Manawa - The legend of the Manawa Rodeo began 66 years ago, when local business man Carl Dretzke was traveling in the western part of Wisconsin and saw a sign advertising a Bob Barnes Rodeo. Carl thought it might be a good fundraiser for the community, and brought the idea to the Manawa Lions Club. The Lions Club formed a rodeo committee and contacted Bob Barnes, a rodeo stock contractor, who in turn invited them to his ranch in lowa to watch a rodeo. Casey Klemm, the local barber, and Carl made the trip to lowa representing the Manawa Lions. They liked what they saw, and agreed that Manawa should host a Championship Rodeo. The town of Manawa was known as Rodeo City. Six weeks prior to the event, Lions Club members were required to wear western hats, and faced a fine of 50 cents and endured the ridicule of their fellow Lions if they broke the rule. Local business people got into the act by dressing

with a western flair and running rodeo specials along with ticket giveaways at their establishments. The little cowpokes looked forward to seeing horses in the parade and maybe a chance at some free candy. Every child in the rodeo audience dreamed that this might be the year they'd win the free pony given away at each performance. Over the past 65 years the Mid-Western Rodeo has meant over 1 million dollars in revenue to local businesses in Manawa. The Manawa Lions have donated over \$950,000 to schools, the rescue squad, parks, high school scholarship fund, and other civic organizations. 15,000 people attend the rodeo each year to watch not 27 but the 350 entrants competing for not \$2,000 but a \$42,500 purse plus entry fees.

The Mid-Western Rodeo was selected the Great Lakes Circuit Medium Rodeo of the year in 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2019, 2021, 2022, and 2023.

Considered the largest category, the medium rodeo includes twenty one rodeos in nine states (Wisconsin, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Minnesota, Ohio, Iowa, Kentucky, and Missouri). This award is given to show the contestants' appreciation for the efforts of the people or organizations that put forth the extra effort to improve their sport, promote growth, increase their fan base, and keep the rodeo growing as a sport. "Awards given at year end are kind of a big deal to us, because the contestants are the ones doing the voting, and if they like it we must be doing something right," stated Peter Ziebell Mid-Western Rodeo Chairman. 2025 marks the 66th year that Rodeo City will proudly pull together over the 4th of July weekend, as in the past, to bring Rodeo fans from all over the U.S. a family show that they won't forget. And that is truly what legends are made of.

# the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association



Legend has it that rodeo was born on July 4, 1869, when two groups of cowboys from neighboring ranches met in Deer Trail, Colo., to settle an argument over who was the best at performing everyday ranching tasks. That competition is considered to be the first rodeo which evolved into rodeo as we know it today.

Today's professional rodeo cowboy is a bit different from his 1800's predecessor, but the ideals, showmanship and hard work are still valued by today's competitors. A cowboy's standing in the rodeo community is still dependent on his skill with a rope or his ability to ride a bucking animal. The cowboy code still dictates that a cowboy ought to help his fellow competitors, even though they might be competing for the same paycheck.

While some things have changed since the last century, most of the changes have been for the better.

Now the cowboy travels much of the time in custom made rigs or flies from one rodeo to another either by commercial airline or charter plane.

Even if a PRCA member doesn't' have the inclination to spend more than 200 days a year on the road in search of a berth in the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo - the sport's championship - he can participate in one of many rodeos close to home each year. Over 600 are held throughout the



country year-round, from small town venues to arenas in Las Vegas.

The PRCA staff consists of about 70 full time employees, but grows to

nearly 100 during the peak rodeo season. The PRCA headquarters, established in 1979 in Colorado Springs also houses the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame and Museum of the American Cowboy.

# Past, Present & Future of WPRA

The Women's Professional Rodeo Association was formed in 1948 when 38 cowgirls came together in San Angelo, Texas, to create an organization dedicated to the promotion and advancement of women in the sport of rodeo. The earliest pioneers of the Girl's Rodeo Association (GRA) were ropers, bronc riders and barrel racers. They were fed up with a system, which did not grant them competitive opportunities in the arena and when it did, operated under unfair conditions.

