

United Way met their goal of beating last year's Lottsa Pasta collection record by 1,000 pounds.

Hunger Coalition to prepare it for distribution. More than 20 businesses participated in the drive.

Sex offender released

The Wausau Police Department announced the release of convicted sex offender John Marg from prison on May 2.

Marg will be monitored by Sex Offender Agent Specialists based out of the Marathon County Courthouse, will be tracked with a Department of Corrections GPS and will be on a highly restricted schedule consisting of time out in the community for work and treatment, according to the official media bulletin.

Marg will initially live in Transitional Housing in the 600 block of Jefferson St., Wausau, with his address and status to be updated regularly and available online through Wisconsin's Sex Offender Registry at https://appsdoc.wi.gov/public.

Public invited to discuss WIS 52

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation will hold a public involvement meeting on Wednesday, May 14 to discuss proposed options for the WIS 52 improvement project.

The proposed project will include repaving the road, rebuilding pedestrian curb ramps to comply with ADA standards, replacing curbs and gutters and improving intersections.

The meeting will be held at 5 p.m. at the Horace Mann Middle School cafeteria, with a presentation scheduled for 5:30, followed by an open house.

Steer clear of deer

Late spring brings with it a rise in deerrelated crashes across the state, according to the Wisconsin State Patrol. While Marathon County was fortunate not to number among the top 10 counties for crashes last year, deer can already be seen littering the sides of county roads.

To avoid hitting a deer, keep your eyes on the road, drive at a safe speed and eliminate distractions — yes, that means putting the phone down.

"Deer can be erratic and hard to spot, so it's important that drivers are looking ahead and paying close attention to the sides of the road," said Wisconsin State Patrol Superintendent Tim Carnahan in a Wednesday press release. "Spring and fall are the times when we see the most deer crashes. Everyone on the road should be on the watch."

Carefully scan the road ahead, including the area around it. If one deer appears, watch for more and honk your horn to encourage them away from the road.

Also, use your headlights in the early morning and evening hours. Most deer crashes happen then, as the day transitions to night and deer become harder to see.

If you can't avoid hitting a deer, brake firmly and stay in your lane. Swerving can result in a loss of control and a more serious crash. Afterward, get your vehicle safely off of the road if possible.

If someone is hurt or the deer is in the middle of the road, call 911. If not, contact local law enforcement on the non-emergency line, staying buckled up inside your vehicle while you wait for help to arrive. Never get out of your car and walk along the road or attempt to move an injured deer.

Motorcyclists have a higher risk of injury or death in a deer-related accident. If you can't avoid hitting a deer with your motorcycle and there is enough space to swerve around it without leaving your lane, brake and adjust course as needed.

Think spring! As winter fades, our focus shifts from snow-covered landscapes to the promise of summer—and the future of Wausau.

This past winter brought less snow than usual, potentially allowing us to reallocate \$250,000 originally earmarked for snow removal toward much-needed street paving and repairs. I encourage the Finance Committee to address this opportunity promptly so we can prepare for the upcoming construction season.

Downtown, the Foundry on 3rd project is progressing well, transforming the former Wausau Center Mall site into a vibrant mixed-use development with 154 marketrate apartments and commercial spaces. This initiative is pivotal in revitalizing our city center. As we envision the businesses that will occupy the ground floor, one idea stands out: attracting a Trader Joe's.


Trader Joe's has successfully integrated into urban settings, such as its location on Monroe Street in Madison, situated beneath a four-story residential building. They describe themselves as a neighborhood grocery store offering unique products like Mandarin Orange Chicken and Cold Brew Coffee Concentrate, alongside everyday

essentials—all at competitive prices. Such a store could serve not only our downtown residents but also draw visitors from the region, revitalizing the area and utilizing existing infrastructure like the former mall's parking ramps. I have briefly discussed this concept with developer Terrance Wall. While bringing Trader Joe's to Wausau would be ambitious, it's a goal worth pursuing. However, we must acknowledge the challenges: our local taxes are high, average incomes are modest, and population growth is stagnant. To attract businesses like Trader Joe's, we need to create a more favorable business climate.


The Foundry on 3rd is a catalyst for change, but without a concerted effort to improve our economic environment, we risk missing this opportunity. I urge the council to prioritize enhancing our business climate to ensure the success of such transformative projects.

Lastly, regarding ongoing legal matters: I remain confident in a favorable resolution.

