So ask yourself: What do I stand for? And what will I no longer stand by and watch?





# Nowak named Wausau HR director



The City of Wausau announced late last week that Lisa Nowak has been selected as the city's new director of human resources.

Nowak previously served as the head of human resources at Foundation Finance Company, a company headquartered in Schofield that operates in 32 states.

Additionally, Nowak holds a Master of Science in Human Resource Development and a Master Certificate in Human Resource Business Partnership from Villanova University, an Augustinian Catholic university in Pennsylvania.

A press release sent from the office of Doug Diny states that Nowak's appointment reflects the City of Wausau's commitment to fostering a strong, supportive and forward-thinking workplace culture. The press release also states that Nowak looks forward

to advancing key HR initiatives and working closely with city leadership to support and empower Wausau's dedicated municipal workforce.

## Diny appoints four to Ethics Board

On Monday, Mayor Doug Diny announced four new appointments to the city Ethics Board.

The appointees are Lon Roberts, former president of Wausau's Ruder Ware law firm; Dr. Thomas Garver, a retired orthopedic surgeon at the Marshfield Clinic; Debra Hadley, retired co-owner of Hadley Office Products; and Kevin Hermening, a private wealth advisor based in Wausau.

Roberts also served as secretary of the Department of Financial Institutions and chairman of Wisconsin's Public Service Commission under former governor Scott Walker.

"These are well-respected, qualified individuals who will serve the city with distinction in this capacity," said Diny in a press release.

These appointees are intended to take the places of four current members whose terms are set to expire on April 30.

After being appointed by the mayor, board members must be confirmed by the City Council. Due to the ongoing investigation by the current Ethics Board into an alleged ethics violation against Diny, however, whether the City Council will approve these replacements remains up in the air.

Diny's hearing is scheduled for April 30. State precedent allows current Ethics Board members to continue to serve until the council approves their replacements.

#### Art in Flight

On April 21, the Wausau School District unveiled student art exhibit Art in Flight at the Central Wisconsin Airport.

The project was the brainchild of Wausau West High School senior Sadie Peissig, who presented the idea to the Central Wisconsin Joint Airport Board and collaborated with the art departments at Wausau West and East High Schools to bring it to life.

"We were incredibly impressed with

Sadie's vision and initiative," said Airport Board Chair Chris Dickinson. "The project not only brings beauty to our terminal, but it also highlights the passion and skill of local students. It's a perfect example of community partnership."

The exhibit features works from student artists at both high schools, capturing a range of styles and perspectives.

"I wanted to create something that connects our community and showcases the incredible talent we have in our school," said Peissig. "Travelers coming through the airport now have a chance to experience that creativity in a meaningful and inspiring way."

The installation will remain on display for one year, after which it will be updated with new student art.

#### Weston man named Trail Steward of the Year

The Ice Age Trail Alliance named Weston resident Jerry Krause the 2025 Trail Steward of the Year on April 12, citing Krause's hard work, dedication and skill alongside hundreds of volunteer hours dedicated to trail maintenance over the last year.

The Trail Steward of the Year Award honors individuals whose work in any phase of Trail management contributes in 'an extraordinary manner' to the development and care of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail, according to a press release from the Ice Age Trail Alliance. It celebrates excellence in trail planning, design, construction, maintenance, landowner and partner relations and stewardship work.

Over the last year, Krause contributed more than 800 volunteer hours to the Ice Age Trail, over 600 of which were devoted to maintenance, working as a tool manager and segment container for the organization's Central Moraines chapter and supporting major construction efforts across the state.

"Jerry is the kind of volunteer every organization dreams of: humble, dependable and skilled," said Ice Age Trail Alliance Executive Director and CEO Luke Kloberdanz. "He shows up early, stays late and brings a quiet leadership that inspires everyone around him."

The alliance also noted Krause's technical know-how and craftsmanship, which make him a go-to resource when complex construction projects arise. He has led multiple Eagle Scout projects and worked closely with two WisCorp crews over the past year, sharing his expertise and "instilling Trail values in the next generation of conservation stewards," according to the group's press release.

"Krause is a trusted presence for staff and volunteers alike," reads the press release. "Just a phone call away, he routinely arrives early to prep projects and sticks around after the work is done to tie up loose ends — often serving as a reliable, on-theground partner when staff is unavailable."

In addition to volunteering for the alliance and creating and maintaining the trail, Krause is also an Ice Age Trail Thousand Miler, meaning he completed the entire Ice Age Trail by section hiking it in 2016.

#### **Driver dies in Norrie crash**

An Iola man died in a one-car crash in Norrie last weekend.

The Marathon County Communication Center received a call about the crash on County Road N, east of County Road Y, at 9:07 a.m. Saturday morning.

Police identified the driver as 48-year-old James Michael Kemp from Iola. He was the only occupant of the vehicle.

The Marathon County Sheriff's Office was assisted by Birnamwood Fire and EMS and the Medical Examiner's Office.

No other information on the incident is being released by law enforcement at this time. Further updates will be provided via the Marathon County Sheriff's Office Facebook page.

## Stay scam literate during the Draft

As the Draft gets underway in Green Bay and visitors flood the state from across the country, the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) continues to advise consumers on keeping their personal information safe from scammers.

DATCP has released a guide for travelers who plan to use buses, shuttles, rideshares or even their own vehicles around Green Bay this week.