The GRA began with 74 original members with 60 approved contests and total payout of \$29,000. In 1981, the GRA changed its name to



the Women's Professional Rodeo Association. It is the oldest women's sports association in the country and the only one governed entirely by women. Today, the fast paced event of barrel racing dominates the activities of most WPRA members. WPRA barrel racers compete for millions of dollars each year, culminating in 12 circuit finals rodeos held throughout the country, the Dodge National Circuit Finals Rodeo held in Pocatello, Idaho, in April and the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo held in Las Vegas each December.

In addition to the traditional events, the WPRA has formed new programs to promote growth in the industry.




Rodeo Announcer Roger Pro Mooney returns for his 29th year at the 67th annual Mid-Western Rodeo.



# Howdy from the Rodeo Office

Last year we looked to make the news by breaking rodeo attendance records.

Thursday night's performance sold out, Friday and Saturday's evening performances were filling fast. Little did we know we'd make the news in another way on Friday, July 5th, 2024

Rain began falling during Thursday night's bull riding competition, continued through the evening and into Friday's slack competition, which started at 9am. Rodeo is held rain or shine and Manawa's arena footing is well known among contestants to be safe when wet. 51 barrel racers, 18 steer wrestlers, 18 team ropers, and 25 tie down ropers finished the competition in the deluge of rain. The National Weather Service estimated about 5.7" of rain fell between 8:30am and 11:30am in the city, following about 6" of rain in the preceding two weeks.

At the rodeo grounds, water flooded the camping area, the shelter house floor was under water as were the vendor areas. Contestants and contract acts staying on the grounds were notified that morning to be ready if an evacuation was necessary.

Meanwhile the city of Manawa was flooding. Basements were taking on water, the street sewers could not keep up with the overwhelming amount of rain and backed up quickly. The Mill Pond took on all upstream waters, as well as drainage from street sewers, and swelled up to its highest point. Water eventually spilled over the earthen embankments at the north side of the dam, near the library. Lindsay Park and the sewage plant was flooded and a temporary drinking water ban was put in place. A Code Red Flood Warning was made at approximately

10:30 am. Residents could evacuate to the high school or Masonic Center for temporary shelter. About 12:30pm, the embankments eventually gave way and the Mill Pond unloaded 180 acres of water past the dam and under the bridge.

The call came around noon to evacuate the rodeo grounds. Rodeo Chairman Peter Ziebell stated, "The contestants and contract personal were absolutely fantastic clearing the rodeo grounds in under 2 hours, loading horses, hooking up trailers, getting a few out of the mud, it went unbelievably smooth. Thankfully no injuries to people or animals were reported at the rodeo grounds. We sustained minor damage at the rodeo grounds itself. Our first priority following the safety of everyone on the rodeo grounds, is the city of Manawa, where most committee members and volunteers live. I can't begin to thank everyone involved when it came time to evacuate the rodeo grounds, the EMS personal kept us informed and were very easy to work with. Thank you to everyone involved, you all made a lousy situation bearable."

Due to total evacuation of the rodeo grounds, the final three rodeo performances were canceled as was Saturday's parade. Manawa made the local, county, state, and national news with this weather tragedy.

We look back to Rodeo 2024, thankful that no injuries were sustained during the unprecedented flood. The Manawa Lions and the City of Manawa now look forward to being in the news once again, proudly hosting the 67th Mid-Western Rodeo on July 3rd, 4th & 5th.






For the takedown, one horn is pushed low, the other lifted, nose tilted high. At about the time their horses reach the tail of the hard-running steer, the hazer (a mounted helper) keeps the steer moving straight while the steer wrestler, from the opposite side, begins transferring his weight from his horse to the steer. His horse runs on past, carrying the cowboy up to the horns and taking his feet out in front of the steer, in position for the cowboy to slow the steer, turn him, and take him to the ground.

### TIE-DOWN ROPING

After the catch, watch the cowbov's speed on the ground. Success depends upon the roper and horse working together, and some would say the highly trained horse is the more important member of the team. The horse must quickly catch up to the calf, position the cowboy to rope it, then maintain tension on the rope as the cowboy dismounts, throws the calf and ties any three of its legs (usually two hind and one front). The tie must remain seconds after the roper remounts and permits the horse to slacken the rope.



