversary



Early settlers were drawn to this area between the confluence of two rivers because of its waterpower and transportation possibilities, just as First Nations used its rich resources for thousands of years. The first settlers were Yankees from out East and then came Irish, English, Scottish, German and more immigrants to the new community that was named Montello.

Steamboats travelled on the Fox River, a railroad was built to connect it to other communities and the famous Montello granite began to be quarried and shipped all over the country. Named the Marquette County seat in 1858, and having several influential legislators hailing from Montello, the new settlement became a village and eventually a city facing all the challenges that life threw at its citizens.
