The Pennsbury School District marked a major milestone this May with its 70th Annual Pennsbury District Art Show at the PHS East Gymnasium in Fairless Hills. Held from May 6 through May 8, the show celebrated seven decades of student artistry with thousands of artworks from kindergarten through 12th grade, dazzling installations and new interactive experiences that captivated students and families.

"This year's show is extra special." said Blair Greiner, Art Coordinator for Pennsbury School District and veteran art educator of 26 years. "We're celebrating our 70th anniversary, and it's been incredible to watch this event grow. What started as an 'art fair has evolved into a comprehensive showcase of both 2D and 3D works, including drawings, paintings, sculptures, mixed media, photography,

orful creations illuminating the walls and ceilings.

Meanwhile, students in grades 6 through 8 contributed to a stunning installation overhead with hand-drawn outlines of their hands and names arranged to form a giant "70" on the gym's ceiling.

Another highlight was the introduction of live art demonstrations, a new initiative led by members of the National

Art Honor Society. High school students painted, sculpted, and threw pottery on wheels in the center of the gym while attendees observed the creative process firsthand.

"These demonstrations have been incredibly engaging." Greiner shared. "Elementary school students were fascinated watching high schoolers throw clay on the pottery wheel or





They soar as small business owners. According to research, 80 percent of the 1.7 million veteran-owned business owners consider themselves successful. The small business five-year survival rate for veterans is double that of the non-veteran population.

Data from the U.S. Small **Business Administration has** shown that small business owners with an established mentor have twice the success rate - 70 percent versus 35 percent – as those who do not

have a mentor.

the growth I had from sports." Miller set the Neshaminy record for career goals (102) and assists (78) and was the Gatorade Pennsylvania Player of the Year in 2014. She was a member of Penn State's firstever NCAA championship team (2015).

"It was an experience of a lifetime," Miller said. "Everyone asks me if I liked high school or college better, but they were so different; it's hard to choose. But I loved both and I'm very happy to be here."

Donna Nicholson excelled in field hockey, basketball and softball at Pennsbury. She returned to her alma mater to coach girls basketball and track She was a PIAA field hockey official for 38 years and was named the Field Hockey Official of the Year in 1995.

"Being a graduate of Pennsbury and being able to come back to Pennsbury as a teacher meant the world to me," she said. "It was such an amazing opportunity to give back and to impart some of the values that I learned at Pennsbury to student-athletes at Pennsbury."

Paluszek set the Philadelphia Catholic League record in 1998 with a 218.6 average. After graduating from Wichita State, he joined the Professional Bowlers Association in 2005, winning five PBA titles.

"This is an ultimate gratification for many years of dedication," said Paluszek, who owns Bowlero and Joe's Pro Shop in Feasterville. "It's a testament to the people who supported me and gave me the confidence to go on for so long."

Poff was another three-sport athlete, competing in wrestling, soccer and cross country at Council Rock. He was the head coach at Lock Haven from 1990-2002 and is a member of

the National Wrestling Hall of

"It's a tremendous honor to be recognized by your local community," he said. "I have nothing but good memories about my experience in Bucks County and Council Rock. It's a special night for me."

Wunsch was the goaltender for Neshaminy's field hockey team, starting for three seasons and setting a program record for shutouts (35). She was allstate first team in field hockey and softball.

She played both sports at Princeton.

"They were all wonderful vears, both at Neshaminy and Princeton," she said. "I was so fortunate to have fantastic people around me; so many great coaches, so many great teammates."

Co-Chair Leah Cianfrani said mentors continually expand their knowledge base to better assist veterans on their entrepreneurial journey.

"Military transitioning from active duty have different needs than civilians in terms of starting a business," said Cianfrani. "It's wonderful to have veterans' resources at our volunteers' fingertips to aid in mentoring our service men and women."

