
There will be complimentary hot dogs and beverages served at the Post Home immediately following the parade, and all are welcome.

Hummingbirds are here! Spring is upon us and that means the return of the hummingbirds: one of nature's jewels! The Ruby Throated Hummingbird generally spends the winter in Central America. Mexico and Florida. They migrate to Canada and other parts of Eastern North America for the summer to breed.

Hummingbirds can fly up to 60 miles an hour, but typically about 30-45 mph. Did you know they are the only birds that can fly backwards and upside down? They lay the smallest bird egg in the world in a golf ball size nest, usually producing two broods a year.

Hummingbirds eat about every 10 minutes. They drink nectar from plants and sugar





# Andrew's Lawn Ranger

Turf Care: We are currently applying our second round of crabgrass control. This is crucial for pre/post emergent suppression. This round includes broadleaf weed control, micronutrients as well as a balanced slow-release fertilizer.

Flea, Tick and Mosquito Suppression: Warmer temperatures are coming, bringing out all our springtime pests. We have begun our applications to suppress flea, ticks, and mosquitos, which is made by fogging the perimeter of the property as well as spraying nesting areas. Plant material around the house (patio, deck, pool, swing set wood lines if applicable) will also be treated. Adult ticks are present now,

laying eggs, and active any day when temperatures are above freezing. Eggs hatch in the spring. Larvae are present during late summer and nymphs during late spring and throughout the summer. Ticks "hang out" on the ends of branches and tall grass leaves. Any animal or human brushing up against the plant runs the risk of picking up a tick hitchhiker.

Being "bugged" by mosquitos? Adult female mosquitoes lay eggs in anything holding water. Eggs survive drying out up to eight months. Mosquitoes only need a small amount of water to lay eggs. Any container storing water makes a great "nursery". Eggs hatch after water (from rain or a sprinkler) covers the eggs. Larvae can be seen in the water. They are very active and are often called "wigglers". They become pupae, which live in the water. An adult mosquito emerges from the pupae and flies away.




# Local healer Dan McMeans launches debut novel

"The first chapter, "The Coming of Age of Lawndale," is a firsthand account of my early years," McMeans shares. "We found a corner in Lawndale that







#### Understanding the social behaviors of dogs

Dogs are highly social animals with a wide range of behaviors that reflect their pack-oriented ancestry. Whether living with humans or among other dogs, their actions are deeply rooted in communication, hierarchy, and cooperation.

Beginning as puppies, many will engage in ritualized behaviors such as sniffing, play bowing, or tail wagging. These signals help establish intent whether playful, submissive, or assertive—and allow dogs to navigate social situations peacefully.

Play is a central part of social development in dogs. This helps them to learn boundaries and appropriate social cues. It often involves chasing, wrestling, and mock-biting, with dogs taking turns in dominant and submissive roles, reinforcing bonds and learning impulse control.

One of the most recognizable social behaviors in dogs is their ability to form strong bonds. Dogs seek companionship not only with their human caretakers, but also with other dogs. They use body language, vocalizations, and scent to communicate affection, stress, playfulness, or submission.
