





Wausau SSA office closing

The lease for Wausau's physical Social Security Administration office will not be renewed and has been listed on the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE)'s website among its list of "savings."

Currently, calls to the Wausau office are answered by an automated system. *City Pages* was unable to reach a human representative before publication.

An SSA spokesperson has stated that most of the leases not being renewed were for spaces used for in-person hearings, sites no longer necessary due to the majority of hearings now being held virtually, according to the Associated Press.

The *Wausau Daily Herald* reported that their questions to SSA about impacts to employees or specific services provided at the Wausau office were not addressed.

Though DOGE is claiming credit for the recent swath of closures, some of the institutions listed for closure — the majority of them in-person offices — were already slated for closure due to lack of use, AP reported.

Make sure you have a valid ID before the spring election

Earlier this week, the Wisconsin DMV released a statement reminding those planning to vote in the Wisconsin Spring Election on April 1 how to obtain identification that is valid for voting.

Valid identification for voting purposes includes a driver's license and an identification card, like a military or student ID. Identification can be obtained for free, and a federally compliant REAL ID card is not required for voting purposes.

To ensure that your identification meets voting requirements, visit the Wisconsin Elections Commission website, https://elections.wi.gov, where you can also view fact checks on claims related to Wisconsin elections; view your district's ballot; and register to become a poll worker, among other things.



For a list of required documents to present at the DMV in order to obtain identification, visit wisconsindmv.gov/idcards. U.S. citizens can obtain a receipt, free of charge, that can be used as identification at the polls if their ID card is not available in time

Alice in Dairyland top six candidates announced

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection has announced the top six candidates to become the 78th Alice in Dairyland: Allison Foster of Waupun, Michelle Stangler of Watertown, Mikayla Flyte of Coloma, Natalie Roe of Monticello, Olivia Lulich of Lyndon Station and Sarah Hagenow of Poynette.

The DATCP describes Alice in Dairyland as a one-year, full-time public relations professional whose job is to promote Wisconsin agriculture throughout the state, conducting hundreds of media interviews, speeches and school presentations.

Prior to being selected, the top candidates completed an application and preliminary interview. During the next two months, they will participate in a rigorous interview process that will allow them to showcase the communications and public relations skills required to be the 78th Alice in Dairyland. All top candidates will receive media and speaking training and earn a DATCP marketing and communications certificate.

This training process will prepare the candidates for the Alice in Dairyland Finals, scheduled for May 15-17, 2025, in Crawford County. The three-day finals include agribusiness tours, media interviews, an impromptu question-and-answer session, candidate presentations, and more. The selection of the 78th Alice in Dairyland will be announced at a public event on May 17, 2025, at the Performing Arts Center in Prairie du Chien, and she will begin her term on July 7, 2025.



Organ donation registration added to taxes

People often describe doing their taxes as "like pulling teeth," but now taxpayers have the option to offer their vital organs, as well.

As of this year, in an effort to boost the number of registered organ donors in Wisconsin and narrow the gap between supply and demand, Wisconsin taxpayers interested in becoming organ donors can add their names to the Wisconsin Donor Registry when filing their taxes. When filing joint returns, spouses may sign up, as well.

The change appears on Schedule 3, Part II of the Wisconsin state income tax return, which is titled "Financial Donations and Anatomical Gift Registration."

"We hope that adding this quick and easy way for Wisconsinites to document their decision to save and heal lives will grow the donor registry and bring hope to the more than 1,400 adults and children in our state awaiting life-saving organ transplants," said Holly Thomas, president of Donate Life Wisconsin. "We encourage Wisconsinites to continue to sign up as donors when they file or when renewing their driver's licenses. This swift and simple 'yes' is easy, secure and lifesaving."

Through the end of February 2025, 24,608 Wisconsin taxpayers and spouses have checked the box to become organ donors. Their generosity has a profound impact; one organ donor can save up to eight lives and help 75 others, according to an official statement. Families of donors can

take comfort knowing their loved one's legacy will continue long after they are gone.

To qualify, individuals must be Wisconsin residents who are at least 15 years of age or emancipated minors. Anyone who meets these criteria can become an organ donor regardless of health history. Their gift will be used to help others through transplantation, therapy, research, or education.

Your IRA is an IOU to the IRS

What is the biggest debt item on your balance sheet? Your mortgage? A business loan? Something else?

Are all your loans paid off and you think you don't have debt?

If you have an IRA, 401(k) or other pretax retirement account, think again.

Most people are not trained to look at their investments with an eye toward the taxes owed.

Taxes are a component of any investment, especially retirement accounts.

If your asset location includes Roth IRAs or Roth 401(k)s, you've paid tax on money going into the account and therefore, no further taxes are owed as long as you follow the IRS distribution rules.

If however, you are like so many others who have contributed and successfully grown pre-tax dollars in retirement accounts, taxation is inevitable, a "debt" of sorts, as our government has not yet had the opportunity to claim their share of your retirement account.

The good news is that you can strategize. What would you say is the number one rule of tax planning?

Arguably, it's to pay taxes at the lowest rate, whether now or in the future.

With income forecasting, you can estimate what your marginal tax rates may be each year.

If your income puts you in a lower tax bracket now than you foresee you'll be in the future, your best strategy may be to pay at least some of the taxes now.

