

DCE students refurbish pontoon

Since May, members of the D.C. Everest Fishing Team and students from DCE High School who were enrolled in the Auto Service Fundamentals class have been working to refurbish a pontoon boat to better accommodate students with disabilities.

The idea for the project came from Elizabeth Mammano who is the DCE Senior High Kitchen Coordinator and Cocoach of the DCE FIshing Team. Each year for her birthday, Mammano asks local organizations to help raise funds for a neighborhood non-profit or charity.

Mammano said her goal is to, "get as many community members involved so that together we all give back something great in our own town to help neighbors in need."

One of Mammano's projects had been to raise money for the DCE Fishing Team in order to purchase a used pontoon boat.

She said her hope for the boat is to, "make it handicap accessible so that all students can fish independently."

Chad Pegenkopf, the instructor of the class, said that students tore the pontoon apart and have reconstructed it. The process included polishing, installing new carpets and powder coating the metal surfaces. They also changed the seating arrangement to allow for better accessibility.





When members of the CTech Manufacturing Director Team visited the school, they noticed what the class was working on, and decided to lend a hand. Cindy Mayer, a member of the Greater Wausau Area Chamber of Commerce Transformational Leadership program said they raised more than \$1,000 to support the restoration project. They also worked with a CTech vendor to have the pontoon seats reupholstered, at no cost to the project.


"This boat will not only build a sense of pride for the team members, but also for the students who rebuilt it, the faculty members who made it possible, every person who donated money

and our District. That's my Everest Pride," said Mammano.



Raspberry Thorn tattoo studio will be helping to support Marathon County's United Way Hunger Coalition through September. Each time a customer gets a hand poked carrot tattoo, Raspberry Thorn will donate the proceeds. The studio specializes in hand poked tattoos where ink and a needle is manually used instead of a tattoo machine. The newly opened tattoo studio is located near downtown Wausau.

Rachel Mattson is the owner of Raspberry Thorn which





a private tattoo studio that focuses on a personalized and deliberate approach to tattooing. Mattson claims to be one of the few artists in Wisconsin that specializes in hand poke. The process is generally less invasive and tends to be less painful and have quicker healing times compared to machine tattoos, according to Mattson.

Options for the fundraiser include a small carrot flash tattoo for one hour priced at \$120, and a large carrot flash tattoo for three hours priced at \$300.

Slow your mow, says City of Wausau

The City of Wausau says that this summer people should consider reducing the amount of times they cut their lawn. Doing so can help provide shelter and food for pollinators. Having an over-manicured lawn can kill native plants while encouraging invasive plants to thrive.

Keeping the grass long also helps conserve water, which helps reduce dry spells and can cut down on costs associated with keeping the lawn green. When mowing, consider leaving the grass clippings on the lawn so the nutrients can return to the soil. Overall, decreasing the amount of mowing can help out the plants and animals that call Wausau their home.

No Mow May can be an introduction to more sustainable gardening practices, such as reducing mowing frequency or planting pollinator-friendly plants. Intentionally planting pollinator friendly plants, such as milkweed, is also helpful especially to the monarch butterfly population which are currently listed as threatened under the Endangered Species Act

Successful boat launching tips

Wisconsin's DNR recently shared tips on their social media about how to have a successful boat launch. Some advice included making sure vehicle mirrors are adjusted. Consider practice backing up in a large space. Having a spotter is helpful to guide the driver while backing up.

Make small corrections to avoid over-correcting. Over-correcting happens when a driver makes steering adjustments that are too large or too frequent, causing the trailer to swing erratically which can lead to collisions. Patience and kindness is always the best attitude when heading off to a day of boating.

The Wisconsin DNR is also out doing boat registration and license checks. Boaters who are over 16 years old, and were born on or after January 1, 1989, must carry a valid Boating Safety Certificate approved by the state.

Movie in the Park kicks off

Wausau's 400 block will begin hosting their annual Movie in the Park series again this year. Starting on June 19, the 400 block will be home to an outdoor movie on select Thursdays from June through August. The movies are organized by the Wausau & Marathon County Parks, Recreation & Forestry Department.