Nonetheless, we must not allow these issues to distract us from our primary responsibilities. Our focus should remain on the city's development and the opportunities



Last month, Wausau received a shout from the official Red Lobster Facebook account — not to announce a muchrequested addition to the city, but because of a stunt outside of the company's headquarters involving a plane, a banner and first-name basis with their CEO.

"Damola, Wausau WI loves Red Lobster! Please? XO," read the banner, black letters bold against a clear blue sky. It was attached to a plane that, when not advertising for businesses, tends to fly marriage proposals.

The message was the latest — and possibly the last in a long series of schemes cooked up by Paul Grinsel and Ryan Gallagher, hosts of weekly "biz-fotainment" podcast the Wausau Business Show (WBS.) Grinsel and Gallagher crafted the message on the air, working with the plane's pilot over the phone to maximize its impact within their chosen medium's constraints.

"If this doesn't do it, we give up," said Ginsel on the podcast before the stunt — 'it' being bringing a Red Lobster to Wausau.

It's a running joke, apparently. In polls by the city in both $% \left\{ 1,2,...,n\right\}$ 2012 and 2018 asking residents which national restaurant chain they would like to come to Wausau, respondents overwhelmingly voted for Red Lobster.

There have even been a clawful of false alarms over the last decade about the arrival of the crimson crustacean within Wausau, including a 2021 April Fools prank by a local auto repair shop involving a "Future home of Red Lobster" sign in Weston.

"It's a long-standing joke," explained a Wausonian on the r/wisconsin Reddit. "Any time a building that resembles a restaurant starts construction, everyone is like, 'Red Lobster!' I have no clue how it started, but it has been that way for years."

Grinsel and Gallagher began their own campaign last April, shortly before Red Lobster filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy in May.

In a bid to "help Wausau save Red Lobster" amidst the company's shrimp-induced financial woes, the pair organized a "Lobster Bus" trip, shuttling locals to Green Bay on a Lamers bus to eat at the nearest Red Lobster. The trip was about 90 miles each way, with proceeds from its \$125 tickets going toward the Community Foundation of North-Central Wisconsin in a move that led the hosts to label their show "highly philanthropic" in a tongue-incheek press release.

They've rallied some of Wausau's biggest names for the cause: Wausau West High Schooler Nolan Travis, who performed on Broadway last year following a Jimmy Award nomination for his role in the school's production of *Man of La Mancha*, lent his voice to a "Red Lobster musical" cooked up by the pair; Mayor Doug Diny contributed a read through of the Red Lobster menu that, in its final edited form, is almost moving.

They've even attempted to get non-Wausonians in on the scheme. After celebrity Red Lobster-head and philanthropist Flavor Flav's own viral stunt to save the chain, in which he posted a photo of himself next to a table full of everything on the chain's menu, Grinsel shouted him out.

"Thank you for being on our team, Flava!" Grinsel said. "We love you nearly as much as those cheddar biscuits!"

And then, of course, there's their most recent stunt, the airplane, an attempt to nab the attention of Red Lobster CEO Damola Adamolekun.

"It worked," said Gallagher in the WBS episode following the stunt. $\,$

"We did it," said Grinsel.

"Damola himself acknowledged the banner," said Gallagher.

They expressed that they're "currently working on getting an interview [with Adamolekun] set up" and that "it's looking promising."



In another show of Wausonian dedication to the bit (the bib?), Grinsel and Gallagher joined a resident while he had the Red Lobster logo on his thigh.

Red Lobster, however, still has no plans to open a location in Wausau.

"If there's one city that's gonna save you, Red Lobster, it's Wausau, Wisconsin," Gallager said.

A brief summary of the "Red Lobster Saga" can be found on the WBS site at https://wausaubusiness.com/red-lobstersaga, but it's only the tip of Wausau's overa-decade-old Red Lobster iceberg. Gallagher and Grinsel, with their marketing knowhow and drive to cause mischief, have simply made the biggest splash in the ocean of national consciousness.

Whether it amounts to anything more than a series of wildly entertaining marketing stunts disguised as pranks — or is it the other way around? — is up to the tides.





Establishing Ownership Structure

Understanding your options for joint ownership is important. Once selected, the ownership structure needs to be reflected on the property deed.

Under joint tenancy, each co-owner has an equal and undivided interest in the property. Upon the death of one owner, their share automatically passes to the surviving owner.

Under tenants in common, each co-owner holds a certain share of the property, which can be equal or unequal. If the deed does not specify percentages, the co-owners are considered to have equal ownership. When one owner dies, their share passes according to their estate plan.
