Lincoln County A&L **Committee approves** sale of Pine Crest **Nursing Home**

Now the recommendation goes to full Lincoln County **Board, County to hold Town** Hall information meetings

The Lincoln County Administrative & Legislative (A&L) Committee has approved forwarding an Asset Purchase Agreement and Operations Transfer Agreement to the full Lincoln County Board. If approved, the Agreement would facilitate the sale of Pine Crest Nursing Home to a subsidiary of The Ensign Group, Inc. The Lincoln County Board will consider the

The Wisconsin River Pro Rodeo (WRPR) wrapped up this past weekend following three days of competitive rodeo action that showcased bronc riding, barrel racing, calf tie-down roping and breakaway roping, team roping, steer wrestling, and the ultimate rodeo quest-to stay astride a bull for that infamous eight-second

ride in the bull riding event.

The Lincoln County Association brought the annual Wisconsin River Pro Rodeo to the Merrill Fairgrounds June 6-8, 2025, drawing in contestants from throughout Wisconsin and many other U.S. states, as well as Merrill residents and rodeo-lovers from beyond Lincoln County to get a taste of this traditional celebration of western cowboy and cowgirl action. Though the skills

required to manage cattle and horses and the idea of rodeo itself-including rodeo "fashion," like cowboy boots and hats and leather chaps-didn't originate in the United States as we know it today, rodeo competitions and displays of horsemanship as we know them now have become iconic American traditions.



Agreement for full approval at its upcoming June 17. 2025, meeting. If approved, sale/ownership transfer would be effective Aug. 1, 2025.

Details of Asset Purchase Agreement

The Asset Purchase Agreement proposes a purchase price of \$9.5 million for the real buildings/ estate and improvements and fixtures for both Pine Crest Nursing Home at 2100 E. 6th St. and the Health & Human Services (HHS) Building located at 607 N. Sales St. in "as is" condition, with a down payment of \$500,000 due within days of signing. This is \$1 million more than the amount of the previous contract with another prospective buyer in 2024, and this Asset Purchase Agreement has no buyer financing included. The trade-off, for better or worse, is that this purchaser is a larger corporation with 300+ nursing homes rather than the small familyowned company with less than 10 nursing homes, five of which were in Wis.. that had previously contracted to purchase the nursing home in 2024. That buyer also had training facilities within the state to train new nursing home staff which might have also been able to help fill staffing shortages. It is unclear whether the new purchaser has any such resources.

According to the Asset Purchase Agreement, this purchaser also agrees to enter into new sublease agreements with current tenants of the HHS Building as sublessors, not to exceed the terms of the current leases, which is similar to the terms of the agreement with the previous buyer.

A brief history

Pine Crest has served Lincoln County 1954 and has been countyoperated for more than 70 years. In 2019/2020, Lincoln County partnered with North Central Health Care to manage the facility due to ongoing financial challenges, first via an Interim Nursing Home Management Agreement, then will a full agreement effective Jan. 1, 2020.

Despite

management partnership, "Unfortunately, the County continues to be challenged financially," a June 16 press release from Lincoln County said. "Dedicated to serving our area seniors, Lincoln County Board of Supervisors began in 2023 assessing how to best meet the needs of our area seniors given the financial position of the County. Through that process, the Ad Hoc Committee was able to learn how senior care has continued to evolve over the past decade, specifically the continuum of services from in-home supports, assisted and independent living, and skilled nursing, as well as revenue streams."

Decision to sell/the sales process

"After carefully exploring various options, Lincoln County determined that the best option for the future of Pine Crest to continue operating as a skilled nursing facility in Merrill is to transition the ownership to another organization."

"Lincoln County Staff, specifically the Administrative and Legislative Committee who was designated to vet the sale of the sale, worked with an experienced broker to solicit high offers, as a broker could leverage their network, industry knowledge, and marketing

strategies that qualified buyers find drive up the sale price," the release said. "Equally important, if not more, was giving careful consideration to key factors that impact the transaction. such as quality of care, long standing history in nursing home operations, staff retention and testimony by other facilities staff which were previously purchased by this organization, vision and mission of the organization, and community engagement."

Town Hall meetings

To share more information about the proposed sale. Lincoln County scheduled two Town Hall meetings held Tuesday, June 10—one at Merrill City Hall at 3:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, and the other at Pine Crest Nursing Home at 6 p.m. for residents and families.

