

Points of Interest Florence County

Geocaching

Geocaching is a free, outdoor

treasure hunting game using GPS-enabled devices. Participants navigate to a specific set of GPS coordinates and then attempt to find the geocache (container) hidden at that location. Sign the logbook and return the geocache to its original location. Sign up for free on Geocaching.com or search for their app to locate caches in the Florence County area.

Fishing

Florence County is a fisherman's haven with its 101 named lakes and 988 miles of rivers and streams. Pan fish can be found in almost all lakes within the county. Lakes that contain walleye: Patten Lake, Keyes Lake, and the Spread Eagle Chain of Lakes. Muskies are caught in the Brule and Menominee River Flowages. Brook trout are best in Sand Lake located within the Spread Eagle Barrens.

If river fishing appeals to you, then the Brule, Pine and Popple Rivers and especially their cold water tributaries are great places to catch trout. All three of these rivers have many access points and are bordered by large amounts of public land. These rivers are remote and challenging, but true wilderness experiences. The Menominee River and its flowages (Twin Falls

and Kingsford) contains musky, northern pike, walleye and pan fish. Shore fishing is an option at the Fisher Lake ADA fishing pier at the south end of Chapin Street in Florence. Lake Emily Park has a long boat ramp at the water edge, great for casting a line on a warm summer day, or Keyes Lake Park also offers a pier for shore fishing. The abandoned Twin Falls Bridge at the Vagabond Park is an excellent option as well.

ATV/UTV Trails & Amenities

Florence County is home to over 160 miles of ATV trails and routes with hundreds more connecting neighboring counties and the State of Michigan. The northern part of the Nicolet State Trail runs through the western portion of the county. This particular trail also runs through Forest and Oconto Counties. The Florence County ATV trail system winds through the open Spread Eagle Barrens State Natural Area and county, industrial and national forests. Riders will encounter trails leading to 3 waterfalls (Breakwater, LaSalle & Washburn), several scenic overlooks, county parks and 3 ATV/UTV friendly campgrounds: Lake Emily, West Bass Lake and Morgan Lake campgrounds. Florence County also has a 17 acre ATV park which is located on the south side of Fisher Lake in the Town of Florence.

Begin WI Wild River Tour at Visitor Center

This new 100 mile loop features 15 access points to enjoy the Pine and Popple Wild Rivers in Florence County, Wisconsin. Whether you are a paddler, fisherman, hiker, sight seer, bird watcher, photographer or geocacher, you'll find new places to explore on our State designated Wild Rivers. There are places to camp, historic sites to see and friendly people to meet. Start your tour from our Visitor Center on the corner of Hwy 70/US 2. You can pick up a brochure, explore the interpretive displays or browse the Wild Rivers Gift Shop.

Breakwater Falls

Three tiers of cascading falls with rapids create this spectacular falls just below the Pine River Flowage Dam. Caution signs hang over the river here. Unique rock formations show the power of the river and the beauty of nature. Other than LaSalle Falls, Breakwater Falls is the most impressive falls in Florence County. This is not recommended for children or people with difficulty walking as climbing up and down rocks gain the best views.

Points of Interest Marinette County

Marinette County ATV/UTV Trails

Marinette County has over 200 miles of ATV/UTV trails for you to explore. The majority of this trail system is open year round except during inclement trail conditions during the spring break-up (typically around April). Marinette County road routes open May 1st.

All UTVs are allowed to ride on ATV designated trails in Marinette County. An Important Reminder: ATV/UTV riders on the Iron Snowshoe ATV trails, in the Butler Rock area of Marinette County, which connect to Oconto County's summer-only ATV trail system at the county lines, need to be aware that Oconto County's ATV trails won't open until May 1st and close on October 31st each year.

