

Following a Processional of the Board of Directors, Faculty and Staff, the graduating seniors entered to the traditional Pomp and Circumstance. Head of School Jill Burttram welcomed the guests and was followed by the Invocation given by Rev. Gordon Ackerman.

Emily Wilson, Salutatorian, addressed the guests saying, "Good evening parents, friends, teachers, mentors, board of directors, faculty, and staff, and most importantly, the graduating class of 2022. Thank you for joining us for this exciting moment of our lives. The Commencement Address was given by Kevin Steele, defensive coordinator for the Miami Hurricanes and resident of Edisto Beach. Steele has 38 years of coaching experience, including 13 years in the SEC and 10 as a defensive coordinator. He was a semifinalist for the Broyles Award as defensive coordinator at Auburn in 2019 and a finalist for the award in 2017. During his five-season tenure as defensive coordinator at Auburn (2016-2020), Steele's units ranked in the top 20 nationally in scoring defense four times while producing 14 NFL Draft picks and multiple first-rounders.

Prior to 2016, Steele served as defensive coordinator and linebacker coach for LSU, going to Baton Rouge from Alabama, where he spent the 2014 season coaching the Crimson Tide linebackers and special assistant to the head coach. In 2013, he served as Alabama's director of player personnel. Steele was the defensive coordinator at Alabama in 2007 and at Clemson for three years (2009-11). While at Clemson, the Tigers won the 2011 ACC title and his defense led the ACC and ranked No. 13 nationally in points allowed, surrendering 18.8 points per game. He coached with Bobby Bowden at Florida State for four years (2003-06), serving as the executive head coach for the Seminoles. He served as the head coach at Baylor from 1999-2002 and coached linebackers for the Carolina Panthers in the NFL from 1995-98. From 1989-94, Steele coached at Nebraska where the Cornhuskers went 60-11, appeared in six bowl games, won four conference championships, and captured the 1994 national championship with a 13-0 record.

The Presentation of Diplomas was given by the CPA Board of Directors and was followed by the singing of the Colleton Preparatory Academy Alma Mater. The Benediction was given by Rev. Gordon Ackerman followed by the Class of 2022 Recessional to Trumpet Tune by Purcell.

During the ceremony, Bailee Stanley was awarded the Headmaster's Award for Excellence. The Debbie Powers Award was bestowed upon Taylor Tomedolskey, and the Joe Carroll Award was presented to Andrew Murdaugh.




















Band of Blue musicians are honored