Information about attendance and what occurred at the two Town Hall meetings was not available, as both meetings were set to occur after this newspaper has already gone to print. However, the meetings were designed to be informational only, with just four items on the Agenda for each meeting: 1) A welcome and opening remarks to share the purpose of the meeting and key discussion points; 2) A presentation from representatives of Jack Pines Healthcare LLC, a subsidiary of The Ensign Group, Inc., the proposed purchaser of Pine Crest per the approved Agreement; 3) Lincoln County Board discussion;

and 4) Next steps/closing remarks. The published Agendas of the meetings noted the meetings were to be "informational only" and no action would be taken by the Lincoln County Board or any of its committees at the Town Hall meeting, nor would there be any opportunity for public comment. Time for public comments would be on the Agenda for the next regularly-scheduled County Board meeting.

A bit about the buyer

"The Ensign Group (ENSG) has provided $communities \quad with \quad$ compassionate, postacute care since 1999," the release said. "Each one of the 300+ businesses is run independently by its own management team and employees, which is consistent with a fielddriven, flat structure. This unique approach empowers local leaders and their teams to provide superior solutions to the specific medical needs of the communities they serve."

"The Ensign Group, Inc.'s independent operating subsidiaries provide a broad spectrum of skilled nursing and senior living services, physical, occupational and speech therapies and other rehabilitative and healthcare services 323 healthcare facilities

in Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska, Nevada, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Washington, and Wisconsin. Two locations are nearby in Clintonville, Greentree Health and Rehabilitation Center and The Pines Post-Acute and Memory Care, and the Third is Wood Aven Health and Rehabilitation Wausau, Wis."

"Lincoln County has valued the partnership with North Central Health Care and commends the North Central Health Care Team and Lincoln County Maintenance Team in continuing to provide a high standard of care," the press release said.

"North Central Health Care and Lincoln County Administration have already begun to assess remaining gaps and remedies to work towards a smooth and successful transition for employees and residents."





Ask a Pastor: Several local pastors plan interfaith panel for curious community members

Several area clergy members will gather Wednesday evening in a community event designed to answer questions about faith in a relaxed. environment—ideal no-pressure for anyone who is curious about Christianity but hesitant to visit a church.

The "Ask a Pastor" interfaith panel will take place June 18 from 6 to 8 p.m. at the AGRA Pavilion. Pastors from the local United Methodist. United Church of Christ, Episcopal, and Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA) churches will participate, alongside Sister Celine from the Roman Catholic Holy Cross Sisters.

"This is an idea that the members of Ascension Episcopal Church came up with in an effort to unite followers of Jesus, no matter what church they attend, as well as to spread the love of Jesus to those who may not have a church they call home," said Amy Heimerl, priest at Merrill's Ascension Episcopal Church.

Many people are curious about "church" and they have questions, but they aren't yet sure about "going to" church or which church they'd even like to try out, organizers said.

This event will feature an "Ask It" basket where attendees can anonymously submit questions for

a relaxed, comfortable environment. Organizers do emphasize that each pastor or panel member will speak from their own individual perspective "on their own" and their answers are not representative their entire denomination, but simply one view within their respective denomination. "The goal is to give people an opportunity to talk to followers of Jesus Christ without the pressure of having to walk into a church building," the event flyer says. For new Christians, prospective Christians, or just the genuinely curious, this event is also an opportunity to learn about several different area churches in one place.

"The goal is to be able to offer perspectives of [some] local pastors to interested people without the pressure of having to attend a church service," Heimerl said. "We believe that many people are curious about what following Jesus really means, and we want to offer what it means to us."

The initiative grew from the Merrill Ministerium Group, a group which meets regularly and includes pastors from a number of local churches and denominations. Ascension Episcopal received a grant from the Episcopal Diocese of Wisconsin to support this event,

Each participating church plans

the pastors to answer, to learn more in to host an open house and/or newcomer service at a later date to help interested community members understand what elements of their respective worship services involve and mean. Such events are so "those interested in exploring a church can get a feel for what a worship service is like," Heimerl said.

> The Ask a Pastor event builds on other ongoing interfaith community efforts, including "The Vibe," a monthly open mic event held the first Friday of each month from 6-8 p.m. at rotating locations during spring, winter, and fall.