If however, your future income looks

level or may significantly dip in a given year or in multiple years to come, deferring the distributions from your pre-tax retirement accounts to your low taxation years may be your best strategy.

Just remember to count all sources of income that can hit your tax return.

Then again, if you foresee your retirement account passing on to your heirs, you'd want to take their tax situation into account, as well as the new 10-year rule whereby the account needs to be emptied within a decade of the original account owner's death, if inherited by a non-eligible designated beneficiary (IRS term).

To optimize your tax situation, strategies to consider would include contributions to pre-tax versus Roth accounts, conversions to Roth, optimal order of distribution when pulling money from your financial accounts (should be assessed annually), future Required Minimum Distributions (which are a tax-triggering requirement) and how distribution income may affect other areas of your life such as health insurance premium tax credits or Medicare premiums.

You have control over your tax strategizing. However, paying taxes associated with retirement accounts is inevitable.



Reigniting THE Furnace

Wausau punk band comes home

For those familiar with central Wisconsin's turn-of-thecentury punk scene, musician Tim Benn has exciting news.

This Friday, "your favorite central Wisconsin power pop punk-ish band from 2000-2003," Big, Big Furnace (B2F) will

return to the city where it all began, with a performance slated not for their former venue of choice – the now-closed Rockwater Cyber Cafe — but for an unconventional concert venue: Coral Lanes, a bowling alley in Rothschild.

"[It used to be] you could go out every Friday and Saturday and there were these cool young bands playing at Rockwater," Benn explained. In the two decades since, the area's music scene has dried up, he said, alongside the community's apparent interest in live events. As a result, B2F struggled to find a venue in Wausau willing to host them.

"We were tied really closely to Stevens Point, where it seemed like everyone was in a band. I would say the music scene [back then] was certainly more robust than it is now."

All the same, Benn is excited to bring the band back to their hometown.

"If you didn't see us back then, come see us now," he said.

"We're just one band in millions and we're just trying to make a wave in our little pond, and we just want people to catch that wave."

Consisting of members Tim Benn, Dan Doepke and Matt Loos, Big, Big Furnace formed in Wausau in 1999, taking inspiration from other Midwestern punk bands of the day, such as The Promise Ring and Jimmy Eat World.

"That's who we tried to be," said Benn. "We loved that stuff... That's who we tried to emulate."

B2F disbanded in 2003.

Afterward, Doepke and Loos formed a band based out of Chicago called Divebar, according to the most recent blog post on the band's former website, dated Feb. 5, 2004. Benn, meanwhile, got started on building a recording studio in his and his wife's basement.

And then 20 years passed. Loos moved to Michigan. Benn got a job in insurance. Doepke remains in Chicago.

So how did they get the band back together?

"It's a good story, but it's a sad story," said Benn.

Before B2F, Benn was in a "heavy, psych goth punk" band called Fuzzdolly. Formed in 1994, Fuzdolly became a staple of central Wisconsin's music scene until they eventually disharded

"I've been playing nonstop [since I was 20]," Benn explained. "I've been in a dozen bands."

After Fuzzdolly broke up, Benn lost touch with the other members.

It was the death of former Fuzzdolly member Dan Dieterich in 2021 that brought the rest of the group back together.


"[Dieterich] was an amazing, amazing player," Benn said. "I hadn't talked to the guys in that band since they broke up — probably 20, 25 years."

As the former bandmates caught up, Benn mentioned the recording studio that he'd built in his home — remember that blog post? — as a treat to himself during the COVID-19 lockdown.

"That studio was something I dreamed of building," he said.

One thing led to another, and soon enough, Fuzzdolly had set up a reunion concert at Madison's High Noon Saloon.

"Everything I do goes, like, 100 miles per hour," Benn explained.

"Then, [at the reunion concert,] the guys from Big, Big [Furnace] came in," said Benn. "I hadn't seen those faces in over 20 years. I was like, 'Dan, Matt, what are you guys doing here?'

"And they said, 'We couldn't miss this."

B2F released their first album since their breakup in 2003 last year, a four-song EP titled 20 Solid Gold Classics.

That's just kind of our feel," Benn said of the title. "We don't take ourselves too seriously. We're serious musicians, but we're goofy, tongue-in-cheek guys, and I think that shows."

Later that year, the band released a Christmas single titled "Christmas Without You," and Benn said they have another album's-worth of songs ready to be mastered for a release this year, with more releases to

"When I surround myself with these guys, it's like gasoline and matches," said Benn. "There's a fire here."

He added, "I'm just glad to have pulled them together again."

Benn described B2F's sound as "timeless." "It's not, like, dad rock. The shows are high energy. We're funny — the guys might not think I'm funny, but I think I'm funny. We're goofy, and that's what people love about our shows."

B2F is one of three bands that Benn is currently a member of, alongside Fuzzdolly and an acoustic folk group called Sarah Crow and the Strangers.

"I pour my heart and soul into [making music,]" Benn said. "That studio was something I dreamed of building. I feel like I've got a skillset and a great personality, and people like to work with me, and I just want to give and work with other bands."

He added that when people ask him to play music together after finding out he plays an instrument they're looking for, he "can't say no."

Big, Big Furnace will perform at Coral Lanes LLC in Rothschild this Friday, March 14, at 8 p.m. The show is open to all ages.






