



Ground Attack

Cougar Football preparing for changes in 2018

The Colleton County Cougars have battled the rainy weather in the first days of the 2018 season. The weather has not dampened the excitement surrounding the upcoming season for returning Head Coach Coby Peeler.

The Cougars will look to improve upon their 4-7 overall finish last season and their early elimination from the AAAA Playoffs, where they fell 59-36 to North Myrtle Beach.

This year, Colleton County will compete in the four-team Region VII-AAAA against Hilton Head, Bluffton and Beaufort. In non-region competition, the Cougars will hit the road for games against White Knoll, Carolina Forest, and Camden County. They will host Lakewood, Orangeburg Wilkinson, May River and Hardeeville-Ridgeland.

"I think we've scheduled some quality opponents who are going to give us different looks on offense and defense, which is good in that it helps prepare you for the playoffs," said Peeler. "As the season goes on and you figure out what you can and can't do, it helps you play to the team's strengths. I think our schedule will allow us to see quality teams that are well coached with good athletes. It will be a challenge for us — and that is what we want."

The Cougars hosted Stratford High School Friday Aug. 3 in a preseason scrimmage. "I was very pleased by the effort from our team," said Peeler. "They played with a lot of aggression and fire. Obviously, it is early and there are tons of things we can improve on, but from an effort standpoint, I think we are going in the right direction.

"I thought Lane West played hard up front," said Peeler. "Shykem Chisolm ran hard. Defensively, Jaden Smith had a couple of big hits and I thought James Daniels was solid on the defensive line. A lot of others contributed as well, but those guys really stood out."

"Stratford is a quality team and wellcoached," said Peeler. "So, it is a great challenge for our kids and I think they responded well."

A NEW LOOK ON OFFENSE

"The guys we have are very talented, but it is a different skill set," said Peeler.

"We lost Craig Grant and a lot of talented receivers to graduation. However, we still have a lot of skilled kids, but we don't have the depth we had in those areas last season. Our depth this season is going to be up front on both sides of the ball. So, we are going to try to accentuate what they do well. We are going to be a lot more run-oriented, but we'll still spread it out and throw it some. But, we won't be able to drop back and throw it 30 times."

QUARTERBACK

"The system we are running now, there are going to be a lot of guys who take snaps," said Peeler. "As of right now, Edwardian Stansel will be in that lead role. But the type of offense we plan to run allows us to put a lot of people back there, so that we can utilize all of them. This will really help Edwardian, because in terms of experience, he is still young, and this will take some of the pressure off him. We may see Trakell Murray, Ja'Carre Stevens and Shykem Chisolm contribute by taking some snaps."

"Warren Randolf did a great job in the off season and got much stronger," said Peeler. "Jaden Smith will take over at middle linebacker. He has some big shoes to fill, but he is very physical and incredibly strong with a great work ethic.

SECONDARY

"The secondary will be young, but there is a lot of talent in those kids." said Peeler.

BY THE NUMBERS

"The numbers aren't bad," said Peeler. "They are about what I expected after last season's large senior class. This year our senior class is small. Overall, we are about 20 less than last year with about 50 on varsity and 35 on JV, but we expect JV numbers to improve when school starts. We don't have any dead weight — just about everyone that is here can contribute."




competitive and developing our young men," said Hamilton. "The All-Stars will be ready to go at the League Jamboree in mid-August."



She will have a large learning curve this year, but I have all the confidence in her and believe she will give 100 percent. She will do a great job running our offense. Emilia Crosby will be expected to give us added offense on the right side this year."

DEFENSE:

"Amiyah Robinson will lead us on the back row," said Duncan. "Her experience and foot speed cover a lot of ground. Laura Lucas will also give us added defensive skills on the back row after leading our team from the service line last year. We expect her to exceed those numbers this year."

LEADERSHIP:

"Robinson and Lucas will lead from the back row, while Gant and Crosby handle the front line," said Duncan. "I expect all my seniors to lead by example on the court and in the classroom. We have a great group of seniors this year."

