

MERRILL FIRE DEPT

Just after 5:15 PM on February 13th, the Merrill Fire Department (FD) was dispatched to a detached garage fire in close proximity to the house at 606 Cottage St. in the City of Merrill. Engine-61 responded immediately to the scene with only 2

personnel. The remaining 3 on duty staff members were on a separate ambulance call with a patient that they had just revived and transported to Wausau Hospital.


Upon arrival of Engine-61, they found heavy smoke and fire coming from behind the house in the detached



With assistance from law enforcement officers on scene, hoselines were deployed to try to prevent the spread of the fire to the nearby house. Mutual aid was requested from Corning, Pine River, Russell, and Wausau Fire Departments along with Tomahawk EMS. Initial fire operations were very difficult due to limited FD personnel, water supply issues, weather, and unruly bystanders. During those same initial operations, emergency personnel had a close call with a downed powerline and two police officers ended up being evaluated at a local hospital smoke inhalation.

Fortunately injuries were reported and the police officers were released that night.

While the garage and the contents inside were a total loss, the fire was contained to the garage and the house only received exterior heat damage. Due to loss of power to the house, occupants were put up at a local hotel for the night. The cause of the fire is still under investigation, but at this time it does not appear suspicious. Two bystanders were arrested interfering with firefighting operations. Wisconsin Public Service and Merrill Street Department also assisted at the scene.



Lester Weko's birthday was on Monday, Feb. 3.

Bob Coleman's birthday will be on Monday, Nov. 3.

Lester Weko enlisted in the Army-Air Force at the age of 17. He served honorably during World War II from 1943 to 1949. He served two years in Hawaii and three years in the reserves. He was a T-4 Technical Sergeant and worked in the Army Motor Pool.

Lester recently celebrated his 100th birthday with his family and friends at Immanuel Baptist Church in Rib Mountain. He also received special recognition as Centenarian Veteran for reaching the 100-year milestone with a framed letter from the Secretary of Veteran Affairs in Washington.

Lester is a past Chaplain of the "Veterans Weekly Cup-of-Coffee" group and the Wausau American Legion Post 10. He also served as Senior Pastor at four churches in Wisconsin. Including Immanuel Baptist Church in Rib Mountain. Lester is a master joke teller and he captivates our entire audience each week at the Cup-of-Coffee meetings.

Bob Coleman served in the Navy during World War II from 1943 to 1946. He served six months aboard the Destroyer USS Wipple DD217 in the Caribbean escorting freighter convoys through U-Boat waters. Bob also served aboard the LST 804 on D-Day in Okinawa.

Upon completion of his service, Bob went to college and became a teacher. He

taught 9th grade English and American Literature for 48 years with the last 31 years at D.C. Everest. He also was a JV wrestling and football coach. Bob was the Commander of Rothschild-Schofield-Weston Post 8895 and is currently a member of the Mar-Lin VFW Post 10203 in Hamburg and Rothschild American Legion Post 492 where he worked with Joe Kelbley

Aspirus Emergency Department Nurse Reflects on Her Be the Match Experience

Observed every year on February 14, National Donor Day is a time to focus on all types of donations organ, eye, tissue, blood, platelets and marrow. It's a day designed to help save and heal more lives by sharing information about the importance of donation.

an Emergency Department (ED) Nurse at Aspirus Langlade Hospital, Kristie Falk exemplifies the spirit of selflessness and compassion of the nursing profession. Beyond her daily commitment to patient care, she extended her dedication to saving lives by participating in the "Be The Match" (BTM) program.

"We were made aware of this program seven to eight years ago when a

member of my son's hockey team was diagnosed with leukemia," said Falk. "As they were considering treatment options, they shared information on the 'Be The Match' program and I signed up with the thought of possibly helping someone someday."

BTM, operated by the National Marrow Donor Program, is a global leader in facilitating bone marrow and stem cell transplants. The organization connects patients with life-threatening blood cancers, such as leukemia and lymphoma, to potential donors. Joining the registry involves a simple cheek swab, but the decision to donate is profound, requiring both physical and emotional commitment.

What started as a desire

to make a difference beyond her immediate environment of working in the ED, Kristie already understood the critical need for donors, especially for patients without matching family members.

"We give blood to people daily and it comes from people like us. If people don't donate, patients don't get it and I would tell those who are on the fence about being a donor to go for it," said Falk. "You're giving someone a second chance at life, it makes you feel really good and it's rewarding."

Kristie's donor journey took another turn last August.

"I was told, 'you're a match for a 47-year-old





The Ginseng Board of Wisconsin is composed of seven at-large producers who are responsible for administering Wisconsin's Ginseng Marketing Order. The board oversees the collection and use of over \$200,000 in assessment fees paid by Wisconsin ginseng growers. This funding is used to support the ginseng industry through research, education, and promotion of Wisconsin-grown ginseng.

female that lives in the United States, she has acute myeloid leukemia,' and that's all I knew," said Falk.

After some follow-up testing and preparation, she was off to New York City to complete the donation of

stem cells which took place in a whirlwind three-day span.

"I knew if I was in the same situation, I would want someone to do this for me or my family and would be eternally grateful," said Falk.

Kristie's story serves

as an inspiration to her colleagues and the broader community. It emphasizes the profound impact one individual can have through acts of kindness and generosity. Her experience also sheds light on the importance of BTM and other donor programs and

the ongoing need for donors.

For those interested in following Kristie's example, joining BTM is straightforward.

Potential donors can visit the organization's website, complete a health questionnaire, and provide a cheek swab sample. By doing

so, they become part of a global network committed to offering hope and healing to patients battling lifethreatening diseases.

Aspirus Health encourages people to consider registering to be an organ, eye and tissue donor if you haven't done so already.