The first movie showing will be Moana 2. There are six movies scheduled for this summer, including Moana 2, The Wild Robot, Transformers One, Toy Story, Wicked and A Minecraft Movie, all weather dependent. The events begin at 7 p.m. The full movie schedule and more information is listed on the Wausau Parks Department Facebook page.

CWETA announces 24-hour musical bash

For those with theater experience, putting together a complete musical in only 24 hours might be an intimidating prospect, but the Central Wisconsin Educational Theater Alliance (CWETA) is determined to make it happen.

This July, CWETA will host its first-ever 24-Hour Musical Fundraiser, in which participants will be given 24 hours to put together one of five musicals voted on by the community.

The program is open to students aged 13–20, with opportunities available for both cast and crew, with a

registration fee of \$75 per participant. Participants will receive lunch, snacks and drinks, and a swag bag that includes a T-shirt and "other goodies," according to the description on CWETA's website.

Community members can also contribute by voting from a selection of musicals on the CWETA website, with higher donations netting higher numbers of votes. Ten votes can be cast for \$10, while a \$100 donation will grant a voter 250 votes.

The final performance will take place at 7 p.m. on July 11 at the Tebo & Tilly event venue, 745 Scott St.

Prepare for more road work

Starting on May 27 to July 3, portions of the WIS 34 Interchange will be closed. Including the southbound exit ramp, southbound entrance ramps and WIS 34 from County DB to the NB ramps. There will be a posted detour for traffic to follow.

Crews will be continuing to work on highway 1-39 until August 7, said WisDOT. During this time, guardrails are being repaired and replaced, culverts are being repaired, roads are being repaired and shoulders are being graveled.

According to WisDOT, during Memorial Day Weekend all lanes of traffic were opened, and lane closures are not anticipated to start again until June 2.



Retirement, like a Rubik's Cube

We meet with a substantial number of people each year who are preparing for retirement. If you are planning on retiring, the thought of structuring your retirement income plan can feel like trying to solve a Rubik's cube. On one side of the cube is your 401(k). On another, your pension. Flip the cube over and there is your social security. The other sides of the cube are your spouse's 401(k), IRA, and his/her social security. Solving for one color can feel daunting in and of itself. For example, you typically have four options when trying to decide what to do with your 401(k), each having different rules and tax implications. You may open the availability of choices to investments that did not exist in your 401(k). Distribution rules vary depending upon the type of retirement account, something you may not have considered during the accumulation phase when you didn't have to concern yourself with anything other than contributions and rates of return. Just when you solve for the 401(k) color, flip over to another side and you have decisions to make for social security, another color. What is the best age to begin social security? What is the best way to claim? On your own benefit, your spouse's benefit, on a divorced spousal option or widow or widowers' benefit? Then there are pension decisions representing



another color: is it best to select a joint option that covers both lives, or take the larger single life option and purchase a life insurance policy in the event that the pension recipient dies before their spouse?

It is obviously important to know the options, consequences and rules of each "side" of your retirement Rubik's cube. Your and your spouse's 401(k), IRAs, pension and social security are important each and of themselves. But the best retirement plans are put together solving for the entire puzzle. How and when you take your social security, for example, will definitely affect when and how much money you will use from your own personal investments. My professional pet peeve is when a source of so called "advice" gets people to focus on only one of these sides of the cube. Articles written on the mathematics of social security and potentially how to get the most out of the program are great if that is all you are concerned with. Seminars selling a one-size-fits all investment to everyone who shows up for a free dinner obviously dismiss the fact that circumstances are different from one individual to the next. Co-workers who will tell you that a particular pension option is always the

best, really have no clue how that benefit election will affect individuals differently based upon the other sides of their cube. In fact, that is entirely the reason that different options exist. Options were put into place not to try and trick you, but to give you the opportunity to calculate what is best for you. It's much easier to solve for only one side of the cube than it is the entire cube. My point has become obvious by now. About the only retirement advice that I can give to everyone unequivocally, is to make sure that you are not messing up "blue" when you are paying attention to the "red" or "yellow" sides of your retirement Rubik's cube. 



