Big lottery win in Wausau

A winning \$50 thousand Powerball ticket was sold at a Kwik Trip on 1415 West St. in Wausau. The ticket was for the Wednesday, May 28 drawing. The ticket matched four of five numbers (23-27-32-35-59), plus the Powerball (11).

May has been a lucky month for the Wausau Kwik Trip. In addition to selling the winning \$50 thousand Powerball ticket, the retailer sold a winning \$25 thousand scratch ticket at the beginning of the month.

Another winning ticket was sold in Kohler. A \$125 thousand Badger 5 jackpot ticket was sold at Gas and Go on 820 Commerce

Great Wisconsin Bat Count

Wisconsin's DNR is looking for volunteers to count bats emerging at sunset on one night between June 6 and 8.

Wisconsin's cave bats are just beginning to emerge back to their summer roosts. The first count of the year is known as a "prevolancy" count because it occurs before newborn bat pups begin flying.

The second count is set for after the pups start flying, on July 18-20. Both counts are known collectively as the Great Wisconsin Bat Count. They help the DNR track the bat population trends in the summer.

Volunteers will be asked to count emerging bats, provide information on the roost sites and weather conditions. To participate in the Great Wisconsin Bat Count visit https://wiatri.net/inventory/ bats/volunteer/roosts.

Marathon County beach monitoring

Marathon County has started a new beach monitoring program. The program involves sampling water at four parks with popular swimming areas. The parks included are Big Eau Pleine, Dells of Eau Claire, Mission Lake and Sunny Vale.

The water testing will monitor the beaches for bacteria, specifically E. coli. The goal of the program is to help families make an informed choice about using the beaches in the local area.

Sampling of the water will be done weekly until the Friday following Labor Day. Results of the sampling will typically be posted on Wednesdays. If the tests show higher than recommended bacteria levels, the Health Department will issue an

On their website, Marathon County said that they are monitoring beach water quality because "natural bodies of water can contain elevated bacterial levels due to rain, runoff or other environmental factors." Water with high levels of bacteria can increase the likelihood of causing illness.

Testing results and advisories will be posted on www.MarathonCounty.gov/ beaches.

A new restaurant has opened in downtown Wausau, and it is called Mumble Wrap. It opened on May 28 in Malarkey's, replacing Townie's Grill.

As of now, their hours are 10:57 a.m. - 1:59 a.m. from Wednesday through Sunday, closed Monday and Tuesday.

Grand to get creepy, kooky, mysterious, spooky

Other acts taking the stage this season include Whose Line is it Anyway? veterans Colin Mochrie and Brad Sherwood and the Peking Acrobats.


Hawthorn Hills says farewell

The Elementary Facility Plan Citizen Task Force, a task force made up of parents, staff and community members and facilitated by representatives of a school facility planning and projections firm, recommended the consolidation plan to the district, which



Keep flexibility in your retirement income plan

Planning for retirement can seem intimidating and is often filled with ambivalence. On the one hand, we fantasize about how great it would be to have a schedule filled just with our own personal activities, not having to report to work anymore. On the other hand, it's often scary to think about a life without the paycheck we've received and relied upon for our entire adult lives. Fewer and fewer people are retiring with a guaranteed pension, therefore needing to rely on their own personal retirement accounts and savings to pay bills and lead the lifestyle they want. Structuring income from your nest egg for the retirement chapter of your life can feel like a daunting task. I ask every new client two crucial questions: "What is the most important thing I can help you with?", and "What is your biggest fear?"

When facing retirement, the answers are consistently some variation of "I would like a comfortable retirement" and "I don't want to run out of money" due to a significant market loss or spending too much too soon. Some even say they'd like me to help them so that they spend their last dollar on their last day. Wouldn't that be great?

There are few absolutes that apply to everyone in retirement planning because every situation is different. One of those absolutes is to maintain a level of flexibility in your retirement accounts. Diversification is important not only in your investments but also in your sources of retirement income. You may choose an annuity for guaranteed income. While the guarantee may be great, the flexibility may be limiting. The contract likely includes




surrender charges for taking lump sums of money out (usually in excess of 10%) within the first several years, and the guarantee either changes or goes away if excess money is withdrawn. These rules are not necessarily bad as long as you fully understand and build your strategy around them. Pair that with one or more accounts in your strategy that have full liquidity so that money is accessible in lump sums for things like a new vehicle or a vacation. If you are analyzing investments that produce income, consider the flexibility to start and stop income when you want. Sometimes in retirement, people end up not spending all of the inflows that they are receiving. It's great to have the ability to stop the income, reinvesting into new shares and/or deferring to avoid withdrawals that result in income taxation. Consider the flexibility to completely sell out of your investment. How do you liquidate when you want to? Your "best" investment today may no longer be desirable in the future. Markets change. Interest rates change. Your needs will change.

Your sources of retirement income should be diversified, complimentary to each other and have a degree of flexibility.

You'll know in your stage of planning when you reach this point because the outlook for the future is less daunting and is often replaced with a sigh of relief. 🗪



Little-known sport endures at Memorial Park

This weekend, practitioners of a rather unorthodox sport will gather from across the Midwest in Memorial Park.

The sport is bike polo, a modern twist on the sport typically associated with the European uppercrust in which players wield wooden mallets from atop horses.

"A lot of people would refer to [bike polo] lovingly as like hockey, because the style is more similar to hockey than European polo," said Tyler Wildman, who has been an active part of Wausau's bike polo scene since it got its start around 2010.

"We started down at Marathon Park and we just used the tennis courts originally," explained Wildman.

With help from the Marathon County Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department, the club used old hockey rink materials to set up a makeshift bike polo court at Riverside Park.

"They've always been super kind and understanding and wanting us to play," said Wildman. "We're really lucky that they've always been really nice about giving us a space to play in."

It's a level of community support that Wildman

said is somewhat unique to Wausau. In many cities, he said, bike polo clubs must make do with pre-existing infrastructure — parking lots, tennis courts and the like until someone kicks them out and they need to find somewhere new to play.

With time, the bike polo court in Riverside Park degraded, and the club reached out to the parks department again — as well as a few city alderpersons — for assistance with finding a new locale.

Now, the club practices at Memorial Park, where the city has provided them with a walled court. Wildman hopes that the increased foot traffic that comes with a busier park allows more people to learn about the sport's existence even in passing, and eventually to check it out for themselves.

"We are always friendly to newcomers and visitors, and we play on Thursday nights and Sunday afternoons," he

come out and watch... we're happy to let you use our stuff. We're just happy for you to come out."

Recently, longtime club members have begun bringing their families along to matches.

"[Adult members] are almost outnumbered by the number of children that join us now," said Wildman. He said that it's been nice to see parents pass on their passion to their kids.

"We want inclusion to be at the center of what we do as a group," Wildman said. It not only creates an inviting environment, but bringing in all sorts of people is in the spirit of bike polo as a whole.

"It's become such a home [across the country] for such a wide variety of people who felt like they didn't fit in places," Wildman explained. "We have tournaments that are specifically LGBT+ tournaments or women's-only tournaments."

This weekend's tournament is open to all genders, sexes,

ages and skill levels. It will also be casual, to ensure that everyone feels safe and welcome and has a fun time. People who have fun times, he said, are more likely to stick around and play again in the future.

And if someone can't make it to the tournament, they're always welcome to show up for a regular meeting.

"It's very laid back," he explained. "We're also very welcoming to newcomers if anyone ever wants to try it out. We have gear, loaner bikes. We just ask that you bring a helmet."