Bird Watch at Bloch Oxbow (No. 234)

Bloch Oxbow lies on a level sandy upland a few feet above the floodplain of the Peshtigo River, 2 miles upstream of its confluence with Green Bay. It protects one of the best remaining examples of northern dry-mesic forest - a type that was formerly widespread in northeastern Wisconsin, but is now reduced to small, often degraded remnants. Canopy dominants are

red oak and red maple with super canopy white pine to 36 inches d.b.h. Characteristic shrubs include hazelnut, witch hazel, huckleberry, blueberry and witherod, an uncommon shrub species. Prevalent herbaceous plants are bracken fern, interrupted fern, Canada mayflower, wild sarsaparilla, and large-leaved aster. Bordering the Peshtigo River is a floodplain forest at the extreme northeastern edge of its range in Wisconsin. Dominants include silver maple with green ash, elm, basswood, butternut hickory, cottonwood, and black willow. Shrubs, emergent aquatic, and wet meadow vegetation, including sedges, rushes, and bluejoint grass, dominate the adjacent wetlands. The natural area is critical habitat for several sensitive bird species. A great blue heron rookery and a large colony of bank swallows are also found here. Bloch Oxbow is owned by the DNR and was designated a State Natural Area in 1990.

Geocaching in Marinette Co.

Whether you are a vetted expert or looking for something new to try, geocaching is a great way to get outdoors and put your detective skills to work. Known as "the world's largest treasure hunt," geocaching allows anyone to join the hunt for hidden objects. All you need is a GPS or the

Hundreds of caches are hidden throughout Marinette County communities. Take a day to find a few or try to find as many as you can! Here's a hint: search for geocaches in Marinette County at our waterfalls, boat launches, campgrounds, historical locations, and parks.

Peshtigo River

Marinette County's Peshtigo River provides recreation and leisure for all types and abilities of water enthusiasts. The upper portion of the river flows through Nicolet National Forest and has some of the most difficult whitewater in the mid-west. Water adventurists must possess a high degree of skill to be able to handle the long and difficult rapids found in the waters above Caldron Falls Reservoirs. The central river reservoirs provide great lake paddling for all abilities.

14 Famous Marinette County Waterfalls

Our world famous waterfalls offers short and long hikes in serene and natural settings. Our self-guided Waterfalls Tour provides a fun, familyfriendly way to get back to nature. Consider taking along a picnic basket and take a leisurely lunch alongside your favorite falls!

Note: Many waterfalls are located within the Marinette County Parks system. A \$5 day pass (per vehicle) is required for entrance into county parks. Day passes are available for purchase at most park entrances/parking lots or can be purchased online in advance here. This pass is good for all Marinette County parks for the remainder of the day. Annual passes can also be purchased for \$25 at any Marinette County Library or online here. Discounted annual passes are available for veterans and seniors with in-person purchases.

Middle Inlet Horse Trails and Camp

Points of Interest Forest County

Camp 5 Museum/Lumberjack Steam Train

Take the whole family on a trip back in time with a ride on a vintage steam train. Head for Laona and climb aboard the famed Lumberjack Steam Train for a journey into the late 1800's. Sit in a rare cupola caboose as the vintage steam engine takes you to an actual site of a Northwoods logging camp.

Crandon International Off-Road Raceway

400 acres of hospitality deep in the Northwoods. Grass, forest and a huge granite pit surround the most revered dirt track in the world. There is simply no other place like it on earth.

Friday of the Labor Day holiday in Crandon signals the start of the annual World Championships and AMSOIL Cup spectacle. World champions are crowned as part of the biggest short course off-road race in the world. More than 50,000 fans gather to cheer for their favorite drivers as they race on the longest and the fastest short-course track anywhere – with speeds exceeding 100 miles per hour.

Visitors can also check out the newly developed off-road recreation park or the 300 miles of ATV/UTV trails that are accessible from the Crandon Raceway. Kids, both young and old, will love the state-of-the-art Traxxas Radio Control race track. With a campground, fishing pond, a golf driving range and a trap shoot range this is a getaway dream for those who love the outdoors.

ATV/UTV Trail Information

ATVing is a growing sport in Forest County. Currently, they have 2 state trails. Some townships have some of their town roads open as ATV routes. A town road is only an ATV route if marked with a green and white route sign. Please contact Town Clerks for questions on ATV routes. It is YOUR responsibility as a rider to know the laws, both State and County. Please be sure to read the Forest County Ordinance for Snowmobiles and ATVs and visit the WDNR website.

The Nicolet State Trail, Wolf River State Trail, and Valley Trail are open from the beginning of May until the close of snowmobile trails.

FOREST County

Utility Terrain Vehicles (UTVs) are legal to ride on ATV trails and routes in Forest county. Both ATVs and UTVs have to display a license plate with the registration numbers as required by the Wisconsin DNR.