Amidst construction, businesses still see traffic



This Memorial Day, putting this week's paper together from an empty office — the rest of the *City Pages* team had taken the holiday off — I thought about previous Memorial Days I'd spent on the clock.

Before I wrote for *City Pages*, I worked in fast food. At the restaurant where I formerly worked, holidays came with a drop in business so sharp that those of us working shifts that day would kill time by playing Hangman or doodling on the ceramic tile walls with dry-erase markers.

In a city the size of Wausau — a city with its share of chains — there's no such thing as a universal day off. Somewhere, someone will be on the clock, and in their times of direst boredom, they'll entertain themselves by any means necessary.

This was the premise I had in mind when I set off along Washington Street — what of it I could access amidst the road-closing construction for phase two of the city's Mall Redevelopment Project. While sidewalks are still open and walkable, construction doesn't make for the most scenic of holiday strolls. Surely, I thought, construction would make businesses already quiet due to the holiday even quieter.

I was wrong.

Amanda Boid will have worked at HOM Furniture for one year this summer. It was her first Memorial Day in the furniture industry.

Before that, she worked as a bartender.

"I grew up in Florida, so we were always busy [on Memorial Day]," she explained. "This is prime vacation time right now, so I mean, you were lucky if you could get in a restaurant without being on an hour wait, which I'm sure is different up in the Northwoods, because everybody goes camping.

"But as far as furniture?" Boid considered the question. "Seems to be a little crazy."

With a handful of customers wandering the sales floor around 2 p.m., HOM Furniture wasn't exactly bustling, but compared to recent traffic to the store, it might as well have been.

"When I first started, I would say I would get at least 10 ups a day," Boid explained. "And then since April, it slowed down to maybe four, and today I've already gone through five."

Between the surge in business and the burgers HOM's manager was grilling for the staff as a Memorial Day treat, Boid was excited to have something more to do than read furniture tags around the store — her usual activity for slow days.

Across the street at Jimmy John's, the pair on duty expressed similar sentiments. Within the first half an hour of opening, the store had surpassed last Memorial Day's sandwich sales. The rush was so unexpected that the staff almost ran out of bread.



They chalked it up to a higher-than-average amount of large orders — orders of four sandwiches or more.

"Normally I've been, you know, pretty bored on Memorial Days, but time is flying past when you're going, 'Oh, it's a lot busier than I thought it was gonna be," said one representative.

Usually, they kill time by chatting — about cars, a shared interest of theirs — or about their lives. The pair has been working together for about five years.

"It seems like this year... it's busier downtown than it was last year," the other representative explained. "It's weird. I feel like this construction actually is bringing more people here, but then everybody thinks that it's losing business. But every time we get asked, you know, 'Is it affecting you guys?' it's like, no, it's actually affecting us better, because all the construction people come in every other day. It's very nice."

As the interview came to a close, a group of teenagers entered the store: more customers. It seemed that construction wasn't enough to keep pedestrians away, after all.

Across the board, everyone was excited to see construction end, not only because of the impact on current business, but because they're excited to see the results of the revamped area around the mall.

"We can't wait for all of that to open up to see how business actually will be in the summertime," said the first representative.

As for Boid? She can't wait to be able to order food from across the street again.

"The access to, like, Jimmy John's and everything downtown has been essentially cut off. I love Jimmy John's, and I've tried to order from there," she said. "They're like, 'Listen, we can't cross the street. Like, do you really want us to get in our car and deliver it to you?'" Boid sighed. "No, it's fine.' So sad. It's been a pain."

Once the road opens up again, however, she anticipates that the store will see a lot more traffic.

"Not to say that it's bad, but it is slow right now..." Boid said. "Like, I know one of our bedroom sets is all hickory wood. I know where the wood comes from. I don't have to know that much."