> "People come and share their talents, whether singing, playing an instrument, reciting poetry that they (or others) wrote, telling jokes, even dog tricks are welcome," Heimerl said. "It's simply an alternative, multi generational gathering on a Friday night that doesn't cost anyone anything to attend, and people can be assured that they will be welcomed and heard."

> The open mic has been running for almost two years, drawing 20-40 people each month. Like the upcoming panel, its aim is to build community without requiring church attendance.

> Similarly, the June 18 event is free and family-friendly. Snacks and beverages will be provided, and all community members are welcome to attend.

Beyond Books Community Artshare: Spirit Dolls and Thailand Tribal Handiwork

The Beyond Books Community ArtShare exhibit entitled Spirit Dolls and Thailand Tribal Handiwork is currently available for viewing and will be on display through the end of June 2025. Located on the second floor of the T. B. Scott Free Library in Merrill, the collection includes unique and colorful pieces owned by Lincoln County residents, Peter and Dian Ritter.

Spirit Dolls

The idea of spirit dolls evolved from a childhood reading of folklore based on the Slavic witch named Baba Yaga

Baba's magic hut had chicken legs and could relocate at will in the tale. Dian has always found cultural myths fascinating and enjoys occasional humor in art, she said.

In the fall of 2023, Dian was pulling out old geraniums with crazy roots, shook off the soil, and thought what fun hair that would make for an art doll. The idea blossomed. Dian had always enjoyed collecting and saving interesting materials of all kinds, she said, and she found it satisfying to


recycle and repurpose remnants of fabric, fibers, old jewelry, metal bits, and items found in the natural world. The spirit dolls she created, which are included in this display, have some of their hair made from garden roots, while other dolls have hair made from unraveled yarns, twines, and carpet fibers. She constructed their hands and feet from twigs and dead branches she collected in their yard.

Thailand Tribal Handiwork

Peter and Dian were teaching at the International School of Bangkok in Bangkok, Thailand, from 1990-1996. While there, they purchased a pickup truck and customized it for camping they said, using it to travel extensively throughout the entire country of Thailand. Northern Thailand particularly held their interest, with its beautiful scenery and colorful and industrious people who were always welcoming.

On their many trips upcountry Peter and Dian met several unique Hill Tribes. Along the way, they collected numerous examples of the tribes' handiworks and personal adornments they proudly display on their clothing. The collection at the library includes samples of the traditional clothing they collected from these Hill Tribes in Thailand.



Merrill Varsity Boys Baseball season ends in **Regional Semi**final loss to Medford

"Medford jumped out to an early 3-0 lead after the top of the first," said Merrill Boys Head Coach Shawn Schultz. "Not the ideal way to start the game, but we got things started on offense with Kory Page leading off the bottom of the inning with a line drive to center and later had runners on second and third, but came up empty.'

The Bluejays had several opportunities to get back into the game but couldn't capitalize on key moments. After Page's leadoff hit in the first, Merrill stranded runners in scoring position.

"EJ came back and blanked Medford for the next three innings, giving us a chance to get back into the game, and we had opportunities but just couldn't cash them in, leaving the bases loaded in the second," Schultz said.

EJ Weix started on the mound for Merrill and pitched into the fifth inning, allowing 5 runs on 9 hits with 3 strikeouts. Carter Kaminski came in to pitch 2.1 innings in relief.

Medford added 2 more runs in the fifth inning, but again Merrill couldn't come through with a comeback response.

"Medford scored 2 in the fifth but again we loaded the bases in the bottom of the inning with a great chance to get back in the game but just didn't come up with the

key hit," Schultz said. The Raiders tacked on 2 runs in the seventh before Merrill finally broke through with their lone run of the game.

"Medford added a couple of runs in the top of the seventh and again we got some runners on base and scored a run to get going but couldn't add on after that," Schultz said.

Page led offensive effort, going 2-for-4 with 1 run scored. Weix added a double and drove in the team's only RBI. Cooper Wendorf also had a hit for the Bluejays.

"There is never a good way to end the season with a loss," Schultz said. "We simply picked a bad day to have a bad game. The boys worked so hard all year and did a great job of battling every time we took the field. Even in this game, they fought through the seventh, continuing to try to mount

Despite the disappointing end, Schultz praised his team's effort throughout the season.

"It's tough to see it right away, but they all have a lot to be proud of on the season," he said.
