Dream of owning a bookstore takes to the road

Jessica Golisch always dreamed of owning a bookstore. "It's kind of been my dream forever to have a bookstore," Jessica said, explaining how she and her husband Luke turned that dream into reality this spring with the creation of a mobile bookstore business.

The idea came to them this past March when economic concerns made a traditional storefront seem out of reach. "We didn't think that with the economy and everything right now that we could do an actual physical storefront," Jessica said. "You know, everything's so expensive."

That's when Luke suggested using a trailer he already owned. "He was like, well, what if we just put it in here and went around everywhere," Jessica said. "And so we just went for it."

The couple converted the trailer into a rolling bookstore, complete with shelves secured by tension rods to keep books in place during transport.

The Golisch's first event was this past Saturday at Graff Mercantile in Rothschild, where the Mobile Bookstore's trailer joined a monthly outdoor market near the Rothschild Pavilion. The debut proved successful, especially with their "blind date with a book" packages.

The Sczygelski Farm Products stand, which Katie started last August, is set up to be self-serve and is typically stocked with products on Fridays and Saturdays and sometimes Sundays. Katie said she has a Facebook page for the business, listed as Sczygelski Farm Products, and she posts whenever she is open. "Saturdays for sure. Sometimes Fridays," she said. "Sundays also just depending on sales, how busy it is for me, and what we are doing that weekend."



Katie's husband, Cole, farms the property, with cows on the property during the summer months. During the fall months, he also offers deer corn for sale.





PUBLISHER'S LETTER

Unto Dust...

Dear Reader,

In the final accounting, when the ledger of dust and grains of sand, something

of our days closes and the last breath escapes like a whisper into the void, what remains of us? We who once walked with purpose, loved with abandon, and dreamed beyond the confines of our mortal shells—what becomes of all that we were?

The body, once a vessel of consciousness and desire,

returns to its elemental state. Skin that felt the warmth of summer suns and the tender touch of loved ones dissolves. Bones that carried us through decades of striving and stumbling crumble into the same dust from which all life emerges. We are reduced to our most basic components, indistinguishable from the earth that receives us.

Our possessions, those objects we accumulated and cherished, outlive us for a time. Books with dog-eared pages. Photographs fading at the edges. Heirlooms passed down with stories attached. But eventually, these too deteriorate, are discarded, or lose their connection to those who once gave them meaning. The material monuments to our existence erode under time's relentless passage.

The institutions we built, the companies we labored for, the organizations we championed—these may persist beyond our individual spans, but they transform. merge, dissolve, reinvent themselves until our fingerprints upon them become unrecognizable. Even civilizations, those grand collective projects of humanity, rise and fall like tides, leaving only fragments for future archaeologists to piece together.

Is this, then, the final word on human existence? A brief flare of consciousness between two infinite darknesses? A temporary arrangement of atoms that, once scattered, can never be reassembled in quite the same way?

Perhaps not.



"It's like a surprise book wrapped up," Jessica said of the popular item. Each package includes "a book wrapped up with just a little blurb about it and then stickers and a bookmark and some book tabs and a highlighter." The concept was such a hit that "we sold out of all but one."

The mobile bookstore stocks both hardcover and paperback books in various genres, plus a dedicated children's section and young adult titles. Some books came from donations.

while others are purchased from readers. "A lot were donated and then a lot have been bought from other readers," Jessica said.

Pricing is reasonable, with most paperbacks between \$6 and \$8, while hardcovers run around \$10. Most children's books are priced under \$5. "[We're] trying to keep everything really affordable," Jessica said.

The business also sells stickers (50 cents each), bookmarks, and corner bookmarks made by Erin Wickman, Jessica's mother. A few items are ordered wholesale.

Jessica and Luke plan to operate primarily during summer and fall months, and at events like craft fairs in Merrill and Cedar Creek scheduled for October and November. "We'll kind of see how those go and see if we want to do some more throughout the winter or just wait 'til spring,' Jessica said.

The learning process continues as they figure out logistics. "We just had our first event on Saturday, so it was kind of a learning curve," she said. But the family business includes their three daughters-Ruby, 4; Isla, who turns 6 this week; and Nora, 8who all helped at their first

"My kids like to help," Jessica said. "They were here on Saturday."

This coming Saturday, the Mobile Book Store will be at the Food Truck-a-Palooza event at the Merrill Fair Grounds.

For now, the Golisches remain open to possibilities as the Mobile Bookstore finds its footing. "It's all very new and we don't quite know what to expect, so we're kind of just gonna see how it goes," Jessica said. "We're kind of up in the air, very open to—to kind of anything at this point."

Geiss Meat Service brings home awards from state competition

Andy Geiss and his team at Geiss Meat Service have plenty to celebrate after the 86th annual convention of the Wisconsin Association of Meat Processors (WAMP) held in Madison on April 11, 2025.

The local meat market earned 16 total awards and five honorable mentions out of 45 products entered in the Meat Product Show held in conjunction with the convention, the state's largest meat product competition. With individual products entered meat processing plants and markets throughout Wisconsin, the competition was fierce.

"Learning this role for the past year, has been a new experience," said Geiss, currently serves as president of the Wisconsin Association of Meat Processors. "I couldn't ask for a better group of fun and educated people surrounding all of us, to help become better [meat processing] plants for the consumers and for the growth of our business."

Geiss Meat Service took first place in four categories: traditional smoked and cured bratwurst for their smoked brats, cured and smoked poultry for their smoked chicken, large diameter luncheon meat for their bologna, and small diameter smoked and cooked sausage for their mettwurst.

They captured second place for their maple links in the fresh breakfast sausage category, dried beef





in the dry and smoked beef category, braunschweiger in the braunschweiger category, and liver ring in the specialty ring sausage category.

Third place went to their smoked badger brat in the specialty smoked and cured bratwurst category, while fourth place finishes came for their chicken BBQ pizza brat, semi-boneless ham, restructured jerky, and ring bologna.

The shop also earned honorable mentions for smoked turkey, traditional ham, peppered bologna, chili cheese wieners, and venison pork bacon.

Overall, Geiss took second place for the Total Excellence Award among fellow plants—a significant achievement considering the competition included operations from across the state.

"To run smoother and




efficiently. Joining these statewide plants, gathering as a family is the best thing I could be a part of," Geiss said.

Over 40 judges, including food scientists, out-of-state meat processors, and other food industry professionals, evaluated the entries during the session. The competition showcases the significant role that sausage and processed meats play in Wisconsin's meat industry.

Michelle Kussow. lobbyist for WAMP who daily monitors legislative and regulatory activities at the state level for issues that would affect the meat processing industry, was also at the convention. She and her team work directly with the WAMP Board of Directors to identify key issues affecting the industry and to proactively advocate for legislation that helps its members. Suppliers also attended to showcase new equipment and ideas to help meat processors with all parts of their operations, from the office to the processing floor, Geiss said.