KEY FACTOR:

"We need to stay healthy as a team this year," said Duncan. "If we stay healthy, we will contend for the region championship."

War Hawks looking for redemption in 2018



War Hawk football has one word in mind for the 2018 season — redemption.

After a 4-7 overall finish in 2017, including a 49-20 loss to Pee Dee Academy in round one of the SCISA Class A playoffs, Colleton Prep is on a mission. On the first official day of fall practice held Thursday July 26, the War Hawks began working toward what fourth-year returning coach Rob Gorrell called "a season of redemption."

The War Hawks will once again compete in SCISA Region II-A; however, their opponents will differ slightly this season: Bethesda Academy, Dorchester Academy, Northside Christian, Spartanburg Christian and Thomas Heyward.

"We have a lot of new opponents in our region, which is new for us," said Gorrell. "We haven't played Northside Christian, Spartanburg Christian or Bethesda in football since I've been coaching here. Also, Northwoods Academy is new for us in non-region action.

"Put the ball down and we'll play whoever, wherever," said Gorrell. "It will take a little more preparation on our part as coaches this season because region is everything. We've just got to have that attitude that we are ready to play.

With just 20 varsity players currently on the roster, depth could become a critical

factor in the War Hawks' success this season. "It is the lowest number since I've been here," admitted Gorrell. "We're usually around 30. Obviously, the numbers do not look good, but I am excited. They are a great group, they get along well and they are a fun group to coach. We had an awesome spring and they worked hard this summer in the weight room. The coaching staff is as excited as they have been in a while. We are ready to get rolling.

"Everyone on our roster is going to play and get meaningful snaps — and they know they have to show up," said Gorrell. "We have a lot of competition at positions, which is something we haven't necessarily had in the past.

"At quarterback it has been a good little battle that started with three," said Gorrell. "David McMillan (junior), Jordan Crosby (junior) and Drew Murdaugh (freshman) were our initial three, but we've moved McMillan to fullback because we need him there. Crosby and Murdaugh are neckand-neck. Obviously, I feel comfortable with both and I have been pleased with their leadership — but now, I would like to see one step up. They are both impressive and it will likely come down to who is most consistent."

The War Hawk Offense

"We are actually going back to what I am

more accustomed to, which means tailoring our offense around the quarterback and, more specifically, the quarterback run game by putting us in the shotgun. So, that brings in quarterback power and quarterback counter. We are going to be wishbone triple option. Scheme-wise it doesn't change much for us — just the formation. It gets an extra blocker back there and a different guy running it as opposed to the quarterback. The schemes for the line will be virtually the same with a few changes here or there.

"Gabe Barnes (junior) will be the work horse at running back and free safety. He's a stud and we are looking for big things from him. If our guys are going to rest, they are going to have to do it on offense.

"Riley Smoak (junior) and Francis Blubaugh (junior) will also be playing running back.

"There are three fullbacks we like and that we are going to pound with – Connor McMillan (senior), Hunter Hudson (junior) and David McMillan (junior)."

The War Hawk Defense

"Same stuff and same people. Our defensive line is our strength on defense.

"Jason Dennis and Connor McMillan could play anywhere at any level. We get

Will Dandridge (junior) back this season after missing last season due to injury, and he will contribute big at defensive tackle. Hunter Hudson and Jacob Breland (sophomore) will contribute at linebacker. Dylan Kinard (senior) will contribute in the secondary and was a very good leader for us after missing last season due to injury."


Special Teams

Much like last season, the War Hawks continue to look for someone with a reliable leg to help their efforts on special teams. "We are going for two," said Gorrell. "If it isn't something that is a guarantee in my opinion, then you might as well go for it. If we can't line up and say we're coming this way and get three yards, then we don't deserve the two points.

"We have to figure something out for kicking," he said. "We have a decent little punter, but kickoffs we have to figure something out. We will not be kicking extra points unless it is an emergency."

CPA has a scrimmage lined up against Phillip Simmons at 6 p.m. (away) Thursday Aug. 9. They will host Branchville High School Friday Aug. 17 at 7:30 p.m. in Week 0 action.