With a variety of commute options available, DATCP warns, scammers may use this opportunity to sell fake transit tickets, reservations and passes. To avoid falling prey to scams, DATCP advises visitors to refer to official information related to parking and transportation services, noting that Green Bay Metro will operate a free bus route from Downtown Green Bay to the Draft event grounds; the Brown County Tavern League will provide free shuttles from participating bars, restaurants and other member establishments directly to visitors' rented lodging; there will be dedicated pick-up and drop-off locations for rideshare services like Uber and Lyft; and traditional taxi services will be available during the Draft.

Most Draft attendees are expected to drive to Green Bay, which DATCP notes makes them vulnerable to additional scams. Some parking meters rely on QR codes for ease of transactions, but QR codes are also vulnerable to tampering. Scammers can place fraudulent QR code stickers, sometimes over valid QR codes, to mislead consumers. Consumers should check QR codes closely for possible tampering. After scanning, they should double-check the web address and whether the payment portal matches the parking company's branding. Much of the available parking during the Draft will belong to Green Bay residents renting out parking spaces in front of their homes or businesses. To combat scammers posing as parking attendants for these spaces, research parking areas in advance and have several options in mind, including backups in case their top choices are unavailable. If possible, pay with a credit card to take advantage of built-in fraud protections, but have cash available if needed.

Even after the Draft, keep an eye out for fake parking tickets or emails or texts instructing you to pay supposed fines. Paying a fake ticket will cost you money and expose your personal information, creating a risk of identity theft. If you believe a charge may be real, contact the relevant law enforcement agency for verification directly by using non-emergency contact information.

A recent version of this scam threatened consumers with unpaid tolls instead of parking tickets. The Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles has similarly warned consumers to be suspicious of unsolicited emails or messages from unknown senders, especially those asking for money.





## "Together we are stronger than anyone individually." - NANCY KENNEDY BARNETT

**Eighty years after the Holocaust**, survivors and their descendants continue to share their stories, reminding us of the importance of learning from history.

On April 17, students from six area high schools gathered at the Grand Theater to hear testimonies from two women whose lives were shaped by zealous hatred.

Eva Zaret was eight years old when the Nazis invaded Hungary and changed life as she knew it forever.

Nancy Kennedy Barnett, the daughter of a Holocaust survivor, grew up searching for the relatives she'd lost in the movies she watched with her family.

The speakers had traveled to Wausau with the Nathan and Esther Pelz Holocaust Education Resource Center (HERC), based in Milwaukee, for a presentation organized by Maria Prust, a teacher at D.C. Everest.

"The school I work at does 'you matter' days with our students, and our theme for spring is 'live to give," said Prust. "I couldn't think of a better way for our students to understand how these two women are living to give and giving back and sharing their family stories and their personal stories, so that started it."

The idea grew to include multiple high schools. As an average high school auditorium wouldn't be large enough to accommodate the number of students they were planning for, Prust suggested the Grand.

The presentation coincided with many of the students' curriculums. Sophomores at D.C. Everest, for example, recently read Romanian Holocaust survivor Elie Wiesel's haunting memoir, *Night*.

The accounts of Barnett and Zaret — told alongside photos of their families before and after the Holocaust and footage of Barnett's father, George Kennedy, describing his experience — were just as haunting.

"If the Nazis had been successful, I wouldn't be here," Barnett told the darkened room. Her father survived the Holocaust through a combination of keeping his wits about him and sheer luck, but most of his relatives lost their lives.

"Although the Holocaust happened over 80 years ago, the dehumanization at its center still exists today," said Barnett. Her father had been fond of the saying 'those who don't remember the past will be doomed to repeat it' and fought to spread awareness of what had been done to him and millions like him in order to prevent it from happening again.

"Cruel happenings, cruel people," Kennedy says in one of Barnett's recordings. "You cannot imagine any nationality would do it... but it can happen again."

The key to preventing it, Barnett said, is to speak out against injustices "at the very beginning," before they can snowball into events as widespread as the Holocaust.

Zaret expressed similar sentiments.

"I am very against hatred and very much for people to love each other and to respect each other," Zaret said.

Zaret still has nightmares about the crimes she witnessed as a child, and every time she testifies about her experience, it puts her right back in those eightyear-old's shoes. She speaks out anyway, she

said, to fight for a more loving world.

"I say that I won, not Hitler, not the Nazis," said Zaret, because she has a large, wonderful family, friends who love her and the power of knowledge.

"I say life and people [are] wonderful," she said. "I love people. I want to bring you in with love. And when I see my whole family together, I say, "This is good.' We all deserve good and no hatred."

And if it means Zaret needs to fight to create that good, then she will.

"If you see the wrong thing, get involved. No bullying," Zaret said. She is adamantly anti-bullying.

"To respect a person sometimes brings out the best in a person," she continued. "You have to do... good things. To do good things is for the whole world."

HERC Director of Education Sam Goldberg wrapped up the session with a Q&A with the speakers.

"We learn history because we want to see the warning signs [and prevent the Holocaust from happening again]," Goldberg said. "We want advocates."

As for Prust, she hoped to see students walk away with the importance of one person's act of kindness making a difference.

"I've heard Eva speak before, and that's one of the things that she talks about, is that one person's act of kindness can make a difference," she said. "I think [students] need to

be reminded of that, because sometimes they think they're just, 'I'm just a teenager and what I do doesn't matter."

"If one person will do the right thing once, you save a life," Zaret said.






