



The 2023-2024 season has a new head coach at Colleton County High School. Adam Kinloch returns to his alma mater as the Cougars Head Coach. Kinloch a 2007 Graduate of Colleton County High School has spent the past eight years on the Whale Branch High School staff and two years at May River High School in Beaufort County, he takes over a program in need of a rebuild. And Kinloch is relying a bit on past success to change the culture. Athletic Dirctor Wayne Alston Says, "We're really excited about his experience and what he brings to the table. His youth his energy as well as his knowledge about the game and culture here in Colleton County".

In High School Kinloch played under legendary coach, Leroy Riley, and Kinloch said, "I want to still honor that tradition and bring it bring it back and get our kids understand that we can win we will win, but we have to get to the basics, and we have to work together"


The Cougars are eager to wipe the slate clean which includes last year's one and nine season. The Cougars are embracing the chance for a fresh start.

Athletic Director Alston says, "I think the season is gonna be pretty good. I'm excited about the things have transpired so far in the offseason, from workouts to the community things that the team has done to just put their name out there and the camaraderie amongst the players and the coaching staff is very positive.

The Cougars had over 150 kids showing up to work out workout. Alston Says, "We're looking at a decent sized team. I think varsity, we're have about 50 Kids and JV we're looking at about the same.

We have a decent sized team. I mean, we're not in the 70 and 80 range as far as number of kids that are gonna be on the bench. And we still do have a lot of kids are coming out for the first time and playing foot-

ball but experience wise we've got a pretty good group of kids. That is always going to be an issue with certain key positions, but for the most part, everybody comes out. They're working hard. They're learning. We've got a new offensive coordinator, a new defensive coordinator. And these guys are coming to us. We got one guy coming from Rock Hill, we've got another coach coming us from the Columbia and Orangeburg area. So they're bringing a wealth of knowledge

and combining it with way Coach Kinloch is bringing us from where he was at Beaufort County. I think we're going to have a really good mix.

Alston added, "Were just excited. We want people to come out to understand that we're doing everything that we can to promote our program, change the culture around here and build something that everybody can be proud of".

LANGDALE LOOKS FOR A GOOD SEASON

Coach Greg Langdale of the Colleton Preparatory Academy Warhawk football program are looking for a good season this year with a veteran team returning. Langdale said, "We're going to be really, okay, at the skill positions. We returned most of our skill position players from last year. The big question mark on offense is going to be our offensive line, where we lost three, four-year starters on the offensive line and those are going to be really tough to replace. So we've got a lot of guys so far on offensive line are getting after it and doing a great job."

The Warhawks have a young team this year and experience is going to be a big factor. Landale Says, "If we can get that offensive line to come around. We'll be okay. That will be the most challenging right now. See how quickly that offensive line comes around?"

Cole Davis is returning as quarterback for his senior year. He was region player of the year last year. Langdale says, "Cole's gonna do what Cole does, he's gonna run for a lot of yards and he's gonna throw a lot of yards. So you know we're looking for another big year out of him". You're gonna have Cole's twin brother Caleb at running back. He's been doing a good job for in that position. Receivers this year offensively will be Junior Walker, and senior Will Brady. They're given us both a downfield threat and they're given us that line of scrimmage threat. They're doing a good job for us offensively.

Coach Langdale went on to say, "Last year was a big season you know, a big step forward. We came in my first year and we had 17 players and a lot of those were seniors. Well, when those seniors graduated, then we had two years where we were just playing a lot of freshmen, and a lot of sophomores., I think last year was the big step. Finally, now we're juniors and seniors. Now our skills are juniors, and our line are mostly seniors. We could finally take a step back and put in the offense as we wanted. So, I thought it was a big step that we finally got to where we were getting to the point where we're running the offense that we wanted to run and the defense's that we wanted to run. So, I thought it was a big step. And obviously, you know, well, what a good year and the playoffs, you know, come up one game short, but you know, it's, it was a big step for so hopefully we can take that next step this year".

Defensively, the Warhawks are returning a lot of starters. Nine

starters are returning from last year's team. They have experience, however the team lost most of its big players on defense that were seniors. We were really doing a lot of changing. We're get in and do a lot of rotation and so we turn about nine of those, unfortunately the ones we miss was our big guys. And with that in mind, we're a lot smaller on defense. We felt we needed to change to a three five and so we've swapped over two or three five this year and right now we look good and then we have blown assignments which is to be expected. I mean all these kids have been running a four three all their life got it and so now with different assignments, but we have switched to three five to try to utilize our speed on defense a little more this year.

When asked about depth, Landgale said, "Last year was a was a really good year in that we only had three or four guys playing both ways. This year going in is looking more like seven or eight. We are going to have to play both ways. The depth isn't quite there. Some younger guys have stepped up that's gonna give us a little bit more depth. And, and we're hoping that continues and hopefully by the time we get into mid-season we will have built that depth. At this

point we're thin in depth but hope to get there".

Bethesda and Beaufort are two region games that you've got to win to be on the road to the playoffs. Beaufort beat the Warhawks in regular season last year, and we beat them in the playoffs. Florence Christian is going to be tough. I mean, they played for the 3A state championship last year. And that's our first game right out of the gate, so they're gonna be tough. Branchville High School, you know, they're gonna be really solid this year because they didn't want to lose anything. And you know, those will be the two non-region that really, really jumped out at you.

This is Coach Langdales fifth year at Colleton Prep as both athletic director and football coach but grew up in Walterboro all my life. Once he graduated North Greenville University, he coached couple of different places before coaching at Andrew Jackson Academy. He was head coach there for seven years. He took a break to start a family and returned to coaching five years ago at Colleton Prep.





at the beginning of October. All the coaches are very experienced players, coaches or both. Soccer is a great team sport for all ages. For More Information: walterborosoccerclub.org.







Head Coach Dani Aquino says she has a great group of 11 girls from all over the country: four from South Carolina, three from Georgia, four from Florida and one returning from Arizona. The team is comprised of two returning players and the rest freshmen. Aquino says, "They are high-level players and we've got a great competitive season ahead of us. The biggest thing is that the way that I recruit is positivity, humble, and just that ability to recover from a mistake. We're a super supportive group. I really kind of recruit so that we have a family atmosphere and environment."

The Indians are preparing for a very competitive season. Competition includes USC Sumter, USC Union, USC Lancaster, Spartanburg Methodist College, Andrew College Rockingham, Wake Tech, Guilford Tech and Mark Tech.

In her first year as head coach at Salkehatchie, Aquino tripled the wins over the previous season and doubled all points earned against every single competitor over the previous season. This year the Indians want to knock at that door of the region tournament and get some wins under their belt.

Coach Aquino says she wants to spread awareness that Salkehatchie volleyball is here and that we have a great competitive program. "We really try to be a part of the community. Aquino says, "I just want people see that we're here, come out, bring your kids here, and just watch some exciting volleyball." USC Salkehatchie's next home game is Sept. 15 at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. at its campus at 807 Hampton Street. Salkehatchie does not charge admission until tournaments.