Veterans account for about 10 percent of SCORE's client base. Veterans own 10 percent

of small businesses and 14 percent of franchises. Since franchisors have a defined plan of what the business should entail, veterans represent the perfect franchisee given their ability to effectively execute plans as intended.

Nationally, veterans own nearly 2 million businesses, employing more than 5 million Americans, and generating more than \$1 trillion in annual income. Of those, 40 percent of veteran-owned businesses generate more than \$500,000 in annual revenue.

Bucks will partner with Drexel University, District 1199C, Bucks County Workforce and Economic Development Board, regional hospitals, and local medical practices to create a career-aligned registered pre-apprenticeship program.

Bucks will provide free training and job placement services for two inaugural cohorts, graduating 24 pre-apprentices over the next year and a half. Graduates of the 12-week pre-apprenticeship program will receive recognized certifications in EKG tech, certified phlebotomy

technician, CPR for healthcare providers, mental health first aid for fire/EMS, and child abuse recognition and reporting training, as well as a college certificate of completion and a pre-apprenticeship certificate.

"We have received overwhelming support from the healthcare industry for this pre-apprenticeship program," said Bucks President & CEO Patrick M. Jones. "Given the success of our pre-apprenticeships in other sectors, we are thrilled to be able to offer the education and training necessary for area residents to launch their allied health careers with jobs that are in high demand and pay family-sustaining wages."

The PA Department of Labor and Industry grant will afford Bucks' Center for Workforce Development the opportunity to venture further into the healthcare sector and build upon the success Bucks has had in building pre-apprenticeships in manufacturing and the building trades. The state funding will enable the college to have a greater reach in the Southeastern Pennsylvania region resulting in providing increased enrollment and pathways to high-paying jobs and apprenticeships that are in high demand.

The free 12-week career training programs will likely begin in early 2026 and be held Monday-Friday, 8:30 am-3 pm in the college's Center for Advanced Technologies (CAT) on the Epstein Campus at Lower Bucks in Bristol. The CAT is a brand-new. state-of-theart facility offering job seekers access to high-quality career training programs. Students will also have the opportunity to work with Drexel University, District 1199C, regional hospitals, employers, and apprenticeship programs in the industry.



The Bucks County Opportunity Council (BCOC) hosted the 2025 Economic Self-Sufficiency (ES) Graduation on April 30 at The Warrington Country Club. This year's celebration honored 18 graduates, bringing the program's total to 1131 people in 420 households.

Bucks County Commissioner Bob Harvie kicked off the evening by welcoming all the guests and commending the **BCOC ES Program for many** years of contributing to the improvement of the lives of Bucks County residents, BCOC's CEO Erin Lukoss then presented the annual Champion of Self-Sufficiency award to Congressman Brian Fitzpatrick. The award honors a business, partner, or community member for their role in the success of the ES program. Kyle Melander, Congressman Brian Fitzpatrick's representative, accepted the Self-Sufficiency Champion award on behalf of the congressman and shared a video of Fitzpatrick congratulating the graduates on their accomplishments. He spoke about the importance of the ES program and its impact within Bucks County, which was why they were driven to help BCOC receive congressionally directed funding.

The ES Program is a highly successful program that provides one-on-one coaching and resources to those living in poverty who commit to working toward economic self-sufficiency. The graduates have worked, mostly for several years, on an intense, structured plan to become financially self-sufficient.

Nearly every graduate reflected on the program as a life-changing experience. Each

of their coaches provided help and support, and gratitude was a consistent theme throughout the event. The coaches and the program break the stigma often associated with asking for help. One graduate shared that through a difficult life, full of more downs than ups, her mantra was always "everything is temporary." She got through, one moment at a time, convinced that things could be better. Being a part of the ES program, she was able to break the cycle of generational poverty that she had experienced. Her words, "I know my kids will have a better life" had an incredibly emotional impact on the over 200 guests.

