Therapy dogs brings comfort and confidence to young readers at **Feasterville Library**

On Saturday, May 10, Debbie Ballman from Trevose brought her therapy dog, Lia, a gentle black lab mix, to the Township Library of Lower Southampton in Feasterville for their weekly Barks and Books program.

Held every Saturday from 11 to 11:30 am, Barks and Books invites children five and older to read aloud to certified therapy dogs from Angels on a Leash in the library's children's area: no registration required. The program helps young readers build confidence and feel more at ease with dogs.

Debbie, a longtime participant, shared the journey that led her and Lia to this work. "She's my dog, and after I rescued her, I thought she would make a great therapy

dog due to her friendly temperament. So.I took her to all the training classes required to get her certified as a therapy dog at Canine Academy. Then we joined Angels on a Leash, a local organization consisting of volunteer members/dogs. We bring our therapy dogs to librar ies, as well as nursing homes, hospitals, schools, and virtually anyplace where our dogs can bring comfort to others."

For Debbie, the benefits of bringing Lia to the library go far beyond literacy. "Bringing her here increases the children's comfort level of being around dogs," she explained. "Often children are timid or scared of dogs." Although the reading program is recommended for children who are at least five, children of any age are

welcome to stop by to pet Lia or just say "hi" to her. Sometimes Debbie reads to the younger children while Lia sits next to them wagging her tail in happiness.

Debbie adds, "For kids old enough to read to Lia, this experience helps them with their reading skills. They are more apt to read out loud to a dog because dogs are non-judgmental, and they love unconditionally."

Whether it's a bustling session of 20 kids or a smaller group. Lia's presence brings joy and calm to everyone she meets. And thanks to volunteers like Debbie and Lia, the library continues to be a welcoming place where literacy and love for animals come together.

Following last year's drought, we still have a rain deficit. We had a cold and dry winter. Plants already drought-stressed were damaged further by extreme cold, coupled with temperature fluctuations in March and April. While lawns may look lush right now, they are still lacking adequate soil moisture.

Flea, Tick and Mosquito Suppression: It's flea and tick season, and mosquitos will be around in large numbers this year. Let us help you enjoy your time outdoors with monthly visits to treat your property for these pests. Applications are made by fogging the perimeter of the property and spraying nesting areas, using organic control with peppermint and rosemary oils. Plant material around the house (patio, deck, pool, swing set wood lines if applicable) will also be treated.

Turf Care: We are finishing our second round of crabgrass preventer and weed control. It's not too late to get you on our program! Mowing height is the most frequent question we receive. The shorter the turf. the more stress on the plant. Height should be in the 3.75" to 4.25" range. Change the mowing direction so you don't create a 'pattern' in your lawn. Sharp mower blades will prevent your turf from getting a fuzzy brown look.

Plant Health Care: Are your plants protected from insects? Our technicians are applying foliar insect, mite, and fungicide sprays now. This is crucial due to current plant stress as well as rising temperatures coming in the next few weeks. Continued watering of trees and shrubs would be advised

until soil moisture levels improve.

Deer Control: Give deer a reason to go elsewhere. Our monthly treatments make your plants taste and smell bad to hungry deer. Protect your trees and shrubs yearround.

"Being a graduate of Pennsbury and being able to come back to Pennsbury as a teacher meant the world to me." she said. "It was such an amazing opportunity to give back and to impart some of the values that I learned at Pennsbury to student-athletes at Pennsbury."

Paluszek set the Philadelphia Catholic League record in 1998 with a 218.6 average. After graduating from Wichita State, he joined the Professional Bowlers Association in 2005, winning five PBA titles.



the kneading behavior is completely normal, and one that you should allow your feline friend to express.

Kittens knead their mother when nursing to stimulate milk production. Feline experts theorize that adult cats knead to re-create the feel-good hormone release that occurs during nursing. Kneading brings them comfort and helps them release tension and relax.