# S BREAKAWAY

Don't blink or you may just miss the run, talking about the cowgirl's breakaway event. Breakaway roping is the event comparable to the men's tie-down roping on the cowboy side except the cowgirls are not required to dismount and tie the calf. In breakaway roping, the cowgirl has a flag tied close to the end of her rope and a nylon string tied from the rope to the saddle horn. When the rope grows tight after the calf is roped, the string breaks away from the saddle horn and the flag goes flying, signaling the timer to stop the clock. The time in the breakaway roping can sometimes get as fast as 2.0 second run. The women must concentrate on the perfect get out and roping the calf clean around the neck.



# BAREBACK RIDING

Watch the front-end spurring motion. Seemingly frantic, it's deceptive. A good bareback rider is generally in better control of the ride than his wide-open style might indicate. But in this flamboyant event, it's wild that wins. The trick is to time the spurring motion with the horse's bucking action. When the horse leaves the ground, the cowboy jerks his knees and his spurs come up to the shoulders. His feet fly up, out and away from the horse. For the cowboy to stay in control, his feet must be back to the shoulders and against the neck when the horse's front feet come back to the

#### BARREL RACING

Watch the rider "spec" the next barrel even while rounding the one at hand. Fast, exciting and intensely competitive, women's barrel racing provides colorful contrast to the rugged action characterized by most rodeo contests. Yet as much, if not more, as in other events, horse and rider cooperation is vital to success. The three barrels are "run" in a cloverleaf pattern requiring quick turns at high speed to win. Times are so fast and close they're measured in hundredths of a second. For each tipped barrel a 5 second penalty is added.





**BULL RIDING** 

Watch for body control and balance. Spurring is not required. Bull riders tend to be smaller, wiry men who look smaller still against the 1,500-2,000 pound animals. They ride with just a flat-braided "loose" rope pulled tight (Not tied-around the animal and held fast by the riding hand.) Although the cowboy isn't required to spur, you will see many of them moving their feet, scrambling to keep contact with the bull, whose power is too great to permit just one lasting hold.



# EAM ROPING

Watch the heeler's loop. Properly executed, a true art form. While the experts make team roping look easy, with five entities involved, nothing is simple. The first roper, the header, rides after the steer and ropes the horns or head, takes a dally (wraps the rope) around his saddle horn and turns his horse away, leading the steer. A second roper, the heeler, rides in, ropes the hind legs and takes his daily. In an instant, the horses face the steer, the ropes come snug, and a judge signals time. If but one hind leg is caught, a 5-second penalty is added.




Watch for a sweeping, front-and -back spurring motion, bronc rein held high. Ideally, the cowboy falls into a stylish rhythm with the horse, feet thrust full forward, toes turned out in the stirrups, as the bronc's front feet touch the ground. Then as the horse jumps high, the rider crooks his knees, drawing his feet back, toes still turned out, along the sides until his spurs strike the back of the saddle. The feet go forward again as the bronc descends. Cowboy beware, however, for stylish though it may be, the horse is strong and moving fast and at whim could violently disrupt the rhythm.

#### **PARKING:**

#### Where do I park and how much is parking?

The rodeo arena address is E5888 County Rd. B Manawa, WI 54949. Follow the signs and parking attendants will show you where to park. Parking is \$5.

#### Is there handicapped parking available?

Handicapped parking is available. Please notify the parking attendants on your way in and they will direct you.

#### SEATING:

#### What type of seating is there?

Our seating is outdoor bleacher seating with no cover.

#### How are the seats set up?

There are 15 rows of bleacher seats in each section. Each row is one step.

#### Seat size?

Each seat is 18 " wide which is the standard for bleacher seats. If you would like more room you may purchase the seat next to yours as a child's ticket to give your group extra space to spread out.

#### What rodeo events will I see at each rodeo performance?

All events are held at each performance with different cowboys and cowgirls riding. Events include: Bareback Riding, Tie-Down Roping, Team Roping, Saddle Bronc Riding, Steer Wrestling, Women's Breakaway Roping, Barrel Racing, Bull Riding.

No. Different contestants compete each performance. The winning ride could occur at any one of the performances. Don't miss any of the action, purchase a season pass for all four performances! (Season pass can only be purchased through the rodeo office)

No, the food, vendor and music area is open to the public.