Wabeno Logging Museum

Wabeno boasts a Logging Museum built in 1941 by the Wabeno Lions Club, which contains memorabilia and records preserved in a replica of an old logging camp to present a nostalgic picture of the most colorful era in Forest County history. The building is a genuine notched log structure built in the same fashion as logging camps that dotted Forest County. The museum is open May through September and staffed with volunteers to answer questions and suggest other local attractions.

Mecikalski Stovewood Building

The Mecikalski Stovewood Building, built at the turn-of-the-century by
Prussian immigrant John Mecikalski, is a unique historical structure
of real architectural significance. This National Historical Site is
the only known commercial example utilizing the stove-

wood building method in the United States. Many turn of the century exhibits associated with the building's history, such as a General Store, Saloon, Farmers co-op, Cheese Factory and Blacksmith Shop are displayed. Its permitted purpose was to provide a flowage which can be regulated to obtain the most favorable conditions for wildlife, both terrestrial and aquatic. The impoundment has a surface area of approximately 490 acres and a maximum depth of 6 feet. Inlet streams from Mud Lake and Bog Brook Lake are present, with the outflow to the Lily River.

Bog Brook Flowage And Wildlife Area is located off of County HWY DD and near HWY 52 in Wabeno, WI. This site is excellent for canoes and kayaks, as well as hiking. The recreation site also has ADA accessible walkway and a wheelchair accessible fishing pier.

Langlade County

Peters Marsh State Wildlife Area

This 1,700-acre tract contains small ponds, marshland, grasslands and upland hardwood forest. It is an interesting mix of habitats that are attractive to many mammals and birds. This is an excellent place to find American Woodcock in the early spring. Sandhill Cranes nest here and congregate in the fall. Hawks and a variety of owls can be found here, including the Northern Saw-whet Owl.

Augustyn Springs ATV/UTV Trail

Augustyn Springs ATV Trail is a 21-mile trail through a large block of northern hardwoods. The terrain is rolling to very hilly. The trail has some rock, and during wet periods, the trail has some water holes. Trailhead on Hwy A - Ainsworth, WI 54409

Springbrook Trail

Completed in 2010, the Springbrook Trail with accompanying 1,800 foot boardwalk is a site to behold. The trail winds through 4 park areas and a wilderness area - all within city limits. A walk on the wood chipped loop in the northern natural area almost guarantees seeing deer and other wildlife. The trail is just over 2 miles if you chose to walk all the sections. Bikes, rollerblades and walkers are all welcome. Remember to be a courteous trail user- keep pets on a leash and pick-up pet waste.

Veteran's Memorial Park/ Jack Lake Campground

Jack Lake is a pristine, crystal clear, spring-fed lake surrounded by hundreds of acres of the county-owned forest, rich with recreational opportunities and wildlife. The park and campground are situated on the lake's west and south shore, nestled among mature maple, birch, oak and pine trees, providing a relaxing and peaceful setting. www.jacklakecampground.com

Wolf River - Rafting & Kayaking

The stretch of the Wolf River running through the eastern part of Langlade County is considered one of the best whitewater rivers in the Midwest! Rafting conditions depend on the water level and time of year.

Crocker Hills Horse and Dog Sled Trail System

The Crocker Hills Horse and Dog Sled Trail System is located on Langlade County property and private property east of Antigo off Fraley Road in Elton. It is approximately 15.3 miles in length and offers a variety of trails and scenic beauty. The horse trail is located between Norway Lake and Evergreen Creek. In the northwestern portion of the trail steep hills and valleys afford the rider beautiful vistas of the northern hardwood complex. The trail facilities include a parking/primitive camping area and a pit toilet bathroom at the trailhead west of Fraley road. There is also water that can be obtained by a hand-pump. An open-air shelter is also located at the trailhead and has several tables on site.

Beyer Home Museum and Annex

917 Park Avenue, Oconto

Built in 1868 by Cyrus Hart, a prominent businessman in Oconto, the Beyer Home was the first house to be built with brick in Oconto County. The Beyer family purchased the home in the 1880's and had it remodeled in the popular Queen Anne style, including the rare red stained glass that was used in the front door. In 1940, the Beyer Home was acquired by the Oconto Historical Society and renovated into a museum. The main house was refurbished with period antiques and the carriage barn houses antique and electric cars. The museum annex, built in 1957, features exhibits about the logging era, the Indian Copper Culture, and a re-creation of 1890's Main Street Oconto. Special membership programs and educational programs are offered through the Beyer Home in conjunction with the Historical Society.

