

"Understanding financial principles can significantly improve both personal wellbeing and overall financial stability, and it is crucial in fostering inclusivity within our financial system, ensuring that everyone can participate fully. I encourage all Wisconsinites to take proactive steps in enhancing their own financial literacy and to also lend a hand to others on their personal finance journeys as well."

and education campaign. It is the highlight of April being National Financial Literacy Awareness Month, a collaborative effort by state and federal agencies and private-sector groups working to raise awareness about the importance of financial literacy. In Wisconsin, the Governor's Council on Financial Literacy and Capability, in partnership with the DFI, is spearheading the Money Smart Wisconsin campaign along with many volunteers and organizations throughout the state.

"The Smart Money Wisconsin campaign promotes personal financial literacy and through awareness financial education classes, activities, and opportunities for Wisconsinites bringing together different organizations and facilitating the sharing of expertise, leveraging limited resources, and expanding community participation in financial education efforts," said Governor's Council Chair and SecureFutures President Brenda Campbell.

The Governor's Council convened on April 2 in Milwaukee to kick off the

campaign. Following the meeting, DFI Secretarydesignee Wendy K. Baumann read children's books with essential financial concepts to young students at Bay View Montessori in Milwaukee. The book reading was part of "The Big Read," a statewide effort where adults at dozens of locations will read books with personal finance lessons to children in prekindergarten through fourth grade throughout the month of April as part of the Money Smart Wisconsin campaign. Through these stories, children will be introduced to the fundamental principles of managing money, saving, and budgeting in an accessible and relatable manner.

"The Big Read" nurtures a foundational understanding of financial responsibility and fosters an early appreciation for lifelong financial wellbeing. We have distributed more than 1,000 children's books with personal finance lessons across the state to help local libraries, museums, and community organizations host special activities and events that are geared toward financial

Local Group Purchases Assets of Bull Falls Brewery

The Brewery Plans to Re-Open in Late Spring of 2025

A local investor group, led by Dorchester resident Kurt Mueller and Hartford resident Jason purchased all assets of Bull Falls Brewery, located at 905 East Thomas Street, Wausau. The purchase was confirmed by Judge Suzanne C. O'Neill in late January. Per the terms of the sale, all real estate and personal property, including the brewing equipment transfer to the new ownership group. Work to re-open the brewery began immediately after the announcement of the sale, with a planned re-opening later this spring. Special events such the Never Forgotten Honor Flight fundraiser are also planned to be resumed by the new owners.

Owners New "People ask me, 'Did you



ever think you would own a brewery?"", stated Kurt Mueller, also owner of Critical Dimensions, an architectural firm. answer is 'no' but it would have been a real loss to Wausau's entertainment and brew pub landscape to have Bull Falls converted to something other than a brewery. The Bull Falls brand has strong loyalty and a superb line-up of beers, based on a unique German beer brewing process".

"Re-opening Bull Falls is an opportunity to preserve some of the history and heritage of Wausau and central Wisconsin. The upside is huge as we look to expand our line-up of beers, freshen up the facilities and make the entire property an entertainment destination", said Jason Peck. Recently Peck sold his interest in a HVAC company in southeast Wisconsin and plans to re-locate to Wausau. "I've been an entrepreneur much of my career. Kurt and I are so excited to tackle this challenge to make Bull Falls one of the best brewery destinations in the Midwest", said Peck.

Mueller and Peck plan to add a beer garden, expand food service, upgrade the taproom and potentially replace the tent on the south end of the property with a permanent structure, to support events year-round. "We will be a brew pub first, but a very important part of our business model is to serve great food. We really want to hear what the community wants and marry that with our goal of having a fun, vibrant atmosphere that serves some of the best beer and food in the Midwest", said Peck.

"I really must hand it to Kurt and Jason. For 18 months, they worked to find a path to save Bull Falls and never gave up on the goal to retain a phenomenal brewery in Wausau", said Pat Heier, spokesperson for the buyer. "They have a great vision for what the brewery and the property can offer. The expanded facilities combined with great food service will be something Wausau can be very proud of for years to come.'

Bull Falls experienced financial difficulties during the pandemic and persisted with the changing landscape of alcohol consumption in recent years. According to the Brewers Association, brewery closures outpaced brewery openings nationwide in 2024. "There are certainly challenges in the brewing industry. I think if we can provide an expanded line-up of great beers paired with really good food and lots of opportunity for entertainment both in the taproom and our outside venues, people will love the experience we will provide", said Mueller.

Mueller and Peck plan to re-open the brewery later this spring, with a grand re-opening event also in the planning stages. "We have a lot of work to do to create the new brew pub experience we want but also want to get the brewery open sooner than later as there is a high demand for our beer", said Peck. Plans for off-premise distribution of Bull Falls line-up of beers are also in the works. Mueller and Peck expect to make their beer available to local establishments by Memorial Day weekend.