The 2025 class began the program with an average starting income of \$19,687. In the 31 months' time it took for the group to graduate, they increased their income to an average of \$65,948, that is an increase of \$46,261. The key to success has been acquiring the additional education and training necessary to earn a living wage. All 18 graduates have improved their position within their company or gained new employment since beginning the program.

In her closing remarks. Lukoss said, "At BCOC, we know that economic mobility starts with stability. You can't dream about the future when you're worried about getting through the week. That's why our programs are designed to meet people where they are, with the resources they need to move forward. What does economic mobility really mean here? It means having the choice to live where you want to live. It means freedom to leave a job that isn't working for you to pursue something better. And it means dignity, the kind that comes from knowing you can care for yourself and your family without fear. That's the heart of what we're working toward every day."

Graduation is based on ten benchmarks recognized nationally as standards of self-sufficiency: Full employment; free of all subsidies (food stamps, cash assistance, housing subsidies); balanced household budget; resides in safe, affordable housing: reliable transportation; health insurance coverage for all family members; checking and savings account; acceptable credit rating or approved Credit Repair Plan;

completed education/training program (if needed); and basic employment skills such as interviewing and resume preparation.

BCOC is the leading economic mobility non-profit organization in Bucks County, Pennsylvania, dedicated to ending poverty by connecting people with the resources they need to thrive.

BCOC has five major program

areas: Housing, Food, Weatherization, Volunteer Income Tax Preparation (VITA) and the Economic Self-Sufficiency (ES) Program. Housing includes street outreach, rental and move in aid, and utility shutoff prevention. Food services supply food directly to families through a network of 75 food pantries and distribution sites. Weatherization services help families in reducing their energy costs. VITA provides free income tax preparation assistance. The ES Program assists individuals and families to leave poverty permanently through case management, education, and employment.

Pennsbury Manor adopts new rescue horse: Norway

Norway, a former racing horse, joins Pennsbury from a Colorado "kill pen"

Pennsbury Manor, William Penn's reconstructed estate on the Delaware River in Bucks County, welcomes Norway, a recently rescued racing horse, to its educational barnyard.

Norway Hanover, is a retired Trotter for the Standardbred harness racing industry, who raced across the US and Canada. These horses often end up in cramped and unhealthy "kill pens" until they can be auctioned for slaughter. Norway was rescued by the Standardbred Retirement Foundation from a kill pen in Colorado.

Norway has now found a forever home at Pennsbury Manor. After a period of rehabilitation to improve his physical condition, he joined Pennsbury in late March. At 16 years old, Norway is a handsome horse who brings a calm and gentle demeanor, making him an ideal addition to the historic site's educational programs centered around historical animal husbandry, which represent farm life during William Penn's time on the property. Many local children will have the chance to interact with Norway during his life at Pennsbury.

"Norway joins Pennsbury's existing herd, which includes Arnie the horse, the oxen team sheep, and geese," said Carole Cunliffe, Animal Curator at Pennsbury Manor. "Under the care of our dedicated team. he is already getting along famously with all his barnyard companions, including the barn cat. Norway will play a crucial role in teaching visiting students and families about the types of animals that historically would have been at Penns-

bury Manor during the 17th century—a perfect representative of the estate's historical authenticity."

Pennsbury recently said farewell to TC, a beloved 31-year-old mare, who recently passed away.

Considered a senior horse, Norway's care comes with costs, including hoof care, targeted nutrition, and regular

veterinary check-ups. Pennsbury is currently seeking financial support for Norway's care to ensure that he enjoys a long healthy life on the estate.

Greiner emphasized that the show isn't just about showcasing talent; it's also about empowering students. "This is a confidence booster. Every student whose work is on display walks away with pride. They feel seen and validated for their creative or innovative strengths, which sometimes don't get highlighted

in other areas."

Each evening, families from across the district flocked to the show, filling the gym with excitement and pride. Parents snapped photos, pointed to their child's artwork, and created lasting memories together.
