HOLDING TOWNSHIP
SPRING Clean-Up Day, May 17

Start planning ahead for the Township Clean-Up Day for residents living outside the Holdingford city limits on Saturday, May 17. Township Board members will be on hand at the Hall from 7:00 AM to 11:00 AM.

The Township will give each household a \$25 credit to reduce the cost to residents. For example, if a township resident brings in 5 car tires, you will dispose of them for free. The following items will be accepted at this event (per-item-cost to the resident is listed):

- “White Goods” – washers, driers, microwaves, furnaces, refrigerators, freezers, water heaters, dishwashers, ranges, humidifiers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners – \$10 each
- Electronics – televisions, computer monitors, computers – \$25 each
- Tires – car tires/pickup/implement tires: \$5 each; semi-truck tires: \$15 each; tractor tires: \$20 each (Tire size is at the discretion of the Township officers. If rims are left on the tire, the price is doubled.)

Albany Public Works to conduct seasonal
HYDRANT FLUSHING
Monday May 12th through Friday May 16th

Beginning Monday May 12th through Friday, May 16th, the Albany Public Works Department will be performing routine flushing of the City Water System and Fire Hydrants.

This is part of a regularly scheduled maintenance program that removes rust, manganese deposits and sediment from the City’s water lines.

When hydrant flushing is being performed in your neighborhood you may experience rusty water and discoloration along with pressure fluctuation.

Below are some precautions you may take:

- When you notice flushing is occurring in your neighborhood, please check your water coming from your faucet before using your washing machine. You may need to run it for a bit until it runs clear.
- If by accident you do wash a load and rusty looking streaks appear on your laundry, don’t use bleach as this will set the stains permanently. A product called “Iron Out” has been shown to be successful in removing iron stains from fabric.

NOTICE OF IMPROVEMENT HEARING

Notice is hereby given that the Town Boards of Albany Township and Oak Township will conduct a joint public hearing at the Albany City Hall located at 400 Railroad Avenue, Albany, Minnesota 56307 at 7:30 p.m. on May 19, 2025, to consider the reconstruction and bituminous paving of 253rd Avenue from Stearns County Highway No. 174 south to 334th Street and also the reconstruction and bituminous paving of 334th Street from 253rd Avenue west to Sandhill Circle within Albany Township pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Sections 429.011 to 429.111. The area proposed to be special assessed for such improvement consists of all properties abutting the following roads:

- 253rd Avenue from Stearns County Highway No. 174 south to its terminus;
- That portion of 334th Street west of 253rd Avenue to its terminus at the west leg of Sandhill Circle;
- Sandhill Circle;
- Lakeside Trail; and
- Those properties identified by Stearns County Property Identification Numbers 01.00293.0000, 01.00368.0014 and

01.00368.0006.

The estimated cost of the improvement is \$397,126.00. A reasonable estimate of the impact of the special assessment will be available at the hearing. Such persons as desire to be heard with reference to the proposed improvement will be heard at this meeting.

You are encouraged to attend to learn more about the project, its benefits, and the assessment process. Representatives from the Albany and Oak Township Boards, and Engineer Jeremy Mathison will be available to answer your questions.