There has Always Been Something to Worry About

Tariffs, trade wars, inflation, interest rates, government spending, political fighting, foreign wars, ongoing labor shortages, an aging population, social security uncertainty, and so much more.

These all make for sensational headlines, reasons to worry and are the subject of many conversations. Interestingly enough though, there have always been reasons to worry, including worrying about our money.

A quick look back at history reminds us of what we've gotten through as a country and financially. Two World Wars, a great depression, and an attack on American soil in 1941 with the bombing of Pearl Harbor. Consumer goods shortages in 1944, the beginning of the Cold War in 1947, the Soviets detonating an atomic bomb in 1949, and the Korean War in 1950. The Soviets detonated an H-bomb in 1953, Castro seized power in Cuba in 1959, and the Berlin Wall was erected in 1961. The Cuban missile crisis happened in 1962 and President Kennedy was assassinated in 1963. It must have been rather stressful to

live through the late 1960's with the Covid-19 pandemic. We got through Vietnam War and in the 1970's we dealt with Watergate, an oil embargo, an energy crisis and the Three Mile Island nuclear accident.

Inflation ran rampant in the late 1970's and early 1980's, and in 1981, both President Reagan and the Pope were shot. The late 1980's brought the Savings and Loan crisis as well as Black Monday on October 19, 1987 when the stock market fell by 20% in a single day. The fed raised interest rates six times in 1994, and the end of the 90's brought the crash of technology stocks, fears of Y2K and the 9/11 terrorist attacks. The subprime mortgage market melted down, leading to the great recession in 2008. Unemployment hit 10% in 2009 and we faced a "Fiscal Cliff" and downgrade of US debt in 2012. The 20-teens brought hurricanes, trade wars, and then, the infamous

all of it.

I could tell you what a few dollars invested in the stock market would have turned into going all the way back to the beginning of worry, but most of us don't have that kind of time horizon. An interesting 10 year segment is 1968-1978, when the S&P 500 began at 96.47 and ended right back where it started, at 96.11, the epitome of a flat decade. That may lead one to worry that investing during those ten years would have gotten them nowhere. However, had one invested \$10,000 in stocks to mirror the S&P 500 during that time frame and reinvested their dividends, their ten grand would have grown to \$15,174.

A disciplined investment strategy includes remembering that when headlines sizzle and markets gyrate, we recall that there has always been something to worry about.





Forerunner: Lambeau gets jump start on Draft process

"In the early 1930s there was no Draft system. It was pretty much a free-for-all, as far as free agency goes," said Packers Hall of Fame Curator Brent Hensel.

Hensel gave Packers Head Coach Curly Lambeau much of the credit for the foundation of the Draft.

"He was really ahead of the game in the Draft. He realized quickly, actually, probably by accident. He started scouting some of the college players in the All Star games as early as 1930, and what I mean by accident...Curly liked to head out to California, out to the West Coast, and he started going to the East-West Shrine game. Just by accident, he realized, 'Hey, I can learn a lot about some great college players.' He ends up drafting them and it becomes a huge advantage for him, while others really didn't have any kind of scouting system, or (an idea of) how to look at prospects other than when they went to the Draft," Hensel said.

"So usually on New Year's Day, he would go back and watch several major college all-star games. In fact, in 1936, Lambeau and his second wife drove out from Green Bay to San Francisco, arriving on Dec. 26, and he would watch this East-West Shrine game and it influenced his first couple of picks."

In the Jan. 19, 1951

edition of the San Francisco Examiner, Sports Editor Curley Grieve calls Lambeau the "smartest builder of pro football clubs."

"As far as the pros are concerned, I discovered the East-West game. There was a time when I had it all to myself. I came out here annually and built my team. I have missed only one game since it started," Lambeau told Grieve.

"It was back in 1925 that I signed the first of my greats-Lavvie Dilweg of Marquette. Then came long series—players like Clarke Hinkle of Bucknell, Hank Bruder and Tiny Ingebretsen of Northwestern, Cecil Isbell or Purdue. Whatever success I had at Green Bay was due almost entirely to the East-West game. I never heard of some of the

players who later starred for me until I saw them in action at Kezar. The Shrine game was—and still is—an All-America showcase. I owe my reputation to it."

Hensel said that in Lambeau's first Draft—in 1936—two of his top three choices played on the West squad.

Packers Lineman Russ Letlow—No. 1 choice and seventh overall selection in the first NFL Draft—holds the distinction of being the Packers' first-ever draft pick.

Packers End Bernie Scherer was the second.