Copper Culture State Park

Mill Street, Oconto

Copper Culture State Park is a preservation of the ancient cultures that once lived in the Oconto area. Scientists believe this park to be a 2,000 year old Native American Burial Ground. The artifacts of this area were found in the 1950's by a curious young boy digging in the dirt, accidentally discovering the remains of a human bone. Later excavations of the area showed it to be a Late Archaic cemetery. The remains of 45 human skeletons have been unearthed; many of the bodies had with them

ceremonial offerings of copper, stone, bone or shell. A variety of copper artifacts including axeheads, spear points, harpoons, knives, fishhooks and jewelry were also found at the site. This burial ground contained the oldest discovery in of forged copper tools North America. The park covers 42 acres of land that features picnic areas and a park museum with details of the Copper Culture and the archaeological studies of the area.

Nicolet National Forest

Northern Oconto County Lakewood Ranger Station

The Nicolet National Forest was named after the French explorer, Jean Nicolet, who is credited with discovering Wisconsin in 1634. Nicolet National Park covers more than 650,000 acres of land in the northern part of

Oconto County and includes 1,200 lakes, 400 spring fed ponds and 1,450 miles of trout streams. Hundreds of miles of hiking

and backpacking trails traverse the area. Best known to the Oconto area and located near the town of Lakewood are the legendary Cathedral Pines, a stand of white pines and hemlocks that escaped the lumberjacks of the early 1900's. The Cathedral Pines house a great blue heron rookery, with more than 100 nests. Admission to the park is free; however, there is a minimal charge for camping at established campgrounds.

Family Fun and Northwoods History

An area historic treasure, the Mecikalski Stovewood Museum opened for the season on May 24th. The museum and visitor center will be open on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays, through Labor Day, from 1:00 - 4:00 PM. The museum will also be open on July 4th. Additional tours may be arranged. Admission is free, although donations are welcome.

Built in 1899, this national historic site was constructed with an unusual method of folk architecture, using 18 inch lengths of cedar logs laid in a bed of wet lime mortar in a style often referred to as stovewood or cordwood construction. It is the largest building with a history of multiple commercial and personal uses that was built during this era.

Many turn-of-the-century exhibits associated with the building's history as a general store, saloon, farmers co-op, cheese factory, and blacksmith shop are displayed.

The Stovewood Museum is located in the small crossroads community of Jennings, Wisconsin. To get there, take Hwy 45 to Pelican Lake, then CTY B East about 5 miles to Jennings, or from Crandon, take Hwy 55 South to Cty B West to Jennings.



So, pick a warm summer night, grab a parking spot in one of the rows, settle in the front seat or wrap up in a blanket outdoors, crank up the sound system, and enjoy an outdoor movie experience Americans have loved for decades. Canoeing/Kayaking

The waterways in Shawano County provide a variety of experiences for all skill levels. If it's calmer water you seek, try the lower Wolf River. The Wolf River, below the Shawano Dam, is a guiet and peaceful river to canoe or kayak on. It's wide and never has logiams or large windfalls to block the paddlers progress. You will often see eagles, ducks and blue herons. It travels through farm land and lowlands (M to CCC) and the Navarino State Wildlife area (CCC to 156). Notes: In late summer it can be too shallow and some walking the boats may be required; no place to stop. You can cover the Shawano County portions of this river in one long trip or two shorter ones.

1) Put in on County M (Lieg Street) in the City of Shawano, about 6 blocks west of Main Street. Boat launch on left bank. Plenty of parking. No restrooms. It's usually about a 3 hour trip. A little less if water is high and fast. A little more if it isn't.

2) Take-out (or launch for lower river paddle) at CCC. Boat launch on left bank. Plenty of parking. No restrooms.

3) Take-out at County 156. About a 4 hour trip if starting from CCC. A kayak launch is available at Cecil Lakeview Park for accessing Shawano Lake.

Looking for something more challenging? According to paddling.com the Red River below Lower Red Lake is an excellent beginner to intermediate run with one of the drops pushing III+ to IV at higher flows. The Red is an old stand-by for locals when the other rivers are too low or too high. The power plant is always releasing at least a little water at a controlled rate that makes the Red somewhat predictable.


